County Debate Set for July

The Hardeman County NAACP, WMOD Radio, and the *Bolivar Bulletin Times*, will invite candidates for the Hardeman County Mayor and Sheriff races to debate on July 10 beginning at 6:00 p.m. at Bolivar Central High School.

All other candidates will be invited to address the audience prior to the debate. The event will be aired on WMOD Radio (96.7 FM) and on County Journal Television.

The format for the evening will be to allow any candidate for county office two minutes to speak, followed by the sheriff's debate, and the mayor's debate will finish the evening.

The debate portion of the evening will have each candidate address three questions by the panel followed by the candidates fielding questions from each other in hopes of allowing the candidates the opportunity to bring their issues to the floor.

Expected to participate are incumbent Democratic Mayor Jimmy Sain, Republican Calvin Howell, and Independent candidate Kandy Shackelford along with incumbent Democratic Sheriff John Doolen, and Independent candidates Pat Baker and Jerry Siler.

The debate will be three days prior to the opening of early voting in the Hardeman County General Election, which will be July 13 at the Hardeman County Election Commission at 106 S. Porter Street in Bolivar.

Originally scheduled for the to-be-renovated Luez Theatre, the venue for the event is tentatively scheduled for the auditorium at Bolivar Central High School. A delay in delivery of the seats by the Irwin Seating Company pushed back the completion on the theatre. The projected Luez completion date was moved to August because of a clerical error by the company.

Two Released; Two Arrested

The Hardeman County Sheriff's Department released Jaquan Blake-more, 18, of Bolivar and Benjamin Turner, 18, of Bolivar from custody and dropped all charges in relation to a robbery in Hornsby.

Their release came after investigations led the Sheriff's Department to arrest two others, both minors, in connection with the robbery.

On March 30, three young men entered and robbed the Dollar General in Hornsby at approximately 8:30 p.m. A customer in the parking lot was fired upon as the trio made their getaway on foot.

Since the March 20 murder of Michael Ruiz at El Ranchito Mexican Restaurant in Bolivar, 14 young men have been arrested in connection with four armed robberies around the county, including Dollar General stores in Hornsby and Toone, and the Whiteville Quick Stop.

Hornsby native Becky Goodrum Weaver, vocalist and fiddle player for "No Time Flatt" will be on the road in June covering Benton, Kentucky, Summer- town, Tennessee, Nashville, and Dollywood, in Pigeon Forge, Tennessee.



Becky Goodrum Weaver grew up in Hornsby, Tennessee, but currently resides in Henderson, with her husband and two sons. She devotes one night a week to keeping up with the needs of her fans, practicing with the band.

Her time is spent as a teacher's assistant in the local school system, gardening, and tending to her Nubian dairy goats. They live on a small farm in the county. Becky is sewing her love of Blue into the roots of her boys, who are ages 8 and 10. The family is supportive of her band, making it possible for work, family, and fun, to flow smoothly.

Becky was just 10 years old when she demanded her own fiddle, and her request was met by her father, Clarence Goodrum, Jr. Clarence played the fiddle, but preferred the banjo. He began her training by teaching her a couple of chords and then signing her up for violin lessons. He hand-crafted her first fiddle, and the rest is history. Becky enjoys classical violin, which paid for her degree in music, but has always preferred the upbeat Bluegrass genre. "Bluegrass leaves me feeling good, and there is no time for everything", confesses Becky. The beautiful vocals of Alison Krauss, who has contributed music to several movie soundtracks, such as "O Brother, Where Art Thou?", is Becky's voice of inspiration. Bluegrass is the genre that tapped into her soul and gave her life direction. The "No Time Flatt" band came to be one day when a wedding party solicited Becky for a Bluegrass band to perform for the wedding, and a group who had been previously playing together was contacted by Becky, a friend from teen years, to play for the wedding. In 2015, the group began making music and history as one.

Hardeman County Remembered by Lisa Coleman

June 6 marks the anniversary of the date when Allied troops landed along a 50-mile stretch of heavily-fortified French coastline to fight Nazi Germany on the beaches of Normandy, France. General Dwight D. Eisenhower declared that the operation would "...accept nothing less than full victory." Also part of the day's assault were 5,000 ships and 13,000 aircraft serving in support of troops on the ground. At that end of that day, more than 9,000 Allied soldiers were killed or wounded, but approximately 100,000 of them began the march across Europe that would ultimately defeat Hitler.

