Budget Passes; Schools Keep \$\$

The Hardeman County Commission voted to keep the tax rate the same for the county and for the schools, ending months of discussion and speculation with a whimper instead of a bang on June 18 in the Hardeman County Courthouse.

While raising the overall tax rate was not a part of discussion or in dispute, the rate the schools would receive was the hottest topic of the night, as it has been for months.

The final decision on the schools came after weeks of proposals that were floated back and forth between the budget committee and the board of education.

A Memorandum of Agreement, first discussed on May 21, which had the schools receiving \$300,000 each year for the next eight years in exchange for a six cent tax cut, lasted until June 10, when it was changed to the equivalent of only what revenue the six

The Meeting Before the Meeting

The Hardeman County Budget Committee's meeting on June 18 prior to the second reading and vote on the 2019-2020 budget produced a surprise for Hardeman County Mayor Jimmy Sain.

Sain, who had relayed to Deputy Director of Schools and County Commissioner Bobby Doyle that he thought the Hardeman County Budget Committee would set funding the schools at \$1.46 and that they could make their budget with that figure, ended up explaining that the Hardeman County Budget Committee declined to vote to change the rate and donation to the schools that had been decided upon during the June 10 meeting of the committee.

On June 10, the budget committee decreased the rate from \$1.46 to \$1.40, but offered the equivalent dollars to the difference in the form of a donation that would go toward debt service each year.

The budget committee meeting prior to the commission meeting was announced in advance and open to the public.

cents would bring in those years, to be used for debt service for the Hardeman County Schools.

After the Hardeman County School Board rejected the change on June 13, the sides were quiet on official moves until June 18, and it was thought the \$1.46 would be the offer from the budget commit-

tee (see *The Meeting Before the Meeting* above).

Hardeman County Budget Committee Chairman Jerry Watkins presented the budget to the commissioners.

After a public hearing, the commission voted to accept the county budget as put forth by the Harde-

man County Budget Committee by a vote of 11-5. Dissenting on the vote were Commissioners Mark Gilliam, Bobby Hensley, Justin Howell, Chondra Lake, and Elvis White.

The vote that followed to set the schools rate at \$1.46 began with Commissioner Mike Madden making the motion to the set the rate there instead of taking the budget committee recommendation, with Commissioner Bobby Wright seconding.

The vote that saw the passage of the \$1.46 rate went 12-4 in favor, with Budget Committee Members Jackie Sain and Johnny Lanier voting against along with Johnny Weems and John Vickers.

The county rate of \$2.55 remained the same for the fifth straight year, bringing the fund balance close to five million dollars, up from less than a million dollars in 2014.

City of Bolivar Honors Hometown Heroes

Retired Assistant Chief and Volunteer Firefighter Emmett Bolyard (far right photo) was presented with a framed copy of the House of Representatives Joint Resolution No. 167 honoring his fifty-five years of service to the Bolivar Fire Department by Representative Johnny Shaw on June 14.

The resolution was adopted on February 25, 2019, and was presented to the House of Representatives by Representative Ron Gant and Senator Dolores Gresham.

The resolution reflected "It is fitting that the members of the General Assembly honor those individuals who have performed with uncommon devotion and enthusiasm throughout their years of public service."

Also honored as "Hometown Heroes" were two police officers and two firemen who were part of a live saving situation this February

in Bolivar.

Honored for their heroic actions were Investigator Christopher Burkeen and Officer Noelia "Nelly" Munoz of the Bolivar Police Department and Lieutenant Eric Seaton and Volunteer Firefighter Charles Thompson of the Bolivar Fire Department.

"We are thankful for the tremendous staff we have representing the City of Bolivar. The staff at both the police and fire departments have difficult jobs and face tremendous adversity on a daily basis. We are very proud of all of these staff members for their quick response, their outstanding teamwork, and their calm demeanor in the midst of a life-threatening situation," said Mayor McTizic.

Chief Lynn Price and Chief Michael Jones echoed the mayor's sentiments with a joint statement. "Our staff are called to a life of pub-

lic service. They face dangerous, stressful situations daily and usually meet people at the worst possible moment of their lives. They always handle these situations with professionalism and dignity. We are extremely proud of them, not only for their actions on February 8, but for their unwavering commitment to our community, our citizens, and each other."

Jesus as God, Part 5 by Jeff Capshaw

Last week I defined the theological category known as “Christology.” One form (“low Christology”) entails historical discussions about the person and work of Christ. The other form involves studying Christ from a doctrinal conception or “high Christology.” The latter is what this series is about. Thus, having begun with John’s Gospel, I am commenting on selected New Testament passages related to theme of Jesus Christ being God.

In this week’s article, the focus is upon a portion of one of the most significant of the so-called high Christological passages in the New Testament: Colossians 1:15-20. After a familiar Pauline Greeting, Thanksgiving, and Prayer (1:1-1:14), Paul launches into an impressive description of Christ.

First, he discusses who Jesus is. He says, “He [Christ] is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation” (v. 15). Two brief comments are in order here. First, Christ is the “image of the invisible God.” Literally, he is the “icon” of God. The writer of Hebrews puts it this way; “he

is the exact representation of his [God’s] being . . .” (1:3). To illustrate this, take, for example, the US Quarter. It features a side view of George Washington’s head on it. It is a stamp or replica of George Washington’s human image. Furthermore, in John’s Gospel, Jesus told Philip, “anyone who has seen me has seen the Father” (14:9).

