County Finishes Voter Registration Drive



With early voting opening in Hardeman County next week, the recent voter registration drive has put the county election commission in better shape to service the electorate.

"We had many people get their information updated and several were registered to vote for the first time," said Hardeman County Administrator of Elections Amber Moore. "It was our first time to try it, and I think it went well."

Hardeman County Federal, State of Tennessee, the City of Bolivar Wine in Grocery Stores referendum, Town of Hornsby, City of Middleton, Town of Saulsby, Town of Silerton, and Town of Toone Municipal Elections will be contested this cycle.

Early voting begins October 19 and continues through November 3. On November 3, the election commission offices will have extended hours, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m. Election Day is November 8. WMOD Radio will broadcast county results on November 8 beginning at 7:00 p.m.

Communities Get Improvement Grants

Hardeman County will receive two Community Development Block Grants (CDBG) for a combined total of \$636,860. One grant of \$387,100 will go to Middleton to be used for sewer system improvements, while the other grant of \$249,760 will go to Hornsby to be used for water main improvements.

The CDBG grants in Hardeman County are among eleven awarded to cities and counties in the 26th Senatorial District for a combined total of over \$3.8 million. Although 131 grant applications were received statewide, only 69 were successful. The district, which is comprised of Chester, Decatur, Fayette, Hardeman, Hardin, Haywood, McNairy, and Henderson Counties, received more grants than any other legislative district in the State of Tennessee.

"I am pleased these major grants are coming into Hardeman County and want to thank Governor Haslam, Commissioner Boyd and our local officials who were instrumental in helping to secure these funds," said State Senator Dolores Gresham. "This kind of infrastructure is very important to the well-being of our citizens and to the overall economic development of our county."

The funds were allocated under a procedure authorized by the Tennessee General Assembly. The Department of Economic and Community Development administers the grant program based on priorities set at the local level where community needs are best known.

Customers of the Bolivar Utility Department wanting their pilots on for the winter season need to contact the department in the next few weeks. This service will be provided free through October 31.

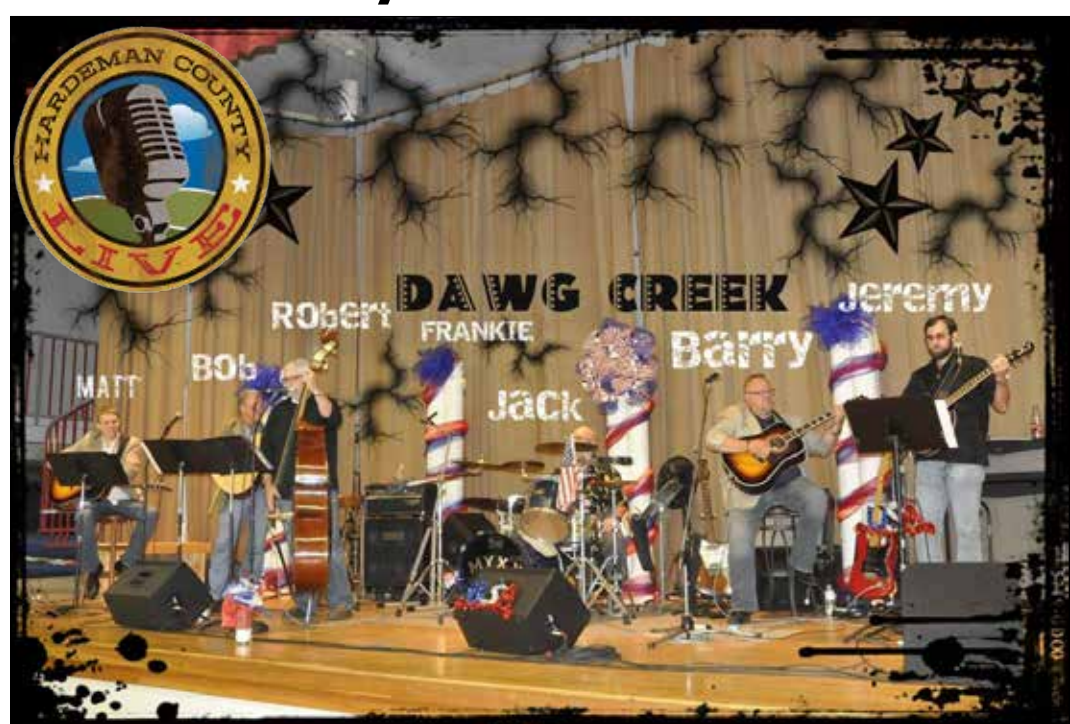
Dawg Creek and the Wise Guys in Downtown Bolivar