There were many from Hardeman County, or with ties to Hardeman County, who served in World War II. My cousin, James Kestler, was born and spent his early years in Hardeman County; his family later moved to North Carolina, where he and his wife, Doris, made their home. Like many of those who served during WWII, James did not often speak about his service, and only began to tell more of the story in his later years. In his 90's, his mind was sharp and he could recall events in vivid details and could tell you the names of so many in his Army unit. Doris kept all of the letters James sent to her, including the last and most important letter, the one telling her he would soon be coming home. She still calls him a hero, and rightly so.



James said his unit wasn't told where they were going, they just did what they were told. Orders eventually took he and his unit to France, where they waited for a week off of the coast of Normandy. On June 7, his unit landed on Omaha Beach; he remembered that there was still firing going on all around the beach. "They were just firing those things. It was the biggest firework display I had ever seen", he said. One of his most vivid memories is that of fellow soldiers he found lying dead along the beach. "I saw a row of dead Americans. I saw right there where we landed, and right along the base, back from the water a little way, they had them racked up in stretchers."

Just a little over a week later, on June 16, 1944, James was wounded in action. He would spend time in a hospital in England convalescing before coming home for a 30-day furlough. He was awarded a Purple Heart for his actions in Europe; he didn't talk about that much, but a couple of years before he passed away, he was honored as the oldest living Purple Heart recipient in North Carolina.

Take time a few moments this week to remember the heroes of those June days and to pause and think about those who served throughout the war, especially those young men who landed on those beaches and walked straight into enemy fire.

We must never forget them and what they did. Bless you and thank you all.

