I've interviewed quite a few people over the years on the radio and the results vary; sometimes the problem is me, sometimes it's them.

They have nicknames like "The King" and "The Honky Tonk Man." They are never stuck for an answer. They never say they don't know. They always know.

People argue about whether wrestling is fake or real. But wherever you land in this debate, you have to admit, the interviews are real. Real fun.

Hatchie River Park Hits Bottom

The City of Bolivar's original plans for the Hatchie River Park and Nature Center on Highway 18 North appeared dead in the water on April 24 as the Bolivar City Council voted to all but shut down the project in a special called meeting.

"I would like us to consider giving the grant back to the state and doing something else with the \$216,000 we budgeted," said Mayor Julian McTizic. "Otherwise, we have to come up with another \$142,000 to keep the project going."

The council debated the issue but finally voted to allow Mayor McTizic to ask the State of Tennessee to allow Bolivar to change the grant, but agreeing that if the state refused, the city would cut some of its losses and send the state \$23,378 to reimburse the grant for expenses already paid (half of \$46,757 used for signage, an engineering fee, and

a payment to the Southwest Tennessee Development District).

The vote was 7-1, with Councilwoman Suzanne Rhea voting against allowing the mayor the discretion in the matter.

A brief history:

- The land housed The Boat Dock, which operated as a bar until the owner sold the land and building to the City of Bolivar in 2014. The purchase was made with help from a grant from the state of Tennessee that required an agreement to make the area into a park. Bolivar's fifty percent share of the purchase was \$60,000.

- Early work on the project resulted in the Hatchie River Park being dedicated on October 17, 2015.

- In 2016, the Southwest Tennessee Development District voted the Hatchie River Park and Nature Center as the district's "Project of

the Year."

- A matching grant to expand the facility to include a museum and an outfitter location for boating and canoeing were approved by the state on June 28, 2017, when Mayor Barrett Stevens signed an agreement with the State of Tennessee for \$486,350. This took place two days before he left office, giving way to Mayor McTizic on July 1, 2017.

- The lone bid received by the city to complete the project was opened on April 24, 2018. It totaled \$608,600, which would require Bolivar to put \$142,000 more into the project. Brad Grantham of Grantham Construction offered ways to cut the cost of the project, such as eliminating the outfitter's hut, and was critical of TLM, who designed it. "They (TLM) didn't think this thing through," he said.

"They did not look at the land and the building for its best potential."

McTizic, while pointing out that although the project was something he inherited when he took office, said there was a chance for a moderately happy ending.

"We can make it a park without the grant. We can do something that we don't have to be accountable for to the state," he said, noting that if the city were to continue the project continuing to use the grant, they were bound by contract to fund its operating as a museum for the foreseeable future.

McTizic was fairly certain the state wouldn't be interested in allowing a change in the terms of the grant.

"We told them what we were going to do and they gave us the money to do it," he said. "They continued on A12"

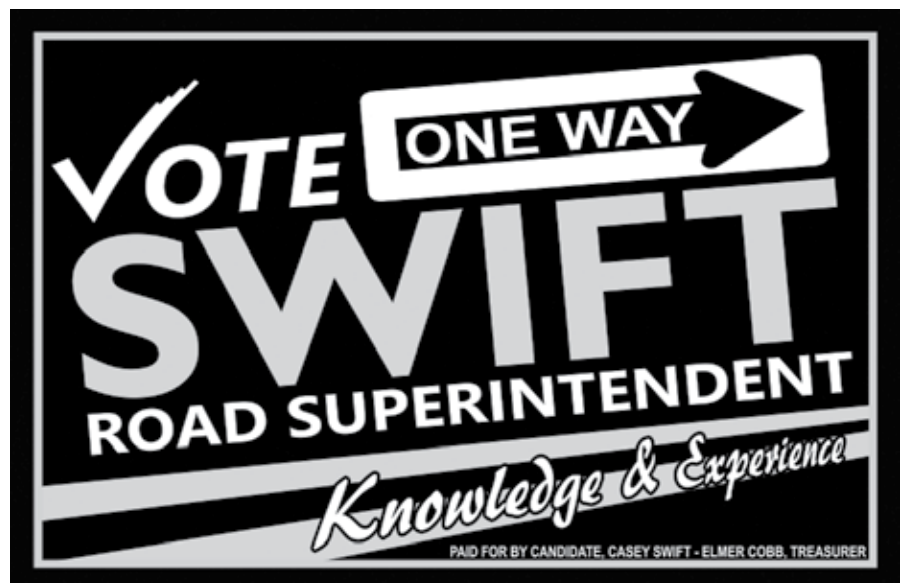

National Poetry Month was inaugurated by the Academy of American Poets in 1996.

