McCartney Claims He Was Misunderstood

A MADE UP STORY FROM SOMEWHERE IN ENGLAND -- Former Beatle Sir Paul McCartney says they really didn't mean it when they wrote the song "All You Need Is Love", but it was so catchy they decided to go with it.

"We knew you needed more than that," he offered. "But when we saw the piles of money that we could make from it, we decided to just go for it. It worked out."

Not that anyone is complaining. Released in July, it went gold by September that year and charted number one on more than 10 rankings

and more than a half dozen countries. Only Belgium (#4) and Italy (#10) didn't have it go to the top of the charts in their country.

"Well, I guess the Italians need pasta and I have no idea what people from Belgium eat. Waffles, I guess," said Mick Larring of Truth in Lyrics Magazine. "The rest is lyrical history."

Twenty years later, three of the remaining Beatles were asked if indeed, "All You Need is Love." Only George Harrison said yes.

The History of St. Valentine's Day

The ideas abound...here are a few...

The Romans

Historians trace the origin of Valentine's Day to ancient Roman Empire. It is said that in the Rome of ancient times people observed a holiday on February 14th to honor Juno - the Queen of Roman Gods and Goddesses. The Romans also regarded Juno as the Goddess of Women and Marriage.

Defiance by Saint Valentine

The pairing of young boys and girls did set the mood of the Valentine's Day Festival as we know today. But it was actually due to the efforts and daring of a priest St Valentine that the festival got its name and clearer meaning. The story goes that during the reign of Emperor Claudius II Rome was involved in several bloody and unpopular campaigns. Claudius found it tough to get soldiers and felt the reason was men did not join army because they did not wish to leave their wives and families. As a result Claudius cancelled all marriages and engagements in Rome. A romantic at heart priest of Rome Saint Valentine defied Claudius's unjustified order. Along with Saint Marius, St Valentine secretly married couples. When his defiance was discovered, Valentine was brutally beaten and put to death on February 14, about 270 AD. After his death Valentine was named a Saint.

According to another version of legend, Valentine was killed because he attempted to help Christians escape from the Roman prison as they were being tortured and beaten there. Yet another popular version of the legend states that while in prison Valentine or Valentinus fell in love with jailer's daughter who visited him during confinement. Before his death Valentine wrote a farewell letter to his sweetheart from the jail and signed 'From your Valentine'. The expression became quite popular amongst the love struck and is still very much in vogue.

By the Middle Ages, Valentine assumed the image of heroic and romantic figure amongst the masses in England and France. Around 498 AD, Pope Gelasius declared February 14 as St. Valentine's Day.

Beginning of Birds Mating Season

During the Middle Ages, people in England and France held a belief that birds started to look for their mate from February 14. This popular notion further helped to link Valentine's Day - celebrated in the middle of the February, with love and romance. Over the period of time, St Valentine became the patron saint of lovers and they began to celebrate Valentine's Day as a day of romance by exchanging love notes and simple gifts such as flowers. County to Name Bridge for Jeter

Lifelong Hardeman County resident Cecil Wilson Jeter, Jr., will have his name placed on the Hatchie River Bridge to honor and celebrate his years of service to the United States Army in the Vietnam War and to Hardeman County.

A unanimous vote by the Hardeman County Commission in January sent the request to the State of Tennessee for approval by the legislature and Governor Bill Lee.

Jeter, assigned to the 4th and 39th Battalion of the 9th Infantry as a 19-year old in 1968, was promoted to Sergeant and

over his tour earned four Bronze Stars, three Air Medals, four Army Commendation Medals, a Purple Heart, a Silver Star, a National Defense Medal, a Sharpshooter (rifle m-14) Medal, Expert (rifle m-14) Medal, First Class Gunner (machine gun M60) Medal, Vietnam Service Medal, and the Combat Infantryman Badge. He is one of Tennessee's most decorated Vietnam Veterans.

"I'm very proud that the commission is honoring Cecil with this resolution. He has served his county and country brave-

Movie Review: The Lego Movie

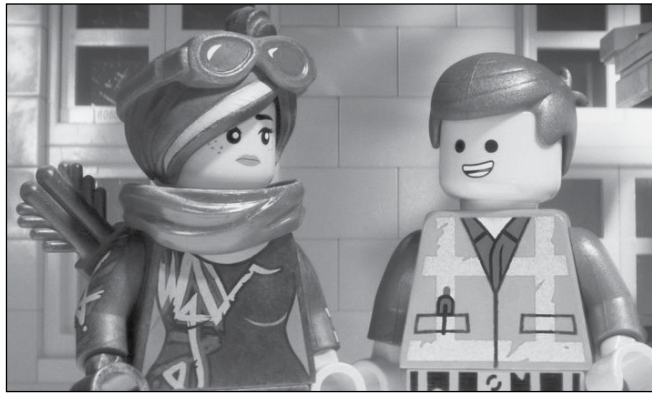
It's all fun and games until the apocalypse.

