Land that has been in private hands since the 1940's will go up for absolute public auction on February 15 in Whiteville.

"There is over 7,500 feet of land on Highway 64 alone," explained Lynn Jackson of Lynn Jackson Auctions and Real Estate. "If Whiteville is going to expand, this is the land that could be used. This could change the future of Whiteville."

Owned by Tommy Bass and family for years, the properties are being sold by his heir, John L.Bass.

"I can't remember a sale with as much potential as this property has. Anyone can buy it and farm on it tomorrow. But with all the land on Highway 64, it could be used for a lot of other things."

Farm land, timber land and potential commercial property is included in the sale that will be held February 15 at Noon at the Whiteville Community Center in Whiteville.

The land will be sold in separate tracts (see ad on A16) or as a whole.





Co. to Benefit from Broadband \$\$

Tennessee Governor Bill Haslam and Economic and Community Development Commissioner Bob Rolfe announced Hardeman County will receive the benefit of a \$190,000 grant in broadband accessibility money that will help build new broadband infrastructure through Aeneas Internet and Telephone Company.

"In communities across Tennessee, broadband is an essential service that will increase economic investment and growth to help businesses, families and individuals thrive," Haslam said. "With the assistance of these grants, underserved communities will now have access to broadband that will benefit not only the communities themselves, but the state as a whole. These grants are a step in the right direction for our state and will help Tennessee reach its full potential."

"Hardeman County was chosen due to the fact it has enormous community pride and tremendous growth potential." Aeneas is based right here in West Tennessee," says Aeneas CEO, Jonathan Harlan. "It's important to us that the people of our community have the same types of choices and options for high-speed Internet and telephone that other areas of the country have access to. We believe broadband should be available to everyone at a cost they can afford. Aeneas is investing in continued on A14

Stevens to Vie for County Office

With only one week left in the filing deadline all of the 28 spots up for grabs in county elections have candidates, and some with multiple interested parties, and a former Bolivar mayor will also run.

Bolivar Mayor Barrett Stevens, who was defeated in the 2017 election by Mayor Julian McTizic, picked up a petition this past week to run as an independent against democratic candidate Mike Madden, making District 1 Postion 3 a two-way race.

The biggest draw for a position in the county got one more as Susan Ross picked up a petition to run for Circuit Court Clerk as an independent, joining independent Lynn Price and five others who picked up petitions to run in the Democratic Primary: Hardeman County Chief Deputy Sheriff Billy Davis, Tonya L. Perry, Nena K. Moss, Jasmine N. Perry, and Charles Butch Gatlin, Jr.

The seven candidates are hoping to replace the retiring Linda Fulghum, who has been the Circuit Court Clerk since 1968.

The race for Hardeman County Mayor is still a three way affair with one week left in the filing deadline as incumbent Jimmy Sain will face Hardeman County Chamber of Commerce Director Kandy Shackelford in the August General Election. Calvin Howell will run as a republican candidate.

Four candidates have made at least initial contact with the intention f running for sheriff of Hardeman County: democratic incumbent John

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Doolen, democrat Larry McKinnie, and independent candidates Jerry Siler and Pat Baker.

Another contested county office is for Superintendent of Roads, which has democrats Dale Dixon and Casey Swift facing off. The winner will run against independent Eddie Vandiver.



Tickets are \$25 and are on sale at the Arts Center at the box office or patrons may call 731-658-2787 to purchase tickets.



Be Financially Prepared for Natural Disasters

Just this past year, we've seen natural disasters in Texas, California, Florida and Puerto Rico - and looking back even further, it's not hard to spot other traumas in virtually every part of the country. Whether it's a tornado, hurricane, flood or wildfire, you may be at least potentially susceptible to a weather-related event that could threaten your physical - and financial - well-being. How can you protect yourself?

Some of this money should go into a liquid, low-risk account, but you may also want to keep a small amount of cash at home in a safe place, as ATMs and credit cards may not work during or following a disaster, when you must purchase needed supplies.

