The Lake Project Update

Some questions on the Hardeman County Lake project might be paired with answers at the next meeting of the Hardeman County Commission on August 20 in the Hardeman County Courthouse. The meeting is scheduled to begin at 7:00 p.m.

Hardeman County Commissioner Bobby Wright's motion to hear an update on the lake project wasn't voted on during the July meeting, but Mayor Jimmy Sain intends to make good on the promise he made to the commission.

said Sain. "We are at the phase right now that we have chosen a site for study, but let me be clear,

we have not chosen a permanent site. We just had to have "a site" to have the study go forward."

The "site" being used for the study is Pleasant Run Creek.

The answers will come in the form of a letter from Laura Benz, an environmental attorney with the Benz Law Group of Newnan, GA. Each commissioner will get a copy, according to Sain.

Sain said while the money for the attorney comes from a \$150,000 grant from the State of Tennessee, the county had already spent approximately \$15,000 of an approved \$50,000 by the county commission when the state grant was eventually received.

The proposed lake is said to be approximately 3,500 acres.

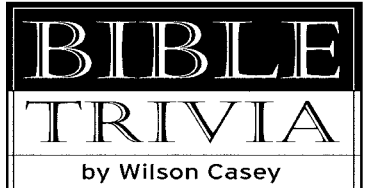

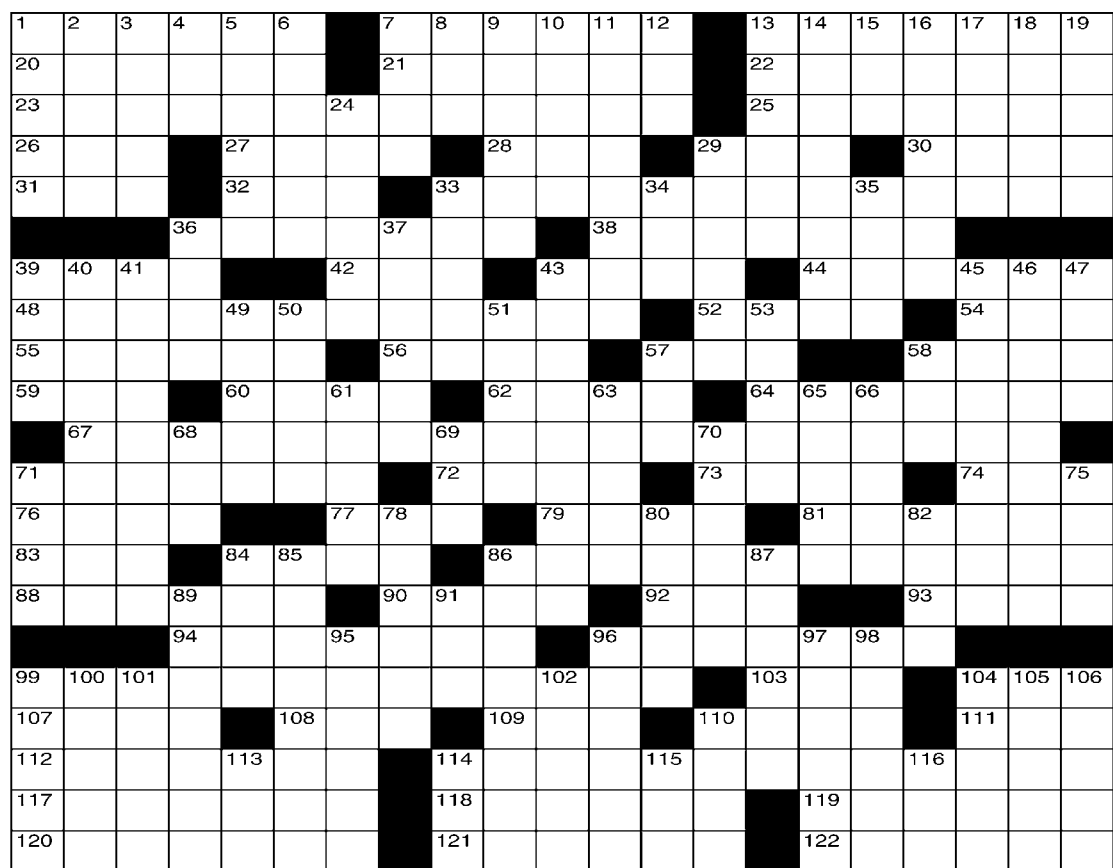

Grilled Turkey and Strawberry Salad

Ingredients

- 1 - 1 3/4 pound boneless turkey breast half
- 4 - 6 slices pancetta
- 15 ounce package fresh baby spinach
- 6 ounces dried cavatappi, gemelli or desired pasta
- 1 large yellow, red or orange sweet pepper, seeded and cut into bite-size strips
- 1 recipe Strawberry-Sherry Vinaigrette
- 2 cups fresh strawberries, halved
- 1/3 cup toasted pine nuts or other desired nuts

Directions

Remove skin from turkey, if present. Top with pancetta. Tie at 2-inch intervals with 100-percent-cotton kitchen string.

For a charcoal grill, arrange medium-hot coals around a drip pan. Test for medium heat above pan. Place turkey on grill rack over drip pan. Cover and grill for 45 to 55 minutes or until turkey is no longer pink (170 degrees F). (For a gas grill, preheat grill. Reduce heat to medium. Adjust for indirect cooking. Cover and grill as above.)

Spread spinach on a large serving platter. Cook pasta according to package directions; drain. Rinse with cold water to cool; drain again. In a large bowl combine pasta and sweet pepper. Add Strawberry-Sherry Vinaigrette; toss to coat. Spoon pasta mixture on top of spinach.

Slice turkey. Arrange turkey slices and strawberries on top of salad. Sprinkle with pine nuts.

