were part of the outpouring of aid from all over the southeast to help victims of the Smoky Mountain fires.

The Hardeman County Rescue Squad came up with the idea of "Goods for Gatlinburg" headed up by members; David Strain, Jackie Gandy, and Donnie Matthews. The goal was to collect a long list of items and leave Friday night to make the drive to Gatlinburg, not knowing what to expect once arriving. Some items included: toiletries, diapers, stuffed animals, coats, clothing, clean linens and blankets, plastic ware, pet crates, and animal food. In just one day, the citizens of Hardeman County helped to fill a truck bed and back seat with men's, women's, and children's clothes, toys, pillows, towels, food, and hygiene products. The items were included with donations from another group in Jackson which included diapers, tools, water, food that along with Hardeman County's donations filled up eight trucks and three trailers.

The City of Grand Junction decided to donate all items from their clothes closet at City Hall that contains items for those who have had devastating events occur. Grand Junction Mayor Curtis Lane donated his enclosed trailer to Police Chief Larry Hunt and Fire Department Director Buddy Cantrell, who dropped off the items at The Smokies Wilderness and Water Park on Sunday.

Bolivar Election Attracts Candidates

Five candidates have picked up petitions in preparation to run for office in the 2017 City of Bolivar Elections.

Incumbent Mayor Barrett Stevens picked up petitions to seek his third term of office as mayor, while city councilman Julian McTizic will challenge for the mayor's seat.

Picking up petitions, but not yet filing them, were Melvin Golden for District A, Position 3, which is currently held by McTizic; incumbent Willie McKinnie for District A, Position 4; and former Tennessee House of Representatives member Dr. Page Walley for District B, Position 4, which is currently held by Randy Hill. Dr. Walley was elected to and served in the Tennessee House from 1990 to 2000.

Also up for election in 2017 is the seat held by Suzanne Rhea, which is District B, Position 3. At press time, no one had picked up petitions for that seat, which was won by the late David Rhea in 2013. Suzanne, his wife, was tabbed to finish his term after his death in April of 2015.

The deadline for petitions to arrive at the Hardeman County Election Commission is February 16, 2017. Twenty-five signatures are required from city registered voters in the case of the mayors or from registered voters within the districts in the case of the city council positions.

Early voting is scheduled for April 26-May 11. Election Day is May 16. The last day to register to vote in the 2017 Bolivar City Election is April 16, 2017.

WMOD Radio, WOJG Radio, and the Bolivar Bulletin Times will join to bring the 2017 City of Bolivar Candidates Debate on April 25, 2017 at the Bolivar Municipal Center.

Hardeman County Remembered by Lisa Coleman


Like so many of you, I watched with disbelief and sadness the stories of the wildfires that raged through our beautiful Great Smoky Mountains just a little over a week ago. I remembered fun trips with family and friends to that area, to those mountains. Judging by the photos I've seen posted on social media, there are many of us who have fond memories of visits to our mountains.

The great naturalist and writer John Muir said that "The mountains are calling and I must go" and that "Going to the mountains is going home". Although he spoke of the mountains of the West, the sentiment applies to our Smoky Mountains in East Tennessee. Whether we go there physically or in trips down memory lane, we must, from time to time, go home to our Tennessee mountains

There is a reason, I think, that we as Tennesseans feel such a kinship to those mountains, and why going to visit them is comfortable and familiar to us. If I can borrow a phrase from Dolly Parton, they are our collective Tennessee Mountain Home. Our mountains wrap around those sweet places, those towns and valleys, like a parent or grandparent wrapped a blanket around us when we were small. Those mountains are wrapped around many of our precious memories of people and places that we treasure.

The mountains of East Tennessee are in my blood, in my DNA in a way; they are a part of my history. My ancestors crossed those mountains, coming from places like Virginia and North Carolina, as they traveled westward to other places in search of new adventures. My Native American ancestors called those mountains their home long before anyone else ever set foot on them.

I have often wondered what people thought when they first crossed those mountains and took



in those vistas of the mountains and valleys below. What did they think of the "blue smoke" that decorates the mountains and lazily floats across the scenery? For some it must have inspired them to keep traveling, to keep searching for the next place; for others, it was all that they needed and they made a home in those mountains.

There are many, many fine organizations collecting money and

supplies for our East Tennessee neighbors, one of the finest, I think is Dolly Parton's foundation (www.dollywoodfoundation. org), which exemplifies one thing we as Tennesseans do really well: we take care of and pray for each other. Y'all, these are our people, our mountains-keep those sweet people and all those helping them in your thoughts and prayers.



It just simply happened and you Trudged through it. before the prayer request for me comma There was a prayer request had for a friend of the family. This friend and his immediate family was involved in a horrific car accident. The rear end collision hurt every member of the family, especially his three small children in the back seat.

I crawled up the stairs hoping to get a better grasp of what I was dealing with when I just broke down. Weakeness overcame me and I couldn't lift my head without getting sick to my stomach. my arms and hands were shaking from low fluids and low blood sugar. I was fading fast. My friends called the rescue squad for my first squad ride in my life. The EMTs on the squad are very kind and reassuring and within a few moments I realized that at least I was not experiencing a heart attack..For much of the summer until this past weekend I've felt drained and off balance. Sunday debilitated me to where I felt to be an absolute invilid. The sickness and anxiety took much of my attention away from places it should be. I wish I could say that I studied God's word endlessly during that time, but honestly I just felt blah. It's one of my unwritten pages of faith, the time between things happening. I'm not saying they don't have a reason. I am saying that we don't have to fret about that what that reason is.