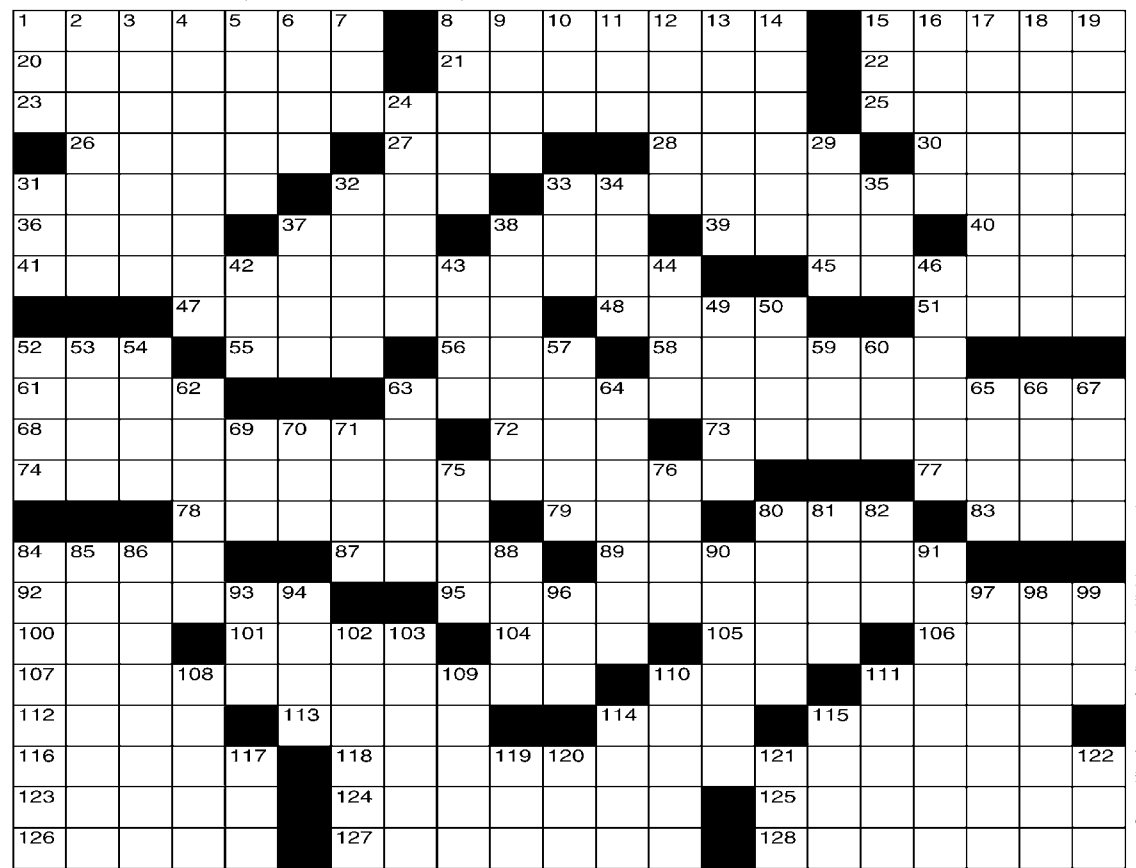

Fried Smashed Potatoes

Ingredients

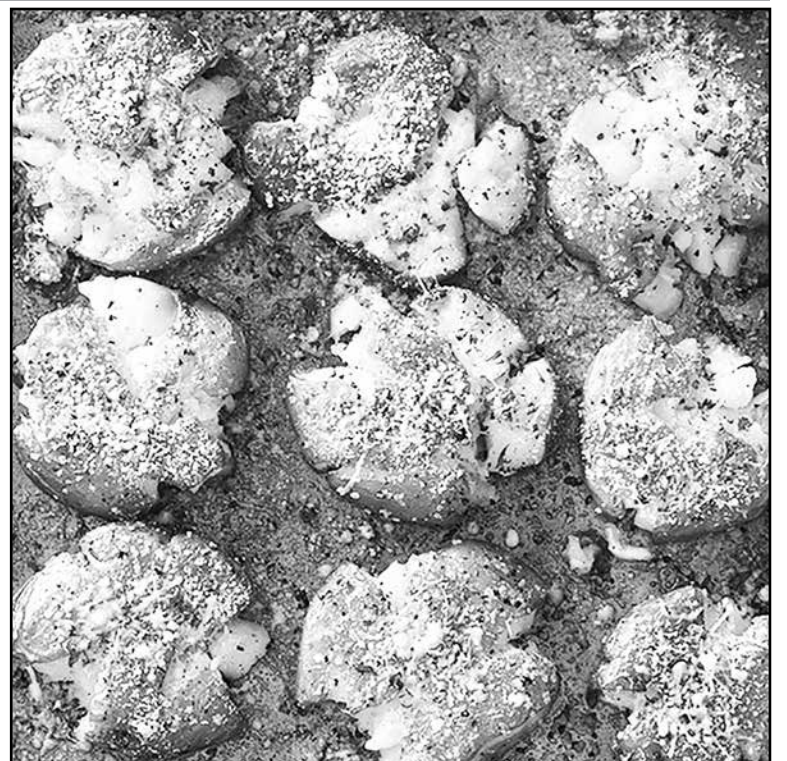
- 12 small red potatoes (1-1/2 to 2 inches in diameter; 1-1/2 to 2 pounds total)
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1/4 cup olive oil
- 3/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 teaspoon ground black pepper
- 3/4 cup freshly grated Parmesan cheese
- 2 tablespoons dried or finely chopped fresh parsley

Make-Ahead Directions

Scrub potatoes; set aside overnight. Combine the grated cheese and parsley in an airtight container; cover. Chill for up to 24 hours. Continue as directed.

Directions

1. Place potatoes in a large saucepan and cover with at least 1 inch of water. Add the 1 teaspoon salt to water. Bring to boiling; reduce heat. Cover and simmer for 25 to 30 minutes or until potatoes are very tender; drain potatoes.
2. Preheat oven to 450 degrees F. Transfer potatoes to a foil-lined 15x10x1-inch baking pan. Cool for 10 minutes. Using a potato masher or the palm of your hand (be careful not to burn your hand), lightly press down on each potato to smash to about 1/2-inch thickness, keeping each potato in one piece.
3. Using half of the olive oil, brush on potatoes. Sprinkle half of the salt and pepper on potatoes. Bake, uncovered, for 10 to 15 minutes or until bottoms are lightly browned and crisp. Turn potatoes; brush with the remaining olive oil and sprinkle with the remaining salt and pepper. Bake for 10 to 15 minutes more or until potatoes are lightly browned and crisp. In a bowl combine cheese and parsley. Sprinkle on potatoes. Bake for 2 to 3 minutes more or until cheese is melted.