Second, Paul says that Jesus is the “firstborn of all creation.” Here is a case where the original language illuminates our understanding. The Greek word Paul uses for “firstborn” doesn’t indicate birth order as often is the case with siblings’ birth order: first, second, third and so on. Instead, the Greek word prototokos means something like the “preeminent one.” In other words, he surpasses all things in creation. It is like the Valedictorian of a graduating class; she or he has the highest academic achievement and, therefore, he or she surpasses all others in the class.

Finally, Paul asserts that Jesus Christ was intimately involved in the creation of the entire uni-

verse. Although mindboggling, he writes, “for by him all things were created, in heaven and on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or rulers or authorities—all things were created through him and for him” (1:15-16). This correlates with an earlier passage discussed here from John’s Gospel. It says, “through him [Christ] all things were made; without him nothing was made that has been made” (1:3).

In summary, any being who is the icon of God, and any being who is unique above all creation, and any being who created all things visible and invisible most certainly has divine status. Not only is this so, but according to the Apostle Paul and the New Testament, that being also is God per se. Therefore, Jesus Christ is intrinsically God.

Why Suffering? by David Coy

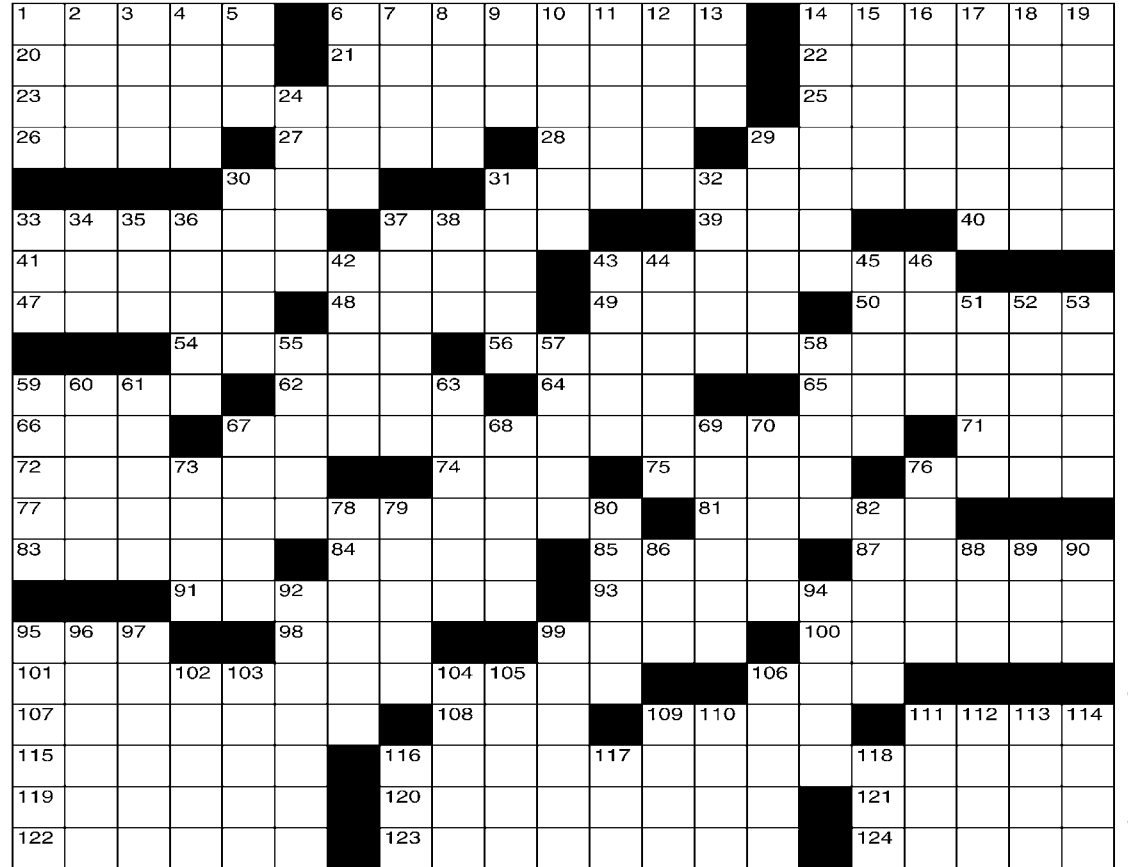

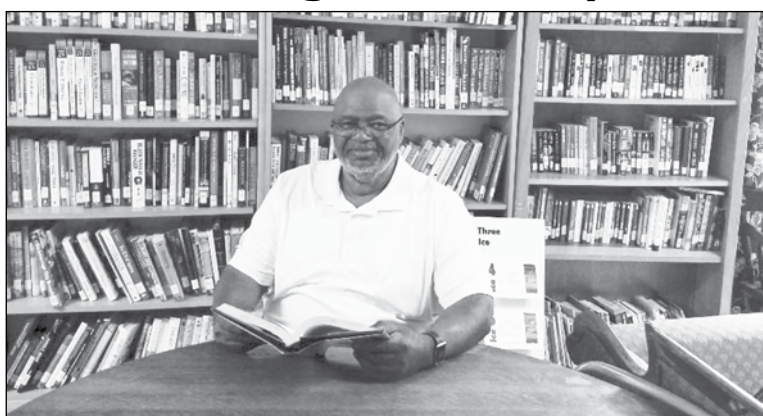

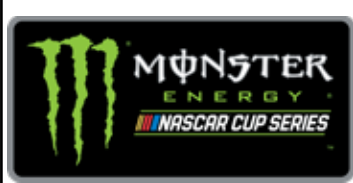
