# No Tax Hike AND a Surplus?

The Hardeman County Budget Committee presented the 2016-2017 budget to the Hardeman County Commission on May 31, proposing leaving the tax rate at \$2.55.

The budget could be voted into effect at the next meeting of the Hardeman County Board of Commissioners, scheduled for June 21, in the Hardeman County Courthouse Courtroom.

If passed, it would mark the only the second time in the past 33 years the budget was approved prior to the deadline mandated by state law of June 1.

Last year, the budget was approved June 18, leaving the rate

at \$2.55. The meeting, held in The Little Courthouse Museum in Bolivar, was filled to capacity and had more than 15 people wishing to get in standing on the lawn in front of the circa 1824 courthouse that is maintained by the Association for the Preservation of Tennessee Antiquities (APTA) in Hardeman County.

The public hearing portion of the meeting on June 21 will allow

citizens to comment on the budget.

Hardeman County Mayor Jimmy Sain says the county could have an estimated surplus of \$800,000 at years end.

"We have more money in our general fund than we have had in years," said Sain. "We hope to be at 2.1 million on July 1 of this year and get almost to 3 million next year."

The passage of the budget before July 1, which is required by state law, was completed on time for the first time in more than 33 years, according to Hardeman County Clerk Jerry Armstrong.

"The committee has been unbelievable. They had hard decisions to make and they made them to get us back to financially secure," added Sain.

The Hardeman County Budget Committee consists of Chairman Jerry Watkins, Mayor Sain, Commissioner Elmer Cobb, Commissioner Jim Daniel, Commissioner Jackie Sain and Junior Jimmer-son.

## Private Act Approved by County

The County Commission completed the process on Tuesday, May 31, for a Private Act in Hardeman County that will add landfill fees to property taxes collected from property owners.

The vote went 12-4 in favor, one more than the minimum needed for the two-thirds passage. Voting against were Vincen Morrow, Elvis White, Anthony Pulse, and Major Wilburn.

Mayor Sain hailed the move as a savings for all Hardeman County property owners.

"Without a doubt, after 12 months, we should be able to reduce fees," citing 98% percent collections on property taxes versus around 40% using the old method. "With more money coming in, we will lower rates for our citizens."

Also, Sain says there are about 4,000 parcels that have not been collected on since the county began collecting landfill fees in the early 90's.

"Without this, we would have raised it to \$14 or \$15," he added.

In January, the initial vote failed 10-5, but a re-vote was requested by Chandra Johnson, who said she didn't understand the motion. Her "yes" vote on the subsequent polling carried the motion to approval by a margin of 11-5. Voting against the measure in the January vote were Anthony Pulse, Jackie Sain, Elvis White and Major Wilburn.

After the vote in January, it went to the Tennessee Legislature, where sponsored by State Representative Johnny Shaw and State Senator Dolores Gresham, it passed on March 21. The act then came back to the commission for approval once again.

Previously, solid waste fees are collected by a quarterly billing to each residence. The act will go into effect for the 2016 tax year. Bills will be sent until October, after which, the fees will be collected through tax collections. Those wishing to pay quarterly can still do so at the Solid Waste Office, but bills will not be sent.

## Unemployment Drops for County

Hardeman County saw a drop in unemployment in April versus March as forty were added to work forces to lower the rate to 5.2%.

The March numbers had 530 unemployed out of a possible 9,390, while April had 490 unemployed of a possible 9,360.

The rate puts the county 69th in the state and ahead of neighboring counties Haywood (5.3%), and McNairy (5.7%) while trailing Chester (4.2%), Madison (4.0%), and Fayette (4.2%).

County unemployment rates for April 2016 in the state show the rates decreased in 90 counties, increased in two, and remained the same in three counties.

## Hardeman County Remembered by Lisa Coleman



Summer has arrived in Hardeman County, even though the calendar says the official day is still a few days away. I've seen signs of one thing that tells me it's summer — signs for Vacation Bible School at local churches can be seen all over the county.

I remember spending many fun days at VBS learning Bible Stories, making crafts, playing games with friends, and having what are surely the official VBS snacks — cookies and Kool-Aid. It is believed that VBS started around 1894 in Hopedale, Illinois. Mrs. D. T. Miles was a public school teacher and also a Sunday School teacher who started a Bible school to offer a program to children

during the summer months. Her first Bible school last for four weeks!