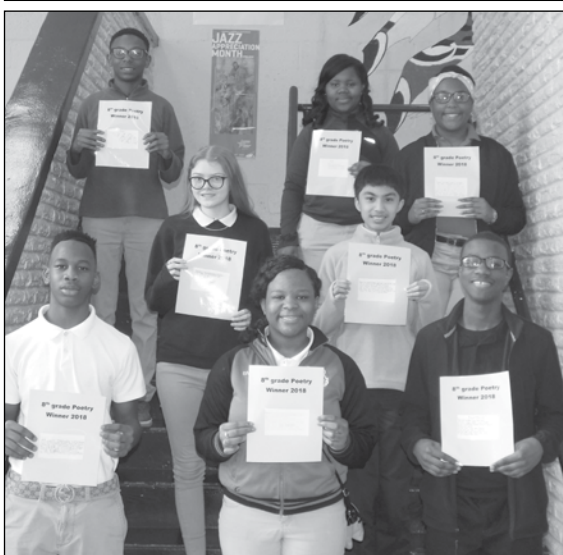
Over the years, it has become the largest literary celebration in the world with schools, publishers, libraries, booksellers, and poets demonstrating poetry's vital place in our culture.

Bolivar Middle School celebrated National Poetry Month in April by students in the 6th and 7th writing original concrete (shape) poems.

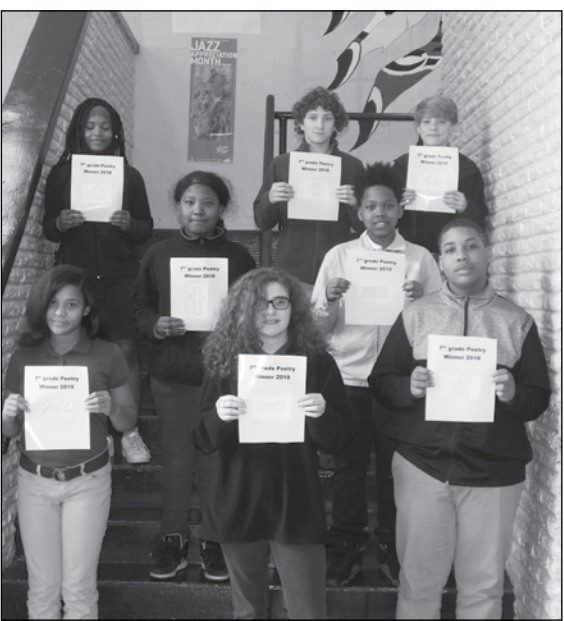
The 8th graders had choices of writing a Haiku, Cinquain, Limerick, or Free Verse poetry.

Hardeman County Remembered by Lisa Coleman

Four years ago this week I had one of the best things ever happen to me – my dachshund-girl, Elsie, came to live with me. We had a dog or two when I was growing up, but I had always wanted to raise a dog from a puppy, and Elsie fulfilled that wish; she chewed up a few things along the way, but that was part of our experience.

It was a rainy, April, spring Sunday afternoon when I went to pick her up. She was the dog-daughter of two of Susan English's dogs, Bella and Juno, and was part of a litter of four. Susan handed me the puppies (Elsie and a brother) and Elise immediately took a long look at me, gave me a big lick across my face as if to say, "yep, you'll do; you can be my person". I had not told anyone the name I picked out because I thought she should hear it first; that got me another big lick across the face.

She was a wee, tiny thing – just six weeks old and barely three pounds. She did well being away from her mamma and settled in right away to her new place. As I said, we learned a lot about what a little dog could chew up (her record was one 4-day stretch where she chewed up 3 dog beds, a pair of flip-flops, a section of my bottom kitchen cabinets, and 2 dog toys). I never knew how much stuffing was in one dog bed until Elsie "introduced" me to those facts.

Elsie came to me at a time when I was getting adjusted to new medications for my rheuma-



toid arthritis that made me quite sick for a few weeks. She always knew – and still does – when I wasn't feeling so well and needed extra puppy kisses and cuddles. She still has a very keen sense of when I am not feeling well, not able to move as quickly, and she sticks right with me; she will often get right in front of my face as if she is assessing me to be sure I am doing fine. She has been through surgeries with me and through the loss of my Mom, and has stayed right by my side during all of them.

Elsie reminds me every day of pure, unconditional love. She is always, always glad to see me whether I have been outside for 5 minutes or gone for hours. She is still curious about new things and tries to figure them out; she stands guard over our house, yard,

and street from her perch in the window. No squirrels, folks out walking, cars, children on bicycles, or any of those pesky birds go by our house without a hearty bark from her; she cannot understand why those birds will not stay out of "her" yard. She loves to play catch with me and does a pretty good job of it; she doesn't understand why she can't go under the sofa anymore and looks at me with a very puzzled expression whenever a stray ball or toy goes under there. She knows exactly where I keep her treats, and loves to cuddle with her face right up next to mine.

Y'all, I am grateful every day for this sweet, smart, sassy, silly, loving dachshund-girl who blesses my life, and I am forever thankful that Susan shared one of her Bella's babies with me.

even said no when we asked if we could change the roof from tin to shingles."

McTizic said the project was doomed from the start. "We didn't have enough money in the budget. It was never going to work."

McTizic added that if they continued with the grant, the entire project would have to be completed by June 1, 2019.

Prior to making the motion to allow McTizic the freedom to act on the city's behalf, Councilman Larry McKinnie said, "We need to tell the state we can't do it. Send them a check and let's do what we want to do. Build a park."

The Hatchie River, which runs diagonally through Hardeman County, is believed to be the only major river of West Tennessee that has never been impounded, channelized, or otherwise modified by human activity to any major degree.

All eight council members were present for the meeting.