Advice During National School Bus Safety Week

Hardeman County Schools are proud to support National School Bus Safety Week (October 17 - 21), a time set aside each year to recognize the important role our bus drivers serve in our communities and remind us to follow safety laws in order to protect children around our school buses. We would like to first recognize our bus drivers and technicians. In Hardeman County, we transport over 3,000 students daily on 64 routes, usually without incident. Statistically, there is no safer way for a student to travel than on a school bus. This is due in large part to the hard work and dedication of our bus drivers and technicians, and we should all take a moment this week to thank them for what they do. We would also like to thank parents and teachers, who have done an outstanding job educating their children regarding bus safety. And, certainly, the students, who follow the safety rules so well, ensuring they get to and from school so they can learn. The large majority of the population knows and follows school bus safety rules, and this allows

for Hardeman County's students to reach their schools and homes safely every day.

The theme of this year's National School Bus Safety Week is "Bully Free Zone." It reminds us that a safe enjoyable day at school starts with the bus ride to school. We should encourage students to work together to help insure safe transit on the school bus and to handle issues through the bus driver and/or staff at their schools. Fortunately, most accidents involving school buses do not occur when students are on the bus. However, the "Danger Zone", which is 10 feet around the bus, is where most accidents, involving students, occur. For this reason, it is important that all of us understand what to do when we see a school bus. Here are a few reminders:

1. Slow down in school zones. The speed limit is lower in these areas because when near a school, students are moving on and off the bus, being dropped off by their parents, or walking to the school. Slowing down in these zones gives drivers time to react.

2. Slow down for yellow flashing lights on school buses. Stop for red flashing lights and the stop arm. We know it can be tempting to speed up when you see those flashing lights, but it is very dangerous to try passing the bus before it stops. The red lights mean students are getting on and off the bus. When drivers move too quickly and aren't cautious, accidents can happen. On a road with two-way traffic, cars traveling in both directions should stop because students may be crossing the road.

3. Finally, as we enter the winter months and prepare for the end of daylight savings time, more students will be waiting for the bus in the dark. Exercise extra caution, especially in the mornings.

During National School Bus Safety Week, we want to thank everyone who has a hand in providing safe transportation to Hardeman County's students, especially our bus drivers and technicians. You have a direct impact on Hardeman County's vision of "Preparing for the Future, One Child at a Time."

UT-Martin Offers Aerospace Classes for Kids

Parents can register their children for a course on aerospace offered from 9:00 a.m.-Noon, Saturdays, October 22, November 12 or December 3, at the University of Tennessee at Martin Jackson Center.

Dr. Leland Smith, course instructor, will lead students as they build, test, fly and evaluate various projects, including wind tunnels, aerodynamic paper planes, FPG9 gliders, Balsa wood flyers, Balsa wood bi-plane gliders, stomp rockets, bottle rockets and hot air balloons.