Protect your documents. As you go through life, you'll accumulate a lot of documents - mortgage papers, insurance policies, financial accounts, tax statements and so on. If disaster strikes, you may need these documents. You'll want to store paper copies in a fireproof and waterproof box or safe at home, in a bank safety deposit box, or with a relative or close friend. Of course, we're now living in a digital age, so you can store electronic copies of important documents in a password-protected format on a removable flash or external hard drive. Better yet, you might want to use a secure cloud-based service.

Pain and Purpose by Jimmy Sadler

Julius Caesar said "It is easier to find men who will volunteer to die, than to find those who are willing to endure pain with patience." I too have found that life long before or at the point of death is bearable. One is tolerable because most of us live in general comfort in our younger days and the moment of death is possible because it is fleeting. The in between times are difficult. Making a living is hard work, enduring family problems is grueling, experiencing personal failure is disheartening. There are also those illnesses that defy measurement. The levels of excruciating pain involved with some physical conditions are beyond my comprehension. How do we endure that, the harsh in between time of youthful exuberance and our stepping into the life after?

There are certainly poor ways to deal with it. We must remember that life has a purpose that is defined by God. If we pursue pleasure or joy apart from that, we will end up in a horrible place. If we seek an ultimate escape from pain,

we die. If we seek a manageable distraction from pain or are addicted to pleasure, we usually end our lives in ruin. Certainly, if it is all we have sought, our end will be tragic.

In the sense of dealing with pain and trauma, let's avoid being like Michael Jackson's physician to others. When we help someone avoid pain, we forget that we are risking their destruction. They (or we) become dependent to the point of ignoring the reality of the situation. Escaping pain is not the purpose of life. Happiness, or even the pursuit of it, is not the purpose of life.

We live in a world that rejects pain as an evil. We make sure that we have access to pain medication at the end of our lives or during illness or injury. I'm not suggesting that, in and of itself is bad. I certainly have wanted pain medications after operations or during dental work. I just think we have forgotten there is a purpose to the pain in our lives. In a physical sense, pain tells us there is some-

The original Greek term paraklasis, rendered consolation in scripture, is a verbal noun used to express both the act of the verb parakalein and the effect produced by it. We have no one word in English to represent it in these two senses; but exhortation expresses the act, and consolation the effect. It is the case, consolation is always directed at the recipient. Thus, as a comforter is comforting by way of exhortation is expressing the act of consoling, and produces the effect in the receiver as being consoled. As the English language is fluid compared to the Greek of old, we commonly use one word to express both the act and the effect.

One who is truly a consoler will comfort out of love, a genuine concern for the person or persons being consoled. An illustration of this is seen in the life and work of Jesus. He told his disciples, "And I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate (or Comforter, Encourager, or Counselor) who will never leave you." The implication in this text is that Jesus is also a Comforter, but he was going away. In what areas do others comfort us? As we continue our study, let us learn the principal of silence's exclusive nature from the book of Hebrews, "For when the priesthood is changed, of necessity there takes place a change of law also. For the one concerning whom these things are spoken belongs to another tribe, from which no one has officiated at the altar. For it is evident that our Lord was descended from Judah, a tribe with reference to which Moses spoke nothing concerning priests." (Hebrews 7:12-14)

We clearly see God's principal of prohibitive silence when Jesus could not have been a priest under the Law of Moses, thus God had to change the law for Jesus to be priest for us today. Moses spoke nothing about other tribes having men who served as priests, thus excluding all other tribes. This principal comes into play when men want to "go beyond what is written" (1 Corinthians 4:6 ESV) and the Apostle John warns us that doing so has serious consequences, when he says, "Everyone who goes on ahead and does not abide in the teaching of Christ, does not have God." (2 John 9 ESV). When men take small steps away from what the Bible authorizes, they are NOT respecting the silence of God! That attitude of permissiveness opens the floodgate for more and more departures from "What is written." Notice this quotation from one who formerly took a proper view on God's silence, when he had earlier said, "If it were the case that anything not expressly forbidden in the New Testament is permissible in the Christian religion, then we could not only use pianos to accompany our singing but beads to aid our prayers, crucifixes to focus our devotion, and hashish to enhance our sensitivity. We could also initiate an organizational network similar to that which has been protested so strongly in Catholicism or begin financing church projects with bingo games (where legal) on Tuesday evenings. Not one of these things is explicitly forbidden in the New Testament, and no one who denies the legitimacy of the authority principle as outlined above can consistently argue against any of them." (Shelly, Rubel. 1987. Sing His Praise—A Case for A Capella Music as Worship Today. Nashville, TN: 20th Century Christian. Sadly, Rubel Shelly has since changed his view and consequently embraced error, rather than reproving it. Our attitude concerning God's silence must be consistent with God's will for us, and leave alone all additions of men.