About four years later, Eliza Dawes, who was the children's department director at the Epiphany Baptist Church in New York City started what she called an "Everyday Bible School" for children living in the city's slum areas. Her Bible school went to the neighborhoods where the impoverished children lived, and her first VBS was held in a rented beer parlor which was not in use during the day.

Most modern-day VBS programs run from a few hours to an entire week, with programs that take a child's imagination to far-

away places as they learn the stories of the Bible.

This photo is one of the earliest known VBS programs held in the county, at the old First Baptist Church in Bolivar (the building is home to the Denton & Cary Law Offices today). The photo was made in either 1949, 1950, or 1951. The gentleman standing at the top of the steps in the front door is Rev. W. R. Woodell, the church's pastor at that time.

Look around and find a VBS program for children in your life. They will learn about the Bible, make fun memories with friends, and y'all, I hear the cookies and Kool-Aid are still just as good.

## Adoptable Animal of the Week by Sara Vonderheide

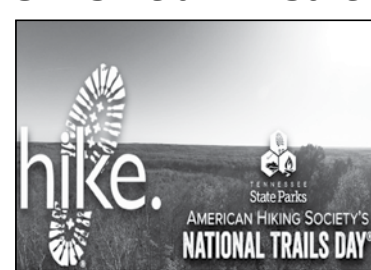

The lake is crowded with boats and jet skis. It's time to review the Valley's lake safety rules. First of all, state rules and regulations require the operator of all watercraft over 8.5 horsepower to be twelve years old or older. Those under age 18 are required to have successfully completed the TWRA Boating Safety Exam. Visit [state.tn.us/twra/](http://state.tn.us/twra/) boated on line to review these rules. When entering the lake, do so in a counter clockwise direction and drive accordingly. Non-motorized vessels including kayaks, canoes, and sailboats always have the right of way. Do not anchor to buoys. Observe no wake zones. No wake is defined as a vessel traveling at or below idle speed or at such speed that the boat or its wake (waves) is not sufficient to cause possible injury or damage to other persons, boats, or property. All coves are no wake zones.

When water skiing, be aware you may do so only during daylight hours. Skiers must wear a life jacket. Boats towing skiers must be equipped with a 170 degree wide-angle rear view mirror or have an individual, other than the operator, to observe the skier. The observer must be over twelve years of age.

Jet ski operators must be over twelve years of age and have successfully completed the TWRA Boating Safety Exam previously referred to. All persons on a jet ski must wear a life jacket. Jet skis may be operated on the main lake only and between sunrise and sunset. Jumping the wake or cutting in front of another vessel is prohibited within 100 feet of that vessel. Jet skiers must obey the no wake zones rule. Each jet ski must have a fully charged fire extinguisher on board. Remember these rules are for your safety as well as the safety of other individuals enjoying the lake.

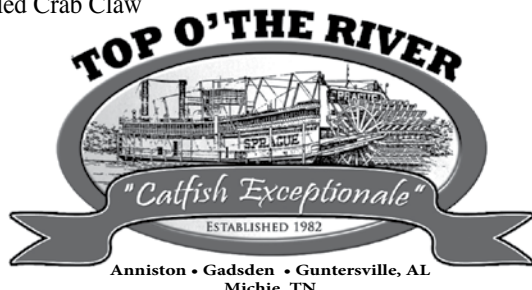

## Looking to Hire Summer Help? A Look at Child Labor Laws

Many students across Tennessee are down to the final day of the school year and they are preparing for the summer months ahead. Many of those teenagers will look for summer jobs.

Tennessee has child labor laws to guide both teen workers, and their employers.

"Young people are the future workforce of Tennessee and the experience they gain during the summer months will last them a lifetime," said Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development Commissioner Burns Phillips. "Tennessee's child labor laws ensure teens are safe and not exploited while on the job."

Students can start working for Tennessee employers, on a limited basis, at age 14. When school is not in session teens ages 14 and 15 can work eight hours per day, 40 hours per week, but they cannot

work after 9:00 p.m.

Those 14 and 15-year-olds are not permitted to work without supervision, to cook, including prep work, and they cannot operate machinery, other than office equipment.

Teens who are 16 and 17 can work until midnight when school is not in session, but must have written consent from a parent to stay on the job until that hour.

State law prohibits minors from working several types of jobs including; taking orders for or serving intoxicating beverages, or working at an establishment where more than 25 percent of the gross receipts come from the sale of those beverages, working in occupations that involve pornography, participating in door-to-door sales, and working jobs declared hazardous.

Teens are not permitted to operate motor vehicles as part of

their job, they cannot work with any type of explosives, and they are not allowed to operate heavy equipment.