TO MAKE AHEAD: Prepare as directed through Step 3, except do not spoon pasta mixture on top of spinach. Cover and chill turkey, spinach, and pasta mixture separately for up to 24 hours. To serve, spoon pasta mixture on top of spinach and continue as directed in Step 4.

SHORTCUT: Instead of preparing strawberry vinaigrette, use 3/4 cup bottled berry vinaigrette salad dressing in place of the Strawberry-Sherry Vinaigrette.

Grace, Part 2 by Jeff Capshaw

Part 1 of this series defined grace as a unique gift from God, given freely out of his abundance of love, kindness and goodness toward us. Therefore, it is impossible for anyone to earn God's grace, because no human being is worthy or capable of that.

God, of his own free will, gives sinners grace for the reasons mentioned above and no other; it is not even given to sinners for their unforeseen faith. Paul emphatically spells-out the unmerited nature of this grace in Ephesians 2:1-10 and elsewhere.

This week I will comment on the notion of calling as it relates to God's grace: first, in general, by noting the several different types of calling. Then, I will highlight three passages related to grace and calling. Calling in Scripture doesn't have a single meaning, and it isn't always palatable for some Christians, especially as it relates to salvation.

In the Bible, sometimes calling is when God calls or summons someone for a specific task, but at other times, it means called to salvation. Second, an "internal

call" is one that comes through the inner working of the Holy Spirit. Third, there is an "effectual call" that is efficacious or results in a favorable response by the one called. But what is the common thread running through all these callings? Clearly, it is God's grace.

For example, Paul writes, "I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel" (Galatians 1:6, ESV). The phrase "called you in grace," indicates the means by which the Galatians were brought to the Gospel of Christ; it was by grace.

Second, in Galatians 1:15, Paul writes "But when he who had set me apart before I was born, and who called me by his grace . . .". In the prior verse, Paul indicates that "I was advancing in Judaism beyond many of my own age among my people and was extremely zealous for the traditions of my fathers" (v. 14). Thus, he was just going about his religious business but suddenly was stopped in his tracks (See Acts

The store was originally just called Maxwell’s until the mid sixties when they partnered with Big Star, a corporation out of Memphis, but it was still locally owned.

