## Upgrading the Infrastructure

The August 2015 approval of a new home for the Hardeman County EMS and annex for the Bolivar Fire Department is finally taking shape in the form of a metal building on the corner of Lucy Black Road and State Highway 64 West.

"The construction on the new building is really going well now. There were setbacks due to engineering plans and the fact that the building was rated the same category as a hospital. But now, we have all of the green lights and it is progressing smoothly," said Hardeman County Mayor Jimmy Sain.

The facility, 70 feet wide and 320 feet long, has 10 bays to accommodate ambulances and two drive-through bays to house fire trucks. It will have separate sleeping, kitchen, and living quarters for EMS and fire personnel.

## Bates to do 21 Yrs and Owes \$21M

Former Hardeman County resident Charles Larry Bates was sentenced to 21 years and 10 months for a scheme selling gold and silver to investors that netted the self-made radio host almost \$100 million.

Bates made his pitch on Christian media outlets as well as his family's own Information Radio Network, Inc.

During sentencing, Bates was ordered to pay restitution of \$21 million to 400 people defrauded in the scheme.

In May, Bates was convicted of 46 counts of fraud and was tabbed as the ringleader in the grift and deemed responsible for the total amount gained in the scheme.

Customers had given \$87 million to First American Monetary Consultants to buy precious metals. But prosecutors maintained and the jury decided that the defendants kept the money for their personal use, including commodities trading and a 10,000-square-foot house. By 2009, the company had more than \$26 million dollars in unfilled orders, according to court documents.

Bates was also in the Hardeman County spotlight in 2010, with his attempt to influence the outcome of the 2010 Hardeman County Sheriff's race against current Hardeman County Sheriff John Doolen.

According to court documents, the timing of the funding for the political hit on then Whiteville Police Chief John Doolen was supplied with money from the Ponzi scheme.

## Kamp Kiwani Serves the Tri-State Area by Jessica Simmons

A hidden gem within Hardeman County, Kamp Kiwani Girl Scout Camp is located outside Middleton, just 75 miles east of Memphis. Containing an impressive 1,250 acres, Kamp Kiwani is the Girl Scouts Heart of the South's largest camp with local resident Tim Howell serving as a live-in Ranger for the property. The Girl Scouts Heart of the South region serves 59 counties in North Mississippi, West Tennessee, and Crittenden County, Arkansas; as well as maintains camps and four regional service centers.

The history of "established" or resident camping in the Girl Scout Council of the Mid-South (formerly Tenn-Ark-Miss Girl Scout Council) began in 1920 when 80 acres in the foothills of the Ozarks near Hardy, Arkansas became the first Kamp Kiwani and served until it was sold in 1960.

The council purchased a 1,250-acre site near Middleton, Tennessee in 1961, finally opening in 1965. Camps Yataka and Tapawingo in Mississippi served as temporary resident camp sites for the council until Sandy Springs could be developed, opening in 1971.

Kamp Kiwani can accommodate 237 people, offering guests the op-



tion of screened-in cabins, open-air cabins, a lodge or tent camping. The main camp area includes the Health Hut, Boat House, the Trading Post and the Thunder Bird Dining Hall.

Kamp Kiwani is also home to Sandy Springs Ranch which serves as a destination for hikers and girls looking to advance their overnight outdoor skills. The Ranch features a ranch house with a fully equipped kitchen, a shower house and five open-air cabins. Kamp Kiwani also has an Equestrian Center that houses horses used throughout the year for equestrian programs and during the summer provides a two-week

horse program for older girls.

The camp also features a large game field, an archery field, obstacle course, hiking trails and the camp's 70-acre lake allows swimming, canoeing, and kayaking.