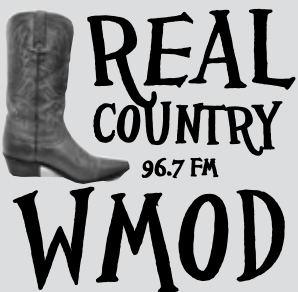

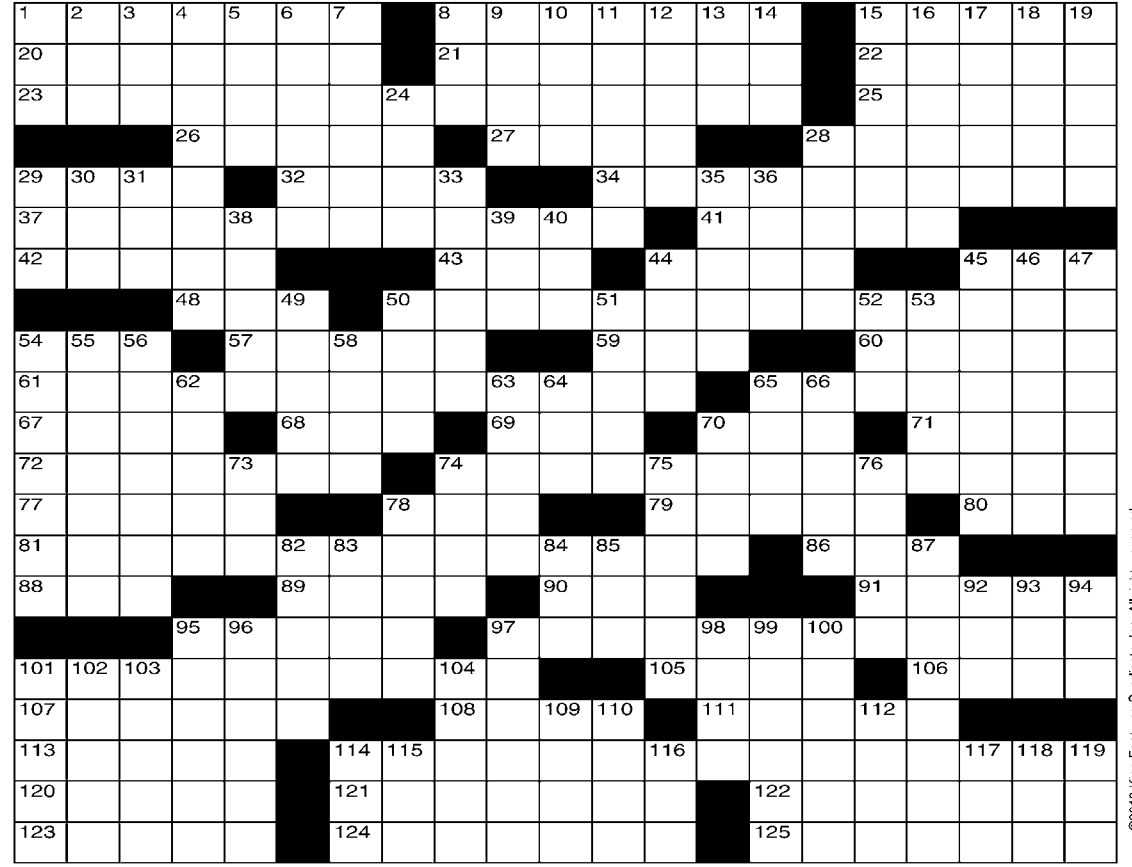

Are You Prepared for a Natural Disaster?

The year ahead offers new opportunities and experiences. But as you make plans throughout 2019, be mindful of the things that can derail those plans – such as the natural disasters that affected so many families in 2018. Every area around the country is subject to natural disasters, whether they're wildfires, hurricanes or tornadoes. How can you prepare for them?