Smith, a Lt. Col. with the United States Air Force Auxiliary and a UT Martin instructor, will also teach participants about the Bernoulli effect, and the history and four forces of flight. The Civil Air Patrol supplies many of the materials used during the course. The registration fee for this course is \$35 per session or \$90 for all three sessions. 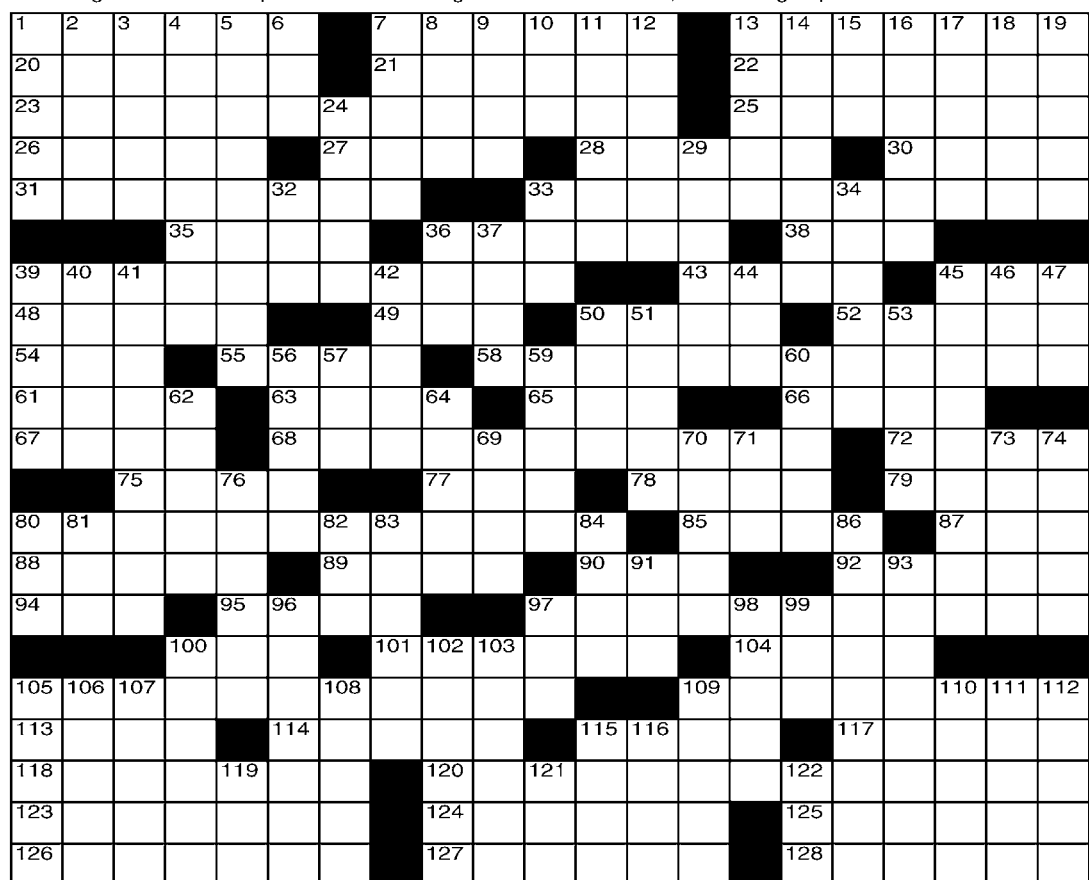

Gluten Free Banana Bread

- Ingredients**
- 1 tablespoon flax meal
 - 3 tablespoons water
 - 3 cups rolled oats
 - 2/3 cup coconut sugar (or organic sugar)
 - 1 teaspoon baking soda
 - 1/2 teaspoon salt
 - 1 teaspoon cinnamon
 - 3 ripe bananas
 - 1/2 cup applesauce
 - 2 tablespoons canola oil (or coconut)
 - 1 tablespoon pecans, chopped

- Directions**
- Preheat oven to 350°F. Lightly spray a 9-inch loaf pan.
- In a small bowl mix the flax meal and water together, and set aside.
- Add the rolled oats to a food processor and grind into a flour.
- Pour the oat flour into a medium-sized mixing bowl and mix in the coconut sugar, baking soda, salt, and cinnamon.
- In a separate mixing bowl, mash the bananas using a fork. Add in the flax egg, applesauce, and oil.
- Pour the dry ingredients into the wet and mix well.
- Pour the batter into the pan and topped with chopped pecans.
- Bake for 50 to 60 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted in the middle comes out dry.

It's National Save for Retirement Week - So Take Action

Congress has dedicated the third week of October as National Save for Retirement Week. Clearly, the government feels the need to urge people to do a better job of preparing for retirement. Are you doing all you can?

Many of your peers aren't - or at least they think they aren't. In a recent survey conducted by Bankrate.com, respondents reported that "not saving for retirement early enough" was their biggest financial regret. Other evidence seems to show they have good cause for remorse: 52% of households 55 and older haven't saved anything for retirement, according to a report from the U.S. Government Accountability Office, although half of this group reported having a pension.