The camp is open April 1-November 1, except for Ginny Lodge which is available all year long, except during the summer when it is used for resident summer camp. Kamp Kiwani is available for rental to schools, churches, and other youth serving organizations. 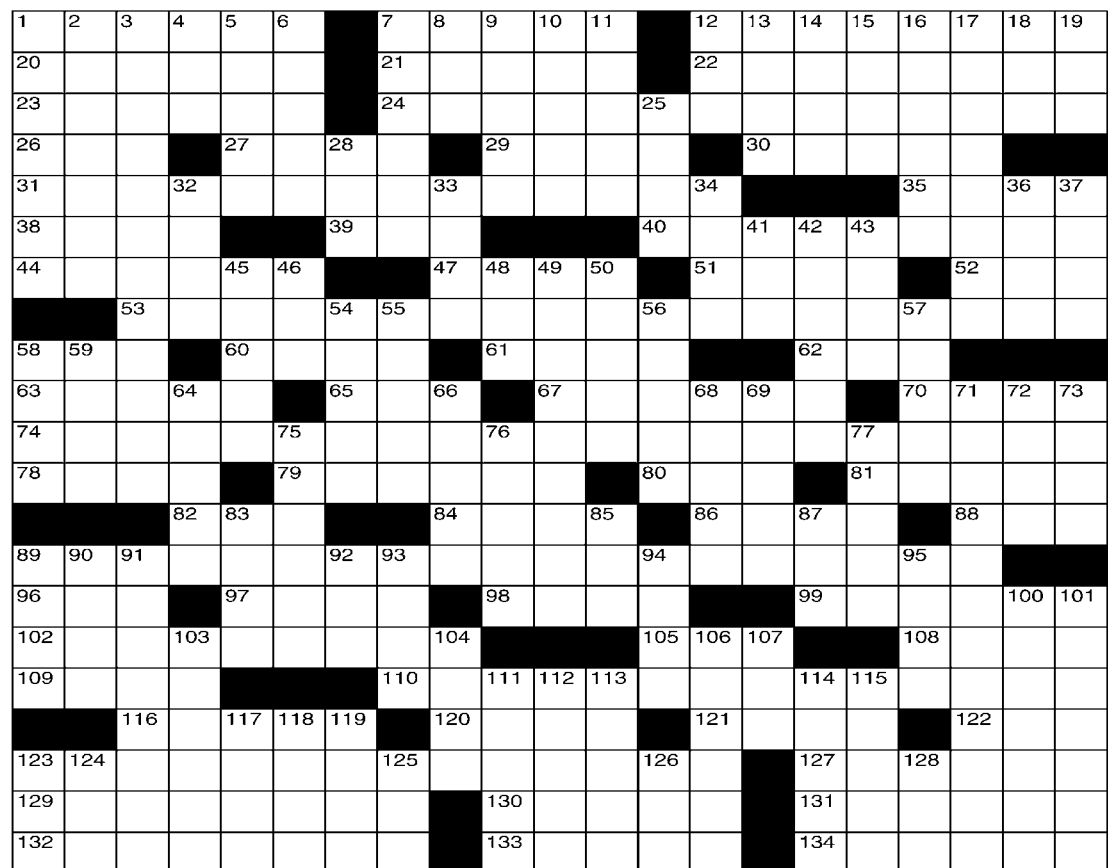

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## The Maxwell's Stay-at-Home Gourmet

### CHICKEN AND DUMPLINS

#### INGREDIENTS

- 1 cut-up whole chicken (3 to 3 1/2 lb.)
- 2 medium stalks celery (with leaves), cut up (about 1 cup) SAVE \$
- 1 medium carrot, sliced (1/2 cup) SAVE \$
- 1 small onion, sliced
- 2 tablespoons chopped fresh parsley or 2 teaspoons parsley flakes SAVE \$
- 1 teaspoon salt SAVE \$
- 1/8 teaspoon pepper SAVE \$
- 5 cups water
- 2 1/2 cups Original Bisquick™ mix SAVE \$
- 2/3 cup milk

#### DIRECTIONS

- Remove and discard excess fat from chicken. In 4-quart Dutch oven, place chicken, giblets (except discard liver) and neck. Add celery, carrot, onion, parsley, salt, pepper and water. Cover; heat to boiling; reduce heat. Simmer about 2 hours or until juice of chicken is clear when thickest part is cut to bone (at least 165°F).
- Remove chicken and vegetables from Dutch oven. Discard giblets and neck. Skim 1/2 cup fat from broth; reserve. Transfer broth to large bowl; reserve 4 cups (reserve remaining broth for another use).
- In Dutch oven, heat reserved 1/2 cup fat over low heat. Stir in 1/2 cup of the Bisquick mix. Cook and stir until mixture is smooth and bubbly; remove from heat. Stir in reserved 4 cups broth. Heat to boiling, stirring constantly. Boil and stir 1 minute. Add chicken and vegetables; reduce heat to low. Heat about 20 minutes or until hot.
- In medium bowl, stir remaining 2 cups Bisquick mix and the milk with wire whisk or fork until soft dough forms. Drop dough by spoonfuls onto hot chicken mixture (do not drop directly into liquid). Cook uncovered over low heat 10 minutes. Cover and cook 10 minutes longer.