Here are a few suggestions:

Maintain adequate insurance. It's a good idea to review your homeowners insurance at least annually to ensure it's still providing the protection you need. And make sure you know exactly what your policy covers in terms of natural disasters. You'll also want to review your life and disability insurance regularly. But you may still have some items, such as checkbooks, birth certificates, passports, Social Security cards, insurance policies and estate planning documents (i.e., will, living trust, etc.) on paper. Even if some or all of these things could eventually be replaced, it would take time and effort. You're better off protecting them beforehand, possibly by keeping them in a safety deposit box at a local bank.

Save your receipts. You'll want to save receipts for repairs and temporary lodging to submit to your insurance company. If you are not fully reimbursed for these expenses, they may be tax deductible, though you'll need to consult with your tax advisor to be certain.

If you're fortunate, you'll never have to face a natural disaster that threatens your home and possessions. But it never hurts to be ready – just in case.

Ames Plantation...Not Just for the Birds by Bill Stone

And it wasn't always the Ames Plantation. In fact the land base occupied by the present plantation includes land initially owned by over a dozen early planters. Production of cotton was the main business of these plantation owners. From the 1830's until the Civil War this cotton based economy thrived. Thousands of acres were cleared and planted. With the end of the war also came the end of the cotton plantation tradition. There was a shift to share cropping which continued through the rest of the century.

The history of the plantation's main location began in 1826 with the arrival of the John Walker Jones family. They built a two story log cabin and established "Cedar Grove Plantation". Two decades later in 1847, the manor house was built. The family's new home was an ell-shaped, two story manor. Far more spacious and comfortable than the original log cabin, their new home was a material reflection of their success as cotton producers over the previous two decades.

It was not until a little over 50 years later, in 1901, the home was acquired by Hobart and Julia Ames. A wealthy industrialist, Ames was owner of a half dozen plants scattered mostly across the eastern portion of the United States. His company's main products were tool handles. He purchased the plantation as a retreat, a place to entertain



friends and hunt quail.

Ames made significant changes to the original home including the addition of a wing to accommodate servants. Early on he added electricity and a kerosene furnace which heated water for a heating system. Since those early days little else has been changed.

Ames' original purchase was the home plus 400 acres of land. Over the years he acquired additional land until the final tally prior to his death reached 26,000 acres. Under his ownership the plantation operated as a hunting preserve, cattle operation, and cotton plantation. The Ames' visited about two months per year generally arriving in late December and departing in early March. The day to day operation was managed by an overseer.

Initially focusing on cotton production, in 1913 Ames ventured into raising Angus cattle. This

operation is ongoing and today is recognized as the fourth oldest registered herd in the United States. Its leading bloodline stock makes breeding age bulls and replacement females available to the public.

The first National Field Trial was run in 1896 near West Point Mississippi. Later trials were held south of Grand Junction Tennessee and finally found a permanent home at Ames Plantation in 1916. Each running since has been on 6,000 acres of "hallowed ground" set aside by Ames specifically for that purpose. He served many years as the President and a judge of the National Championship.

The annual National Field Trial may be the best, and to many, the only, known activity at Ames Plantation. In fact, it's only one of many other important and widely various projects ongoing there year round.

ly. His military service is truly heroic. His military commendations at the age of 19 are amazing," said Hardeman County Mayor Jimmy Sain.

Jeter was wounded during a firefight and received shrapnel to the neck and face from a bomb. Jeter refused medical attention until he got his unit evacuated from the area.

Upon returning home, Jeter served as a member of the Tennessee National Guard, was a Bolivar Firefighter for 27 years, was Hardeman County Sheriff for eight years.

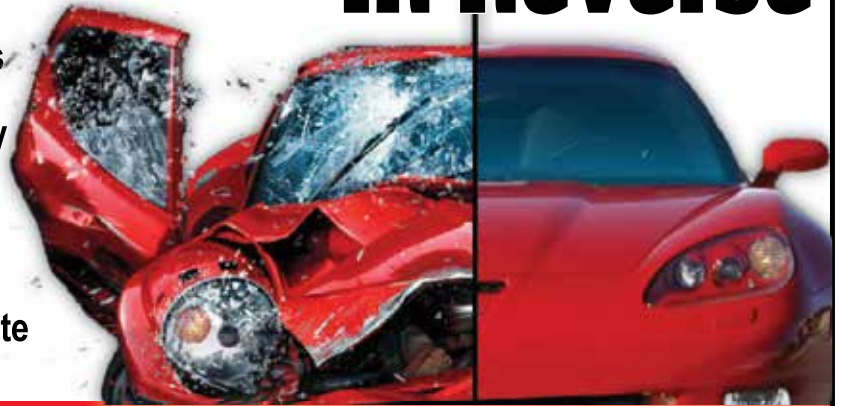