Tennessee law does allow exemptions for some prohibited work for student learners and apprentices, under certain circumstances.

State law mandates break requirements for teenagers, and employers must maintain records of those breaks. Employers must also keep one form of proof of the minor's age in the employee's file.

Employers may be subject to an on-site child labor inspection if a minor is hurt on the job, if there is a complaint against the employer, or for a routine inspection.

If an inspector finds violations, the employer could receive a warning for an unintentional violation, or a penalty ranging from \$150 - \$1,000 per violation.

## The Problem of Identity Theft

Identity theft is a big problem. How big? Consider this: In 2015, about 13 million Americans were victimized, with a total fraud amount of \$15 billion, according to Javelin Strategy & Research. That's a lot of victims, and a lot of money. How can you protect yourself from becoming a statistic?

Here are a few suggestions:

Secure your Social Security number. Identity thieves eagerly seek Social Security numbers — so don't give out yours to anyone who asks for it. In fact, as a general rule, be reluctant to give it out at all. Always ask whomever you're dealing with if he or she will accept another form of identification, or at the very least will take just the last four digits of your number. And never carry your Social Security card with you.

Shred credit card offers and bank statements. If you're not going to apply for the credit cards offered to you, shred the offers. Identity thieves have been known to go through garbage, fill out credit card offers and take advantage of them. At the same time, shred your bank and brokerage statements — and any other statement containing personal or financial information.

Study your credit card bills and checking account statements. Question any credit card charge or checking account activity you don't recognize as your own.

Don't give out your credit card number unless you're initiating a purchase. Many of us shop online. As long as you're dealing with a reputable merchant who uses a secure site — i.e., one that has "https" in the web address — you should be fairly confident that your credit card information will be protected. Never give out your credit card number to people or businesses who, unsolicited, try to sell you something over the phone or Internet.

Protect your passwords. Do you use a password to log onto your computer? If so, don't share it with anyone, outside perhaps your most trusted family members. And use a strong password — one that doesn't contain your real name or even a complete word that could be used to identify you. Also, it doesn't hurt to periodically change your password, whether it's for your computer logon or for entry to any of your financial or consumer accounts.

Even after taking these steps, you could still run into identity theft. That's why you need to watch for certain signs, such as the arrival of unexpected credit cards or account statements, denials of credit for no clear reason, or calls or letters regarding purchases you didn't make. If any of these things happen to you, you may want to place a "fraud alert" on your credit reports and review them carefully. Three national credit-reporting companies — Equifax, Experian and TransUnion — keep records of your credit history. If someone has misused your personal or financial information, contact one of the companies and ask for an initial fraud alert on your credit report. A fraud alert is free, but you must provide proof of your identity. And the company you call must tell the other companies about your alert. (For more information on placing a fraud alert, visit the website of any of the three companies.)

You can help preserve your good name from those who want to misuse it — so, stay vigilant.

## Floods and Foundations

 Yesterday, flood waters ravaged a portion of Texas and remain over many low-lying landscapes in central and northeast Texas. The most tragic of the stories I've seen so far is that of a vacation home that was moved from its foundation. The house was caught up in the currents and swept into a bridge where it crashed and disintegrated. Twelve people in two families were swept away and are presumed dead. Although there is widespread damage to homes and a couple of people were killed by flash floods in vehicles, this tragedy stands out for a simple reason. Once the house was dislodged from its foundation, it was doomed.

We live in a world full of people who want safety but who have dislodged their spiritual foundation. People have left God for self, given up humility for self-fulfillment, and have exchanged discipleship for feel-good advice. We all tend to gloss over truly convicting scriptures. We would prefer following Jesus in those areas that might be hard for someone else, but don't interfere with our plans. The trouble comes when you place your own judgment, desires, guidelines and wishes on equal footing with the direction given in God's word.

I have several friends, once

strong in the faith, who have decided the Bible was written for people centuries ago and, though it has important principles, it doesn't apply to us today. The people claim God speaks in various ways to people, and that nobody has a corner on the truth. They even find verses to back up their beliefs, though they have already pulled the carpet from under scriptural authority. Once you deem one section of the Bible inaccurate or irrelevant, you bring it all into question. We who hold dear the truths of God as powerful and central to faith cry out with King David, "The foundations of law and order have collapsed. What can the righteous do?" (Psalm 11:3, NLT)

Jesus told the parable of building a house on the rock so when the waters come along, it doesn't wash away like sand. In a vital spiritual sense, the relevance of scripture is paramount to our foundation. The authority of God's laws to our lives were declared by Jesus to be until the end of time.