## Brokenness vs. Breakingness

I watched a man step out of a situation where he was being hammered daily. His walk with Christ had become a ritualized routine. His life resembled life in the matrix, where one has to turn off expectations and find a place in the world created by someone else. In the matrix, it's usually at least a normal life. This was darker, more suffocating. He was broken. In his brokenness he left and found simple freedom. I'm not talking about someone leaving a family on a whim or just flipping a switch and doing a 180 away from a job without reason. He was betrayed and lonely, and reminded daily how little he deserved grace. In his broken state, he breathed deep and has started coming back to life. Like a person turned blue from a choking hazard, it was then removed. His color is returning and he has responded in gratitude and grace. I admire the guy, as I know firsthand how difficult that scene is. I know another who has always felt betrayed, but whose broken condition became a staging ground for breaking others. It seems he wants to share the "wealth" he has acquired, a pile of anger, resentment and hate. He is experiencing what I call "breakingness". I know it isn't a real word, but I promise you it's a real condition.

There are really only two basic responses to suffering: relinquish-

ment or retaliation. Relinquishment means giving up your desire to be in the right, to gain a foothold in controlling another, to forgive even when you can't forget. It is not easy, but it will change your life. Relinquishment means you place your worth in Christ, not what someone else thinks of you. Truly giving up the desire for harm to come to another. It is not easy or passive, but an active, daily exercise. Our hearts and minds eventually change. Though God sometimes removes the hurt of offenses, he often allows us to work through those emotions. The first man I mentioned left a place where he was reminded daily of the person he was imagined to be. He is going to a place of gentle reliance and assurance of God's view of him.

Relinquishment is not giving up your rights to be human and allowing someone to abuse you. Relinquishment is not staying in or walking back to a situation where you are unsafe, battered or constantly abused. Relinquishment means you trust God to do what you are unable to do. There may be some situations you relinquish to God for hopes of resolution. It is an attitude of human inability in the face of great duress, acknowledging that you are powerless to bring good from the bad. God, on the other hand, can and does do that. It is not without great pain

and endurance, it is, however, with great and lasting reward.

Breakingness repays the hurt on a human level, often with over-compensating strength. It seeks to cause hurt in hopes of feeling better about our own pain. It's a broken person who stores hurt in a container for quick access. When someone slights this person, they open up the container enough to obliterate the threat. It may be real or perceived offenses, there is no difference in the mind of the retaliative party.

If God re-paid us for our offenses toward Him and those he calls His children, we would never stand. Not a single one of us would be left. Even God chose to relinquish his rightful repayment to us. Instead, he dealt the emotion an eternal blow to his own Son. May we reach for that level of relinquishment in our own lives.

"For since our friendship with God was restored by the death of his Son while we were still his enemies, we will certainly be saved through the life of his Son" (Romans 5:10, NLT).

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## Brighten Your Grandchildren's Financial Future

Mother's Day and Father's Day may get more attention, but National Grandparents Day, observed on Sept. 10, has gained in popularity. If you're a grandparent, you might expect to receive some nice cards, but if you want to make the day especially meaningful, you may want to consider giving some long-lasting financial gifts to your grandchildren.

What might come to mind first, of course, is helping your grandchildren pay for college. You can choose from several college savings vehicles, but you may be especially interested in a 529 savings plan. With a 529 plan, your earnings accumulate tax free, provided they are used for qualified higher education expenses, such as tuition, books, and room and board. (Keep in mind that 529 plan distributions not used for qualified expenses may be subject to federal and state income taxes and a 10% IRS penalty on the earnings.) You may be eligible for a state income tax incentive for contributing to a 529 plan. Check with your tax advisor regarding these incentives, as well as all tax-related issues pertaining to 529 plans.

One benefit of using a 529 plan is contribution limits are quite generous. Plus, a 529 plan is flexible: If your grandchild decides against college, you can transfer the plan to another beneficiary.

Generally, a 529 plan owned by a grandparent won't be reported as an asset on the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), but withdrawals from the plan are treated as untaxed income to the beneficiary (i.e., your grandchild) — and that has a big impact on financial aid, a much bigger impact than if the plan was listed as a parental asset. Beginning with the 2017-2018 academic year, however, FAFSA now requires families to report income from two years before the school year starts, rather than income from the prior calendar year. Consequently, it might be beneficial, from a financial aid standpoint, for you, as a grandparent, to start paying for college expenses from a 529 plan in the year in which your grandchild becomes a junior. Contact a financial aid professional about the potential financial aid impact of any gifts you're considering.