I got back on Facebook to let everyone know my situation only to find the sad news that one of the children had passed away in

the car accident. This is a scripture moment, a moment where a person's faith is made, tested,



If not, you may want to think about it – and here are a few list-worthy items to consider: •Examine – and re-examine – your planned retirement age. You may have long counted on retiring at a certain age, but are you sure

that this goal is the best one for your overall financial situation? Think about it: If you like your job, and you stayed at it for just a few more years, you could significantly boost the funds in your 401(k) or other retirement plan, and you might even be able to delay taking Social Security, which, in turn, would result in larger monthly payments.

•Put a "price tag" on your retirement lifestyle. When you retire, do you want to travel the world or stay at home pursuing your hobbies? Will you truly retire from all types of work, or will you do some consulting or take up part-time employment? Once you know what your retirement lifestyle might look like, you can better estimate your costs and expenses - and this knowledge will help you determine how much you need to withdraw each year from your various retirement accounts, such as your IRA, 401(k) or other employer-based

•Be aware of retirement plan withdrawal rules. It isn't enough just to recognize how much you need to withdraw from your retirement plans - you also must know how much you must withdraw. Once you turn 70 ½, you generally have to start taking money out of your traditional IRA and 401(k). These required minimum distributions, or RMDs, are based on your account balance, age and other factors, but the key word to remember is "required" - if you don't withdraw the full amount of the RMD by the applicable deadline, the amount not withdrawn can be taxed at a 50% rate.

•Review your health care situation. When you turn 65, you will likely be eligible for Medicare, but you'll want to become familiar with what it does – and doesn't – cover, so you can establish an annual health care budget. And if you are planning to retire early, which might mean losing your employer-sponsored health insurance, you will need to be prepared for potentially large out-of-pocket costs.

•Think about long-term care. One service that Medicare doesn't cover – or, at best, covers only minimally – is long-term care. If you faced an extended stay in a nursing home, the costs could be catastrophic. A financial professional may be able to help you find a way to reduce this risk.

•Develop your estate plans. Estate planning can be complex, involving many different documents - such as a will, a living trust, power of attorney, etc. - so you'll want to work with a legal professional to ensure you're making the right choices for yourself and your family.

By checking off these items, one by one, your retirement "to do" list will eventually get "done." And when that happens, you may find yourself pretty well prepared to enjoy life as a retiree.



We must be reasonable in our goals for weight loss. We must also have expectations for how we will look and feel in a range that is possible, don't set yourself up for disappointment. I know that my goal of losing 50 pounds is reasonable for me and my body type and my age. What would not be reasonable is if I set a goal of reaching that 50 pound weight loss in 2-3 months. If possible, it would not be a healthy way of losing, and I would probably not keep it off. Medical/Insurance weight charts will give you a guideline for your height, weight, age. But remember it is a guideline. I think it would be unreasonable for me to think I could lose weight and be smaller than I was in 9th grade! I have never been a size 5! Or 7!

My body type will not change. If I had always had larger hips and thighs (pear shape) those will still be the larger parts on my body. Or if I had been apple shaped, that is, larger on top then I will probably maintain that basic body type. I am kind of the equal body type, top and hips/thighs and will probably remain that same type, but all will be smaller.

The good thing about me is that even with the weight I need to lose, I still have quite a bit of muscle. I am pretty strong for a woman, I can lift a lot of things that many people are surprised that I can move or lift these items. List your strengths, or those things that you like about your body. Do you have great hair, pretty eyes? A wonderful smile? I will continue to increase my exercise, including light weights and aerobic exercise of various kinds. Walking is the easiest for me, but the longest distance is from the couch to the sidewalk, in other words just getting started each time and being consistent.



The cast of dozens in traditional garb will bring alive the story of the first Christmas set in Bethlehem. The event organizers have Dixie Hill Baptist Church Gym.





Hardeman County in Top 10 in Tennessee

For the second year in a row, Hardeman County is among the top counties in signing up to mentor students as part of the tnAchieves program.

The mentoring program asks qualified candidates to make initial contact with students before the high school team meeting, reach out to parents/guardians if possible, remind students of all meetings and deadlines, attend the high school and the college team meetings, encourages students to reach their potential, and play an active role in eliminating barriers associated with post-secondary access and success.

To qualify to mentor they must be 21 years or older, apply by December 1, be subject to a background check, complete mandatory mentor training by February 15, 2017, attend the mandatory high school team meeting in March or April and attend the mandatory college team meeting in the fall.

Because of increased supports by tnAchieves and other programs, Tennessee leads the nation in FAFSA filing. In fact, the state had the highest year over year gain in percentage of students who filed FAFSA and accounted for more than 40 percent in FAFSA growth across the entire country in 2015.









Parents of students in grades three through five can still register their children for the remaining "Mars Rescue!" course offered from 9 a.m.-noon, December 10, at the University of Tennessee at Martin's Jackson Center.

During the December 10 session, students will face a scenario where their spacecraft has been hit by a meteor shower, causing them to crash in the West Valles Marineris of planet Mars. From their scattered spacecraft, they must build their own Mars Rover and guide their surviving crew members to Arsia Mons, a dormant caldera twice as high as Earth's Mount Everest.

James Swanger, course instructor, will lead participants as they build, program and refine a Lego NXT Robot. The class emphasizes the practical use of the scientific method while using observation, query, hypothesis, prediction, testing, refinement, rejection and theory.
