Councilman Joy Charged in Fayette Co.

Bolivar City Councilman Jonathan Joy faces allegations of Home Improvement Services Fraud and Theft of Property from \$10,000-\$60,000 in Fayette County.

Joy, who operates a heating and air conditioning business based in Bolivar, was released on a \$25,000 bond at 12:30 p.m. on December 3. His intake time was listed as 9:30 a.m., according to the Fayette County Sheriff's Department.

Joy was indicted by the Grand Jury during the November Term 2019 on a charge of allegedly "delivering or installing a two ton HVAC unit while charging Millard Buruss of Arlington, TN, for three and four ton HVAC units as quoted in the contract, in violation of T.C.A. 39-14-154, against the peace and dignity of the State of Tennessee."

In the second count, Joy is said to "unlawfully, feloniously, and knowingly obtain or exercise control over property belonging to Millard Buruss and First Citizens



tween \$10,000 and \$60,000, without the effective consent of Millard Buruss and First Citizens Bank with the intent to deprive Millard Buruss and First Citizens Bank thereof, in violation of T.C.A. 39-14-103, against the peace and dignity of the State of Tennessee."

Joy is alleged to have committed these offenses between December 1, 2018 and July 1, 2019.

The next step in the case was not available at press time.

Joy was elected to Bolivar City Council in 2017, defeating incumbent Willie McKinnie and Raven Taylor, winning 45% of the vote.

Whiteville Board Asks for Dispatch Quote

The plan to create a separate county dispatch stalled a bit on Monday, December 2, when the Whiteville Board of Alderman declined to give approval to the plan, instead asking for a specific dollar amount before they vote to cost share with other municipalities in the county.

Currently, the costs for county dispatch are shared by the 911 District, the county, and the City of Bolivar. The plan put forth by Hardeman County Mayor Jimmy Sain to the mayors in attendance at the November 25 meeting of the Hardeman County Joint Economic and Community Development Board meeting asked for Toone, Hickory Valley, Middleton, Grand Junction, Hornsby, and Whiteville to decide how to split up the rest, which is approximately \$37,950 per year, to have the service county-wide.

"We need to pay something for the service," said Whiteville Mayor Aubrey Phillips. "But the aldermen want to know how much before they vote."

Central dispatch in Hardeman County was created in 2011 and the responsibility for such lies under the direction of Hardeman County Sheriff John Doolen. If an agreement is reached among the mayors, the 911 board, appointed by Sain and approved by the county commission, would be the responsible agency.

Sain said at the meeting that any municipality that does not wish to agree to pay would have to begin providing their own dispatch.


Bolivar Rotary Donates to Worthy Cause





Advent: Week 1 by Jeff Capshaw

The prayers of Paul were the topic for the last three columns and to which we may return, after the Christmas season. For this and the next three weeks' columns, however, the Gospel readings of the liturgical calendar will provide direction.

When this month's columns go to print, each Sunday of Advent will have passed. However, if readers desire a schedule to follow the liturgical calendar during this Advent season, then search for an online version (e.g.): "Revised Common Lectionary of the Vanderbilt Divinity Library."

As a reminder, "Advent is a season observed in many Christian churches as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for both the celebration of the Nativity of Jesus at Christmas and the return of Jesus at the Second Coming." The term Advent comes from the Latin word adventus, a translation of the Greek word parousia, referring to the Second Coming of Jesus (Wikipedia).

The Gospel reading for the First Sunday of Advent (December 1) was Matthew 24:36-44, and the theme is the Second Coming of Christ. Matthew quotes Jesus as saying, "but concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only. For as were the days of Noah, so will be the coming of the Son of Man" (vv. 36-37).

In addition to quashing datesetting for the return of Christ, this passage has led some to question Jesus' omniscience (all-knowing). However, Christ here refers to himself as the Son of God and above the angels. Somehow, then, in the mystery of the Trinity's internal dialogue, the timing of the Second Coming is the Father's prerogative.

The real point here is the element of surprise, thus the reference to the "days of Noah." People were going about their business: eating and drinking, marrying and so one, but "they were unaware until the flood came and swept them all away, so will be the coming of the Son of Man" (v. 39). Thus, at the Second Coming, some will be mindlessly going about their business, instead of staying awake in anticipation and

readiness . . . "for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming" (v. 42).

Jesus further illustrates this lack of expectation and readiness for his Second Coming with a short parable. He said, "but know this, that if the master of the house had known in what part of the night the thief was coming, he would have stayed awake and would not have let his house be broken into" (v. 43).

Indeed, Christmas is about the Birth of Christ, his First Coming. However, God's plan for the complete redemption and renewing of all creation cannot be finalized, until Christ does return in a second time in His Glory. "Therefore, you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect" (v. 44). That too is our blessed Hope during this Advent Insurance Costs Too High? **Just Turning 65?**