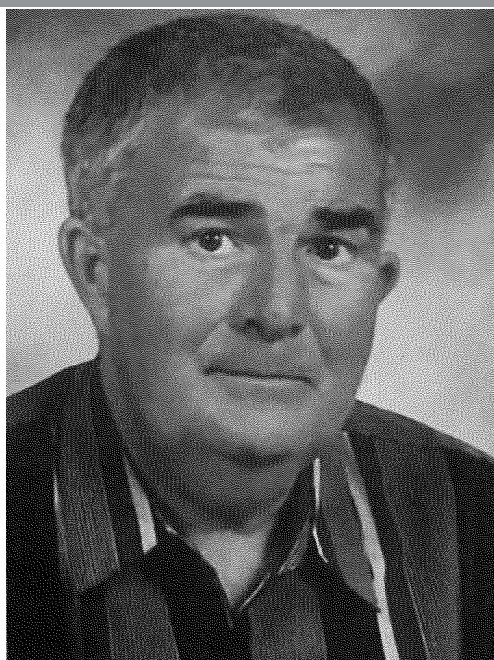

Sunrise: Brokenness by David Coy

There is a story that was told of an individual who was struggling to accept the loss of their soul mate and move forward in their life. The individual had become quite proficient in stuffing their true feelings. Only those closest to them knew they were not dealing with their grief in a healthy manner, and that this individual was not letting go of their deceased loved one. They were living their life in limbo as if on the one hand, their soul mate never died, while cognitively knowing all the while that was not true.

Then there is another story of another individual who was living a life of destitute isolation from mainstream society because of a traumatic past that haunted them

in their dreams, yet in the light of day their life was one pretense that their past never happened. They also lived their life with two pseudo-realities. They lived their life pretending their trauma never happened, stuffing their pain and never dealing with it in a healthy reality-based manner.

These are two examples of broken lives. Lives that are stuck in the past, not willing to accept or feeling they are not able to move forward into fully accepting their new reality. The Greek word, <suntribo> means; to crush completely, that is, to shatter (literally or figuratively): - break (in pieces), broken to shivers (+ -hearted), bruise. ~ Strong's Concordance.

Worldview- Part 7 by Jeff Capshaw

Last week I cited 2 Corinthians 10:5. It says believers ought to “. . . take every thought captive to obey Christ” (ESV). I suggested it as a mandate for Christian thinkers, because thoughts not submitted to the Lordship of Christ are inconsistent and disobedient.

I concluded last week with an example of one way to understand an unbelieving view of the origin and nature of humanity: a view not submitted to the Lordship of Christ. Either humans were created by God in God's image (Genesis 1:27), or they came about in some other way. The most prevalent view insists humans are the product of material and/or biological, random, unguided chance.

This week I offer a strategy for engaging unbelieving worldviews. Proverbs 26:4-5 says, “answer not a fool according to his folly, lest you be like him yourself. Answer a fool according to his folly, lest he be wise in his own eyes.” These two verses seem to contradict one another. However, this literary technique is common to poetry in the Old Testament Scriptures; it is a form of parallelism. How so?

First, the Christian should never use concepts of the unbeliever's worldview to substantiate claims of the Christian worldview. If the believer tries that, then the Christian thinker will be just like the unbeliever: disobedient and foolish. Instead, the Christian should use the claims of an unbeliever's worldview to show the unbeliever the folly of that worldview.

This is due to another component for consistent, Christian worldview thinking: the principle of “antithesis.” Antithesis is the diametrical opposition between belief and unbelief and, therefore, between belief and any compromise of biblical truth.

For example, if someone said that “it is raining outside,” then the antithesis would be “it is not raining outside.” Generally, Christian thinkers can show unbelievers the foolishness of their ways by thinking of what Scripture says about those claims or by simply asking pressing questions of them. At the same time, however, a believer should never adopt unbelieving starting points or components of their worldview to try and prove the validity of the Christian worldview.

Does this mean that dialog between believers and unbelievers is futile? No, it doesn't. In next week's article, I will discuss the “common ground” that believers have with unbelievers for dialog. It isn't shared assumptions for constructing a worldview; it isn't a pretended neutrality; it isn't even reason or logic. What do you think the common ground is?