Obviously, you'll want to avoid having either financial regrets or major shortfalls in your retirement savings. And that means you may need to consider making moves such as these:

Take advantage of all your opportunities. You may well have access to more than one tax-advantaged retirement plan. Your employer may offer a 401(k) or similar plan, and even if you participate in your employer's plan, you are probably still eligible to contribute to an IRA. You may not be able to afford to "max out" on both plans, but try to contribute as much as you can afford. At the very least, put in enough to your employer's plan to earn a matching contribution, if one is offered, and boost your annual contributions every year in which your salary goes up.

Create an appropriate investment mix. It's not enough just to invest regularly through your IRA, 401(k) or other retirement plan - you also need to invest wisely. You can fund your IRA with virtually any investments you choose, while your 401(k) or similar plan likely offers an array of investment accounts. So, between your IRA and 401(k), you can create portfolios that reflect your goals, risk tolerance and time horizon. It's especially important that your investment mix offers sufficient growth potential to help you make progress toward the retirement lifestyle you've envisioned.

Don't "raid" your retirement accounts early. If you start withdrawing from your traditional IRA before you turn 59½, you may have to pay a 10% tax penalty in addition to normal income taxes due. (If you have a Roth IRA and start taking withdrawals before you are 59½, the earnings will be taxed and may be subject to a 10% penalty - but contributions can be withdrawn without any tax and penalty consequences.) As for your 401(k) or similar plan, you may be able to take out a loan, but you'll have to pay yourself back to avoid any tax or penalty consequences. (Also, not all plans offer a loan option.) More importantly, any money you take out early is money that no longer has a chance to grow to help you meet your goals. Try to do everything you can, then, to keep your retirement plans intact until you actually do retire. One suggestion: Build an emergency fund containing three to six months' worth of living expenses, kept in a liquid, low-risk vehicle outside your IRA or 401(k).

National Save for Retirement Week reminds us that we all must act to help ourselves retire comfortably. By making the moves described above, you can do your part.

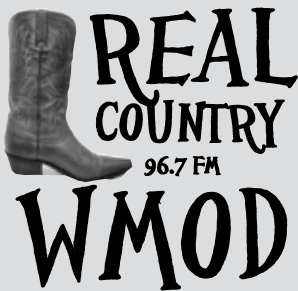

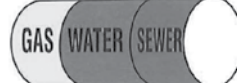

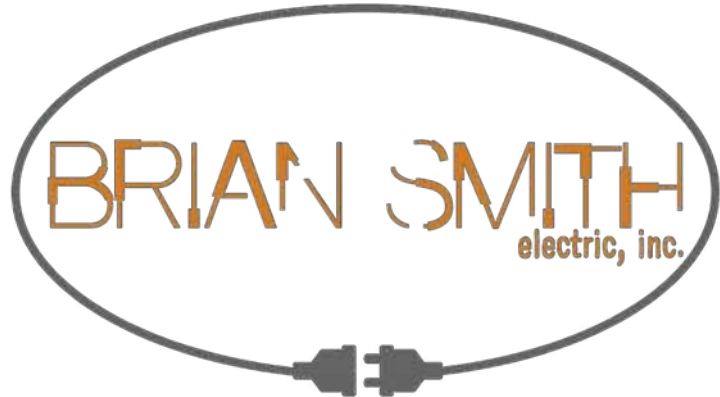

Bolivar (6-1, 3-1) scored on their first four possessions to take a 32-14 halftime lead and led by as much as 30 points, at 44-14 at the end of the third quarter. FACS managed two late touchdowns to close the margin at the end.

The Tigers rushed for 400 yards on 42 carries, led by Drek Lewis with 243 yards on 20 carries and five touchdowns. Correy Brown had 124 yards on 12 carries with a touchdown.

"The offensive line dominated," said Head Coach Woodrow Lowe. "We went out and took care of things."

Bolivar lost safety Daniel Lake for at least the next three games

with a broken arm suffered in the win, according to Lowe.

"He's one of our leaders. He will be missed, but the next man will need to step up," said Lowe.

In 2015, Bolivar led by 11 points with 10 minutes left, but eventually fell to the Crusaders by a 42-39 score.

In the Region 8AAA race, the Tigers control their own destiny for the #2 seed and a home play-off game against the #3 seed from Region 7AAA.

Lewis was named the Vaughan Oil Player of the Game, while C.J. McMahan was named the Line-man of the Game.