"For I assure you: Until heaven and earth pass away, not the smallest letter or one stroke of a letter will pass from the law until all things are accomplished" (Matthew 5:18).

## Sunrise: Sorrow of Sorrows

 Mourning the loss of a suicide victim will often take longer than other losses. Though guilt is a common experience with survivors of deceased loved ones, it is more intense with relatives or friends who are striving to cope with loss from suicide. Common questions are; "Why did I not see any warning signs?" "Why did they not come to me for help?" "Could I not have prevented this from happening, if only I had taken them to a professional or administered to the person?"

This is seldom factual. We cannot know what the thoughts are of another person, unless they are willing to share. Why they were unwilling we may never know. There may have been a medical issue that is unknown to the survivors. There may have been a chemical imbalance or caused by some psychological factor that is unknown. Feelings need to be discussed.

There is great value in talking to someone who will keep your confidence and privacy and gives you no time limit as to how long a person needs to talk. Typically, people who commit suicide are seeking relief or escape from their feelings of hopelessness, alienation, rejection or something else they feel is unbearable. There is no single cause, only causes. The person may act impulsively or may fulfill a pre-planned event. Some indicators may be: Depression or some other mental illness, contrasting changes in behavior from what is usual, giving away previously important belongings or previous attempts in cutting on themselves. Always take any talk of suicide seriously! Too many people dismiss such as jest. Be direct with questions that probe their feelings at any moment of suspicion. Reassure all that there is always hope and more than one option to any struggle. Never promise to keep secret anything that will harm someone, or is immoral, illegal, or unethical. Tardy pointed out there are three days during the year on which our country recognizes its veterans. These are the May 21 "Armed Forces Day" when we recognize service members, November 11 "Veterans' Day" when we recognize all of our veterans, and the last Monday in May is "Memorial Day", when we pay our respects and remember those who gave their lives in military service.

Memorial Day began in Carbondale, Illinois in 1866 as a day to remember those who died in the Civil War. The official "birth place" for the day is Waterloo, New York. It became an official national holiday in 1971.

Posting of the Colors opened a moving ceremony led by the Post Commander, James Burchfield. Everyone joined in the singing of our National Anthem followed by recitation of the Pledge of Allegiance. A wreath was placed in front of the wall. Gerald Nichols of the Marine Corps League in Corinth, Mississippi played taps.

Annie Pearl Orman, Vice President of the Ladies Auxiliary, read a roll call of Middleton residents who sacrificed their lives in service to their country. The city suffered nine casualties in World War II, four in Korea, four in Vietnam, and three in Iraq.

Col. Tardy pointed out that the United States has suffered almost 650,000 hostile deaths in 83 wars and assorted military actions over the past 241 years. Another 600,000 casualties are classified as "non-hostile deaths."

He expressed concern that many people consider the Memorial Day weekend as the beginning of summer and do not recognize the significance of the day. TV "man on the street" interviews reveal that many Americans do not even know what Memorial Day is. "Finally, with the all-volunteer force, emphasis on military service in our society has reduced the impact of military deaths in our society."

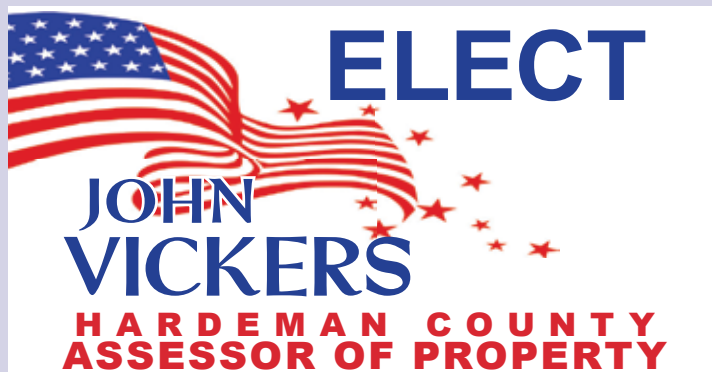



## Tennessee Files to Join Lawsuit Against US Department of Education

Tennessee Attorney General Herbert H. Slatery III joined Texas and nine other states in filing a lawsuit against the United States Department of Education (DOE) and the Department of Justice (DOJ). This is in direct response to recent actions taken by DOE and DOJ in connection with Title VII and Title IX. In the joint letter referred to as the "Dear Colleague Letter" sent by DOE and DOJ to school districts across the country, DOE and DOJ redefined the term "sex" as a person's sense of gender identity and placed federal funding at risk for schools whose facilities and programs do not comply with the new defini-