A 529 plan isn't the only financial gift you could give to your grandchildren. You might also consider giving them shares of stock, possibly held in a custodial account, usually known as an UTMA or UGMA account. One possible drawback: You only control a custodial account until your grandchildren reach the age of majority, at which time they can use the money for whatever they want, whereas distributions from a 529 savings plan must be used for qualified higher education expenses.

Still, your grandchildren might be particularly interested in owning the stocks contained in the custodial account — most young people enjoy owning shares of companies that make familiar products. And to further interest your grandchildren in a lifetime of investing, you may want to show them how a particular stock you've owned for decades has grown over time. Naturally, you'll also want to let them know that stocks can move up and down in the short term, and there are no guarantees of profits — but the long-term growth potential of stocks is still a compelling story.

You'd probably do whatever you could for your grandchildren — and with a smart financial gift, you can make a big difference in their lives.





"This building was needed years ago, but the county could not afford it. We are paying for this building with EMS budgetary fund reductions in overtime. The reduction came as a result of a change in personnel scheduling after reviewing other West Tennessee EMS operations. Basically, the EMS operation is funding their own facility. It is planned for them to be in the new center December 1 of this year."

Sain said the lack of space and poor condition of the building was also adding to the expenses of the department.

"The crews down there, it's their home away from home, working 24-hour shifts and they deserve better than what they've been in. They've been second fiddle as far as priorities go, but we made them a priority."

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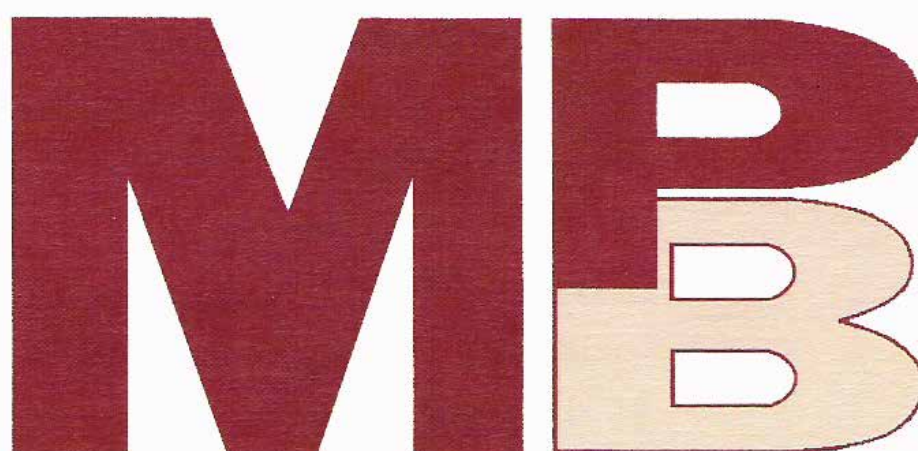

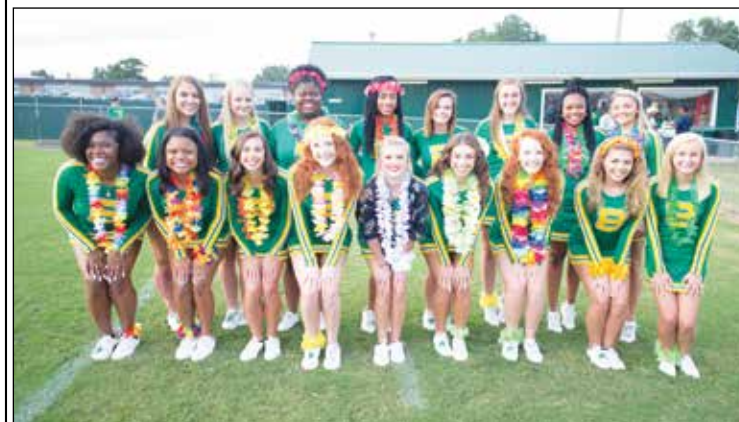

Starting at 7:00 a.m. from April through October, the farmers market pavilion is lined with vendors selling a large variety of home-grown and hand-crafted items including cuts of beef and freshly caught fish from the Tennessee River.