Twenty-seven years later the store continued to stay in the family when Jimmy and Doug Maxwell purchased it from their family in 1987.

Over the years the store grew from a little corner grocery store where you entered where the window that faces the corner of main street to the store that you see today.

Maxwell’s has survived many changes throughout the years in this little community, especially when Walmart moved to their current location.

Stores like Creekmore’s Save-A-Lot, and Sunflower closed down but Maxwell’s stood strong.

But in July, Maxwell’s was sold to Food Giant, allowing the Maxwell brothers to retire after more than 50 years of serving the community.

If you were to ask anyone in Bolivar, someone will have a fond memory about the store.

Glenn Yarbough says “my favorite is the visits with Doug and Jimmy that usually took place when I ran into in the aisles while they were working. No matter when I went there, I always had a good visit with someone I knew, I will miss that!”

I know my feeling when I walked into the store I was always welcomed by one of the cashiers, greeted by either Jimmy or Doug with a warm handshake, and felt welcomed there and felt comfortable shopping there and knew I could always find what I was looking for.

Many people shared how they will miss seeing the Maxwell family and the big support that they given our community.

“The Maxwell family have served our community well for generations. They have supported our events, schools and churches throughout the years. Hardeman County thanks them and I wish them the best with their retirements” said Hardeman County Mayor Jimmy Sain.

Many people have come and gone who have worked there throughout the years. I know for me that place will always hold a special place in my heart, as they were the first to give me a job outside of my family’s business.

From seeing Mrs. Anne at the customer service desk, Mrs. Kathy busy making sandwiches in the deli, Rick going over the meat order, Mrs. Janet filling the Coke machines, Mrs. Diane closing out registers, or Jimmy and Doug walking around the store to make sure the shelves were full, there was always a familiar feel to what was taking place.

The store lost two great people that were a cornerstone to the business. Mrs. Jewel and Bobby Russell both passed away while they were managers of the store and they both have been dearly missed shown by their pictures that hung above Doug’s desk in the office.

With the sale now complete and some remodeling Maxwell’s is now Food Giant. Doug talked about the history of the store and their appreciation for the community.

“We want to thank our community for shopping and supporting our store over the years. We had some of the kindest people as regular shoppers there. They are the ones that kept us in business over the decades. And we also want to thank our employees for their loyalty and service they provided to our customers and to us each day.”

Business Owners: You Need Your Own Retirement Plan

Alternatively, you could contribute 2 percent of each eligible employee's compensation each year, up to a maximum of \$5,600, regardless of whether the employee contributes. Contributions to your employees are tax deductible.

"Owner-only" 401(k) plan: If you have no employees other than your spouse, you can establish an "owner-only" 401(k) plan, which functions similarly to a 401(k) plan offered by a large employer. Between salary deferral and profit sharing, you can contribute up to \$56,000, in pre-tax dollars, to your owner-only 401(k), or \$62,000 if you're 50 or older. Like a SEP-IRA and SIMPLE IRA, a 401(k) provides the potential to accumulate tax-deferred earnings. However, you could choose to open a Roth 401(k), which can be funded with after-tax dollars. With a Roth 401(k), your earnings can grow tax-free, provided you've had your account at least five years and you don't start taking withdrawals until you're at least 59-1/2.

Which plan is right for you? The answer depends on several factors, such as whether you have any employees and how much money you can contribute each year. But all the plans mentioned above are generally easy to establish, and the administrative costs are usually minimal. Most important, any one of them can help you build some of the resources you'll need to enjoy the retirement lifestyle you've envisioned. To select an appropriate plan, you may want to consult with your tax and financial advisors.



In any case, don't wait too long. Time goes by quickly, and when you reach that day when you're a "former" business owner, you'll want to be prepared.

Stuff You Need for Kindergarten by Carolyn Tomlin

A colleague tells of registering a 5-year-old for kindergarten and asking the basic questions on the form. Before she can finish, the mother tells her son, "Say your ABCs and show the teacher how smart you are." With a bright smile, and to the delight of his mother, the boy sings the "ABC Song".

