## A Long and Tearful Goodbye

It was a city council meeting full of tearful thanks and goodbyes for exiting Bolivar Mayor Barrett Stevens and Council Members Willie McKinnie and Randy Hill on June 13.

"At this time, I want to thank all the citizens of Bolivar and my fellow council members for having me these last eight years as your mayor. I particularly want to thank the staff, department heads, and the employees of the City of Bolivar. Our success can be laid in this board and in the hands of these valued employees. In a few days, I'll end my term as mayor," began Stevens.

"And we've had a good transition, our mayor-elect is working real hard. He's doing a great job. He helped put this new budget together and worked hard at it. He's met with all our employees and department heads and I support him 100%."

Mayor Stevens was overcome with emotion as he took a moment before turning to Mayor-Elect Julian McTizic and going on to say,

"Bolivar's success depends upon what you do in the future. I support you and I'm going to do everything I can to continue to support Bolivar. Thank you and God bless you."

Willie McKinnie fought back tears, stating, "I do appreciate being the representative for Chief (Pat) Baker and all the policemen and Chief (Lynn) Price and all the firemen. It was a great honor to represent you all. I want to say I thank God for blessing me to serve the citizens of Bolivar. It's just been an honor. But most of all, it's been a pleasure and a great honor to me to serve under Mayor Stevens. And I appreciate the work we have done together and the things that are still in the



works. And I'm praying that God will use Mayor McTizic to carry forth and keep the progress going and that he will lead and guide you in everything you do."

During the meeting, the council passed the 2017-2018 budget on the first reading. A synopsis of the budget is on A6.

Mayor-Elect Julian McTizic will begin his term in office July

1. McTizic defeated Stevens by a 653-580 margin in the May election. McKinnie was defeated by Jonathan Joy and Randy Hill elected not to run.

It is the oldest celebration of the ending of slavery. Juneteenth Celebrations commemorate African - American freedom. Today, the emphasis is on education, achievement and living with others in multicultural America.

A Celebration of Life will be held in Bolivar on court square beginning at 10:00 a.m.

## Luez Theatre Getting a Facelift

For the first time in 70 years, the familiar Luez Theatre marquee is missing from the Bolivar landscape.

Workers from Memphis Sign Erectors, Inc., (see photo right) spent most of June 12 dismantling the sign from the circa 1947 theatre that will be refurbished by the Bolivar Downtown Development Corporation (DEVCO).

The sign portion of the project to bring the theatre back to life is funded under a grant contract with the State of Tennessee.

DEVCO purchased the theatre in 2013, and approved the expenditure of \$250,000 to repair the facility at their April 2017 meeting.

## The Power of a Simple Plea

This week, during a youth worship service, a young woman came up to me as we were all singing. With tear-filled eyes, she said "I've been to church my whole life, but I don't know Jesus. I want to know Him." I was in tears as well, as she sat beside me and prayed that God would take her life, forgive her sins and make her His child. She stood up in front of the group, proud of her decision. Later that night, her face beamed with a smile I had never seen on her before. Something happens in the transaction with God that begins a magnificent transformation.

The first thing that I have always heard from people who are just giving their lives to Christ is that they feel as though a heaviness falls from their shoulders. People have exclaimed "It just felt like a weight fell off my back" while another said in tears "It feel like a big bag just fell from my shoulders." Many people sense that moment that they are no longer the ones carrying those burdens, but they transfer them to Christ, who has already willingly carried their

weights. The simple, sincere plea really does wonders.

Something else that happens in that exchange is that God literally places His Spirit within the person. God begins to motivate, encourage, compel and correct from the inside out. 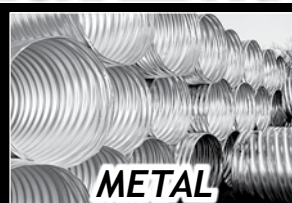

## Life Insurance Needs Will Change Over Time... So Be Prepared

If you're going to achieve all your goals, such as sending your kids to college, retiring in comfort and leaving a legacy, you will need to save and invest throughout your lifetime. But to really complete your financial picture, you'll also need to add one more element: protection. And that means you'll require adequate life insurance for your situation. After you retire, you may have either paid off your mortgage or moved into a condominium or apartment, so you may require even less life insurance than before. But it's also possible that your need for life insurance will remain strong. For example, the proceeds of a life insurance policy can be used to pay your final expenses or to replace any income lost to your spouse as a result of your death (e.g., from a pension or Social Security.) Life insurance can also be used in your estate plans to help leave the legacy you desire.

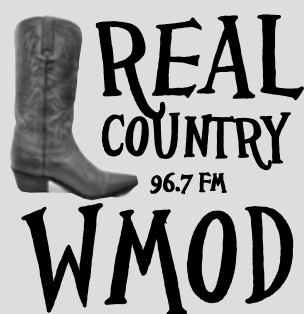

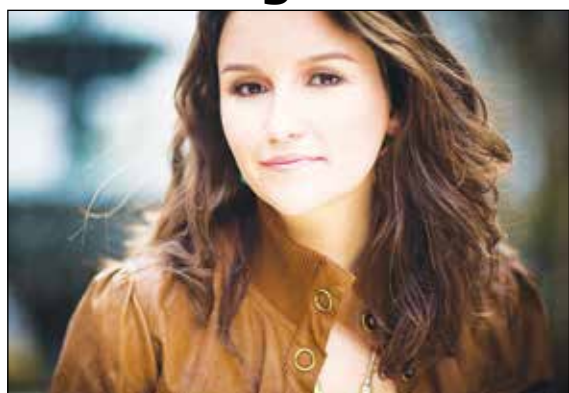
## Ashton Shepherd Coming to Bolivar

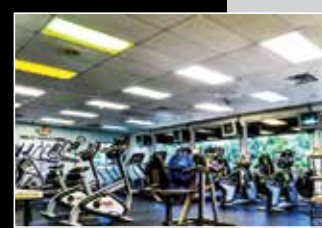

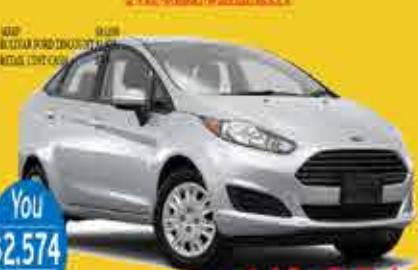