Lynda Jacobs, owner of Cedar Knoll Farm out of Hickory Valley has been farming fresh and natural Angus Beef for eight years. At the Bolivar Farmers Market, she offers grass fed Angus Beef in quarters, halves or wholes; roasts and steak cuts, ground beef and briskets, free of growth hormones or antibiotics.

Jacobs is preparing for the fall process of sorting out steers for next year. If you would like more information about Cedar Knoll Farm, call Jacobs at 731-697-8222.

Mitchell Fish Market owner and fisherman, Jeff Mitchell, catches between 500 - 1,200 lbs. of fish from the Tennessee River each fishing trip. For four years, Mitchell has been supplying the Bolivar

Farmers Market on Saturdays and sells on average around 400 lbs. of catfish and buffalo fish on most market days. Stop and see Mitchell at the Bolivar Farmers Market and stock up on fresh fish.

Meal starters can also include appetizers and salads that can be made with colorful fresh vegetables and fruits and you can complete the menu with side dishes and desserts made from the bounty that the Bolivar Farmers Market has to offer.

## Hardeman County Remembered by Lisa Coleman

I love long trips and day trips and side trips down country roads just to see where they take you. My family and I took marvelous, marvelous car trips when I was growing up. We would play games to pass the miles some days – spotting license plates or looking for specific objects or places. We would tune in the radio to the local stations and listen to country music or '50s music and hear the local news of wherever we were passing through. Local radio stations are great fun, and often gave us info on places to eat, or allowed us to play along with daily contests (to this day, I know, from a radio program somewhere in West Texas, that the three foods mentioned in Bobby Gentry's "Ode to Billy Joe" are biscuits, peas, and apple pie; and from another program I can also correctly spell Albuquerque, but I digress.)

Sometimes we would take Sunday afternoon drives where we would pick a direction and find out what's close by and why people come from somewhere to our own back yard to experience a place or event. One such place that was a popular tourist destination is long gone but provided days and weeks of enjoyment and restorative benefits to visitors and home folks for many, many years. The restorative and healing power of "the waters", especially spring waters, was a fashionable and popular destination during summers long past. In Hardeman County people would come to Dunlap Springs to "take the waters" and to rest and relax.

Dunlap Springs was located about three miles southeast from Bolivar, and an advertisement booklet from its heyday tells the reader that, "the drive from Bolivar to the springs is through forests as old as trees are anywhere, and sometimes for long distances the great boughs overlap each other, making a sylvan arcade that is a comfort in the hot days of summer, and always a delight to the traveler along the road." The springs were located along the Illinois Central Railroad line, which brought many visitors from "all across the South" to stay at the springs. The springs date back to



the days of the Native Americans in the area, who believed they were protected when they were near the waters. Many visitors went there until the Civil War came along, destroying the cabins and buildings near the springs. It remained vacant and forgotten for many years, until Mr. H. B. Paul purchased the area in 1893 and began to make improvements to the 300 acres, creating "almost a fairy land in beauty."

There were private cabins and cottages, a hotel, telegraph communication, a ten pin bowling alley, dining halls, billiard halls (for men and ladies) and miles of paths with wooden bridges crossing the streams (like the one shown in this photo). For \$7.00 per week, visitors could enjoy the "health and pleasure" of the springs. The booklet notes that diseases cured or eased by a visit to the springs included "diseases of the kidneys (all kinds), dyspepsia, liver complaints, blood poison, hay fever, nervous troubles (of all kinds), stomach troubles (of various forms), breakdowns from overwork, sores, sore eyes, female troubles", and numerous children's diseases that will turn them from "sickly, puny little things" to "fat, rosy, and strong, and ready to go through winter".

For those unable to get to the springs, Mr. Paul contracted with Mr. Max Beatus who became an agent for Dunlap Springs. Mr. Beatus received and dispensed water shipped daily from the springs to the folks in Memphis for 5 cents per glass or 25 cents per gallon jug. If you couldn't get to the springs, they'd bring the springs to you, along with, I'm sure, copies of the

little booklet to hopefully entice those city folk to journey to the country for the full benefits of the healing waters.

Pick a direction, take a drive, take a trip – far away or just in our own backyard. Enjoy the scenery and being with folks you love. See y'all out there on the open road.

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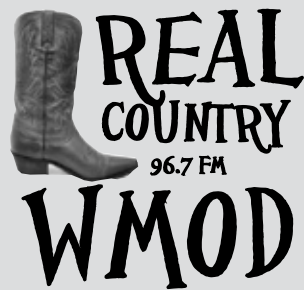