In another kindergarten, a mother brings in a crying child each morning, stating that her daughter has had an upset stomach--again. (This problem has occurred five days in a row). By the second week, the father brings the child to kindergarten and without a doubt, the youngest appears fine. No upset stomach... no crying. The mother can't handle her "baby" starting to school--and the child doesn't want to disappoint her mother--therefore, she cries.

One activity that helps prepare a young child to start school is to "pretend" or "play like." Use this time as a first experience. Then, when it's really time to know what to do, it's like the second time around. These activities will make going to school a bit easier.

(1) Teaching Left and Right

Why teach left and right? This skill is necessary for pre-reading and pre-writing skills. Both subjects begin on the left side of the paper or page and proceed to the right.

What is the best way to help a child learn left and right? Young children learn best when learning is fun. Therefore, use games such as the following:

- Play "Simon Says." Stand with you back to your child so modeling is easy. Call out left and right body parts.
- Play "Follow-the-Leader." Cut out colorful footprints and tape them to the floor in a walking pattern. Sing a marching song, calling

out "left-right, left-right."

(2) Opening and Carrying Objects

Simple activities such as opening a box of milk make those first days easier. Prior to beginning school, purchase several small boxes of milk or juice. Point out the arrow on the top. Say: The arrow shows where the box opens. First, pull on this flap. Next, pop up the top. Now, you try it.

(3) Carrying a Lunch Tray

First, practice walking with an empty tray. Demonstrate that both hands must support each side. Hold the tray at waist level, near the body. Add a plastic place setting and a carton of milk. Practice walking and keeping everything balanced. Emphasize "walking" in the school cafeteria--never running. Remind children to pick up everything as she goes through the line. This keeps bumping into others at a minimum. Does your school use divided trays? If not, suggest that a parent-teacher organization furnish those to lower grades.

(4) Develop a Child's Cutting Skills

Scissors are necessary for cutting and craft projects. Teach children to use them correctly.

- Walk, never run when holding scissors. Hold points down when walking. Never point them at others. Keep points out of mouth.
- Provide scissors that actually cut, not tear, paper. Plastic ones only frustrate young children.
- First, hold the paper for the child to cut.
- Model cutting on the line. Show, instead of tell.
- Next, draw large circles for cutting. Move to geometric shapes.
- After mastering shapes, move to more difficult patterns.

- Offer praise and support for small accomplishments.
- Build confidence by displaying work for family and friends.

Kindergarten sets the stage for a child's entire school career. Children who make a successful transition from home to school grow into more capable, confident, and enthusiastic learners.

Changes in Hardeman County Bus Routes

Hardeman County Schools is making some changes in our bus routes for the 2019-2020 school year. Below are the schools and routes that will be affected. We ask that you review this information carefully and call us at 731-658-3444 if you have any questions about which bus your student will be riding and the approximate time for pick up in the mornings. We also ask that you be patient with our drivers as we implement these changes to our routes. These changes are also posted on the district website at: www.hardemancountyschools.org Thank you.

Below are changes in bus routes for the Toone and Bolivar zones that may impact your students.