OUR COUNTY Hardeman County Remembered by Lisa Coleman

Each February the world comes here to Hardeman and Favette Counties for the National Championship for Bird Dogs held on the grounds of the Ames Plantation. These dog athletes are magnificent, and yes, they are athletes; if you've ever seen one of them at work you would understand what great and dedicated athletes these dogs are.

I remember the very first time I ever went to the Ames Plantation; I was probably about 8 years old and our Brownie Scout group got to go there for a tour. I remember going up on the porch and in the front doors and looking up at what seemed like to me, this large, lovely staircase. There were lots of interesting things on the tables and walls and lots of photos and paintings of dogs. Everyone else wanted to just rush past all of that and go see the horses at the barn. Well, I wanted to see the horses too, but there were just so many interesting things in that big house that I just wanted to see, and I was at the back of the group taking it all in. That's a habit of mine that continues to this day - taking time to look at the lives of people who lived in a place, and yes, asking questions about them.

Although the house and plantation are most closely associated with Mr. & Mrs. Hobart Ames, the original house was built in 1847 by Mr. John Walker Jones. The original house was built in a Federal style and was the Jones family's second home in West Tennessee. After Mr. Ames purchased

the house in 1901 he made many changes to it, enlarging the house to better serve the needs and lifestyle of a wealthy industrialist. Mr. and Mrs. Ames would typically only live in the house about three months out of the year, usually from January to March and then they would return to their home in Massachusetts.

The Ames would arrive by train in Grand Junction, riding aboard their own special rail car. Staff at the house would have been busy days before their arrival getting everything ready for them and for the various events they would host during their stay, including the National Championship. Traveling with them would be as many as 12 of their favorite English Springer Spaniels, a breed of which they were quite fond. The dogs were "rotated" on a schedule each day so that there were always two of them in the dining room with Mr. and Mrs. Ames. This is a photo of Mr. Ames with some of their beloved English Springer Spaniels.

The dog athletes who participate in the National Championship each year have already proven their abilities as a champion, and they have placed or won at least two of the 80 qualifying events held in the U.S. and Canada. The dogs run 22-24 miles during each brace; the riders travel about 11 linear miles as they follow the dogs.

You can find out more about the start times for the braces, rules and requirements for animals and humans who want to attend, and more information at amesplantation.org. There's a lot of other great information on the website about the history of this event, the plantation, and other events held on the grounds each year. Like I said, y'all, this is the time of year when the world comes to us, and it's all right here for us in our own backyard.

Note: The 2018 National Championship will begin February 12.

At press time, nine county commission offices remain uncontested, with incumbents Jackie Sain (District 1, Position 2), Johnny Weems (District 2, Position 2), Chandra Lake (District 3, Position 1) Charles Morrow (District 3, Position 2), Elvis White (District 3, Position 3), Johnny Lanier (District 5, Position 1), John Vickers (District 6), Bobby Doyle (District 7, Position 1), and Elmer Cobb (District 8), without opponents.

The biggest bottlenecks for a county commission spot are District 2, Position 1 and District 7, Position 2.

In District 2, the spot held by Major Wilburn for years has four candidates: Gary Barber (D), Donna Pinner (D), Mauricio Beauregard (I) and Stan Doyle (R) who was nominated by the Republican Party in their January caucus.

In District 7, previously held by Anthony Pulse, voters will choose from Larry Minter (D), Brandon Burvee (I), Darren Grantham (I) and Mark Gilliam (R), who was nominated by the Hardeman County Republican Party in their caucus.