tion. Slatery said, "The Executive Branch has taken what should be a state and local issue [under the Tenth Amendment] and made it a federal issue. Schools that do not conform under the new rules risk losing their federal funding. This is yet another instance of the Executive Branch changing law on a grand scale, which is not its constitutional role. Congress legislates, not the Executive Branch. Our Office has consistently opposed efforts like this to take away states' rights and exclude the people's representatives from making these decisions, or at a minimum being able to engage

in a notice and comment period under the Administrative Procedure Act (APA). As the complaint describes, it is a social experiment implemented by federal departments denying basic privacy rights and placing the burden largely on our children, not adults. Sitting on the sidelines on this issue was not an option." In 1964, Congress enacted Title VII of the Civil Rights Act, making it illegal for employers to discriminate on the basis of race, color, religion, sex or national origin. Eight years later, Congress took it a step further with Title IX of the Education Amendments

of 1972, expanding those protections to federally funded education programs. Slatery added, "Title IX prohibits discrimination on the basis of "sex" - defined to be a biological category based principally on male or female anatomy. The Administration is incorrectly interpreting Title IX to include self-proclaimed gender identity. By issuing this change as a

"guideline," DOE and DOJ are sidestepping the APA and infringing on a legal territory reserved for the legislature. Tennessee is initiating this lawsuit with the other states to contest the action for all of these reasons." So far, other states joining in the filing are Alabama, Arizona, Georgia, Louisiana, Maine, Oklahoma, Utah, West Virginia, and Wisconsin.

## MCQueen and Panel to Study Testing

Education Commissioner Candice McQueen announced the reconvening of the special Tennessee Task Force on Student Testing and Assessment to further study and identify best practices in testing at the school, district, and state level. Commissioner McQueen formed the first iteration of this assessment task force shortly after taking office in 2015 as a result of feedback from the field about the amount of testing, quality of testing, and associated test preparation. Based on in-depth discussions and extensive experience from the field, the original task force developed a set of principles and recommendations, housed in a task force report, to

guide the work of the state, districts, and schools. Recommendations included multiple strategies to help reduce unnecessary or redundant student tests, including eliminating assessments in four grades. "Reconvening this group of leaders across the state, in addition to welcoming new members, gives us an opportunity to continue the dialogue around creating intentional and streamlined assessments," Commissioner Candice McQueen said. "This group's thoughtful work led to 16 recommendations in the first report - all of which are being implemented." Membership of this spring's reconvened task force includes

several new participants, joining members from a broad spectrum of stakeholders representing educators, legislators, parents, school board members, students, and communities across the state. The group will meet monthly throughout summer and early fall to learn of the progress on last year's recommendations, address items requiring further analysis from the first task force, review and assess tests implemented in the 2015-16 school year, provide additional recommendations on testing, and give feedback on specific assessment and accountability-related items as the department works to develop a plan to implement the federal Every Student Succeeds Act.

Four Hardeman County students were among the approximately 250 graduates who received degrees Saturday, May 14, at Freed-Hardeman University. Graduate degrees in a variety of fields were conferred on 51 students. Almost 200 students were awarded baccalaureate degrees. Degrees were conferred upon the following local students: Dana Cox, Middleton, Bachelor of Arts in English and history; Alicia Cross, Toone, Master of Arts in Teaching; Latonya Hudson, Bolivar, Education Specialist; and Christopher Lake, Bolivar, Master of Arts in Teaching.

## Tax Holiday Rescheduled for TN

Recent legislation has changed the date of Tennessee's annual sales tax holiday. Tennessee's sales tax holiday will now be one weekend earlier than it has been in the past. Starting in 2016, and continuing annually, the sales tax holiday will be held during the last Friday in July through the following Sunday. The dates for this year's sales tax holiday are July 29 through July 31, 2016. The new law did not change any other aspects of the sales tax holiday. As in prior years, consumers will not pay state or local sales tax on clothing, school and art supplies that cost \$100 or less per item and computers that cost \$1,500 or less. 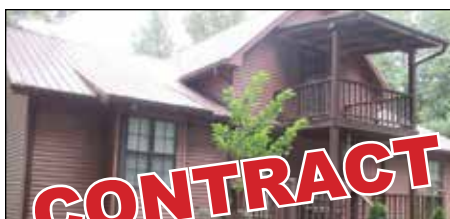