- Buses #1 and #5 are being eliminated.
- Bus #31 will pick up current route plus students zoned for Toone on Pine Top, Harris and Isaac Jordan Roads
- Bus #9 will cease to pick up on McNeal Street, which runs in front of the Columns. Bus #9 will pick up Hwy 125 North, Fitts-Ross Rd, Ebenezer Rd, Hwy 100 toward Bolivar from Pine Top Rd, Naylor Rd and Cloverport Rd, which are zoned for Bolivar. Bus #9 will continue to pick up students on Main Street, entering Bolivar on Hwy 18 North. This includes most of Bus #1's old route.
- Bus #58 will cease to pick up on Elmview Street. Bus #58 will pick up the rest of its current route, adding McNeal Street, Madison Street, Butler Street, West Jackson Street and the area around Bolivar Municipal Center, North Washington Street and the area around the Bolivar Library. These areas include parts of Bus #1's and Bus #9's route in Bolivar.
- Bus #60 - Current Route and add Elmview Street, which is off of Sain Rd.
- Bus #6 will keep current route and will add Walton Road and Vildo Road, between Old Hwy 64 and New Hwy 64. Bus #6 will not pick up students north of New Hwy 64. These are students that were a part of bus #5's and bus #13's old routes.
- Bus #13 will no longer pick up on Vildo road between Old Hwy 64 and New Hwy 64, the area beside/ behind the Hardeman County Fairgrounds and will no longer pick up on Jackson Street or Lee Street. Bus #13 will pick up all of Vildo Road, north of New Hwy 64, and Walton Road, North of Hwy 64. This is part of Bus #5's old route. In addition, Bus #13 will pick up on Pleasant Creek Lane, which is across from Joe's Restaurant.
- Bus #11 will continue its current route and add Jackson St. and Lee St.
- Bus #25 will cease to pick up students behind Jervis, Young Road and Roger Avenue. Bus #25 will pick up all students in the Country Club Area, including Hines Blvd, Stevens Road, Lucy Black Rd, Nuckolls Rd, Janet Rd, Blue Bonnet Ln, Karen Drive and El Capitan. This includes parts of Bus #5's old route
- Bus #56 will pick up all students for BCHS, BES & BMS on Tate Rd, Young Rd and Roger Avenue, including all the area behind Jervis.

Below are changes in bus routes for the Grand Junction zone that may impact your students.

- Buses #18 and #53 are being eliminated.
- Bus #61 will pick up the area around Grand Junction Elementary School, west side of Grand Junction, area around the Grand Junction Library, west of Grand Junction on Hwy 57, Hwy 18 to Hwy 368, Hwy 368, area around CO-OP, Smith Drive and Holder Road.
- Bus #41 will pick up in Saulsbury, south of College Street, Indian Creek Road and Park Swain Road.
- Bus #42 will pick up the area on and around Van Buren Road from Lake Hardeman Road to Hwy 57 in Saulsbury. Bus #42 will not pick up/drop off on Hwy 57.
- Bus #45 will pick up on Hwy 18 South to Hwy 368 and will pick up on the roads adjoining Hwy 18 between Hickory Valley and Hwy 368, which are zoned for Grand Junction and/or Middleton High School.
- Bus #47 will pick up all students on Hwy 57, who are zoned for Grand Junction Elementary/Middleton High School and live in the Grand Junction Zone.
- Bus #19 will pick up students on College Street, Sparkman Road, Smith Road, April Subdivision, Greenville Subdivision and other adjoining roads between Saulsbury and Grand Junction.
- All Students will transfer at Grand Junction Elementary School at 7:15 AM.
- Buses #19, #45 and #47 will transfer students to Middleton High School.
- High School students from Bus #42 will transfer to Bus #19, Bus #41 will transfer to Bus #45 and Bus #61 will transfer to #47.

Below are changes in bus routes for the Middleton zone that may impact your students.

- Buses #20 and #26 are being eliminated.
- Bus #43 & #48 will continue to pick up students from Bus #26, as they picked up for the 2018-2019 school year.
- Bus #21 will pick up all students from Buses #20 and #21 on Hwy 57 toward Pochontas and the Pochontas area.
- Bus #21 will no longer pick up between the railroad tracks and Middleton Elementary School.
- Bus #27 will pick up/drop off students between Middleton Elementary School and the railroad tracks, Pinecrest Lane and Southwest Lane.

Below are changes in bus routes for the Whiteville zone that may impact your students.

- Buses #35 and #46 are being eliminated.
- Bus #59 will pick up all students south of Whiteville Elementary School, including Whiteville-Newcastle Road. Bus #59 will no longer pick up/drop off North of Hwy 64.

- Bus #54 will pick up all students north of Whiteville on Hwy 179 and the adjoining roads, past Mt. Moriah Street.
- Buses #16 and #50 will transfer students to Bolivar Central High School.