Thus they were or broken in heart, because they are stuck, in limbo, in love with their past, and not willing to live wholly now. The goal is one of healing. Jehovah is said to bind up the fracture of his people and heal the wounds his people were struck with (from the O.T. prophet Isaiah, chapter 61). (Rom. 6:1-18) **Is it the Christian who listens to rebuke and makes the needed corrections to be right with God? (Rev. 3:19) Is it the Christian who sees the entire world going the wrong way and doesn't follow the same path? (Matt. 7:13-14) Is it the Christian who warns the sinner of the error of his way? (Ezekiel 3:18-21) Is it the Christian who warns brethren of apostasy day and night with tears? (Acts 20:28-31) Is it the Christian who acts as a fisher of men to a lost world? (Matt. 4:19) Is it the Christian who persuades men to obey Christ to be saved? (II Cor. 5:11; II Thess. 1:8-9) Is it the Christian who encourages others, when encouragement is needed? (Rom. 12:15) Is it the Christian who watches and waits for the Lord to return? (Matt. 24:42-47) Is it the Christian that suffers and dies for his faith? (Rev. 2:10) Is it the Christian who endures unto the end? (Matt. 24:13) When it comes to the series of questions we considered today— I would hope we all could agree and say YES to all the questions of what a faithful Christian looks like. What Should You Look for in an Annual Financial Review?

Given the complexities of the investment world, you might consider working with a financial professional to help you move toward your goals, such as a comfortable retirement. You'll want to establish good communication with whomever you choose, and you should meet in person at least once a year to discuss your situation. At these annual reviews, you'll want to cover a variety of topics, including these:

Your portfolio's progress - Obviously, you will want to discuss how well your investments are doing. Of course, you can follow their performance from month to month, or even day to day, by reviewing your investment statements and online information, but at your annual meeting, your financial professional can sum up the past year's results, highlight areas that have done well or lagged, and show you how closely your portfolio is tracking the results you need to achieve your long-term goals.

Your investment mix - Your mix of investments - stocks, bonds, government securities and so on - helps determine your success as an investor. But in looking at the various investments in your portfolio, you'll want to go beyond individual gains and losses to see if your overall mix is still appropriate for your needs. For example, is the ratio of stocks to bonds still suitable for your risk tolerance? Over time, and sometimes without you taking any action, this ratio can shift, as often happens when stocks appreciate so much that they now take up a larger percentage of your portfolio than you intended - with a correspondingly higher risk level. If these unexpected movements occur, your financial professional may recommend you rebalance your portfolio to align it more closely with your goals and risk tolerance.

Changes in your family situation - A lot can happen in a single year. You could have gotten married, divorced or remarried, added a child to your family or moved to a new, more expensive house - the list can go on and on. And some, if not all, of these moves could certainly involve your financial and investment pictures, so it's important to discuss them with your financial professional.


Changes in your goals - Since your last annual review, you may have decided to change some of your long-term goals. Perhaps you no longer want to retire early, or you've ruled out that vacation home. In any case, these choices may well affect your investment strategies, so it's wise to discuss them.

Changes in the investment environment - Generally speaking, it's a good idea to establish a long-term investment strategy based on your individual goals, risk tolerance and time horizon, and stick with this basic strategy regardless of the movements of the financial markets or changes in the economy. Still, this doesn't mean you should never adjust your portfolio in response to external forces. For instance, if interest rates were to rise steadily over a year's time, you might want to consider some changes to your fixed-income investments, such as bonds, whose value will be affected by rising rates. In any case, it's another thing to talk about during your annual review.

These aren't the only elements you may want to bring up in your yearly review with your financial professional - but they can prove to be quite helpful as you chart your course toward the future.





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

Baseball is scheduled to do their awards on June 8.

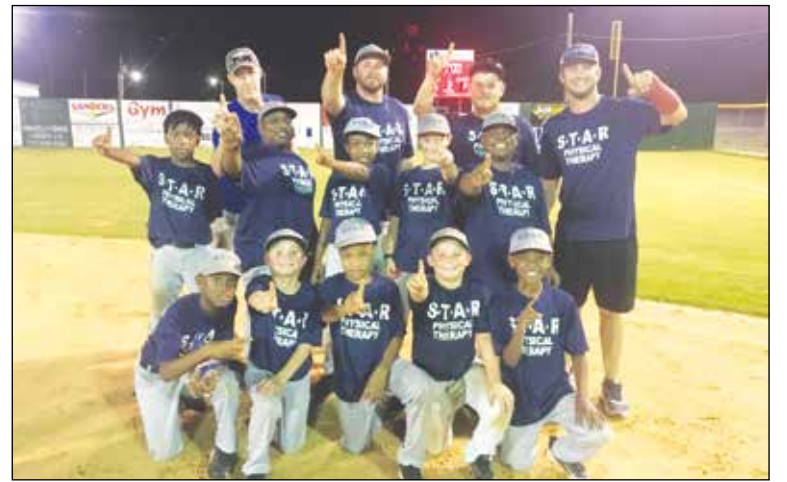
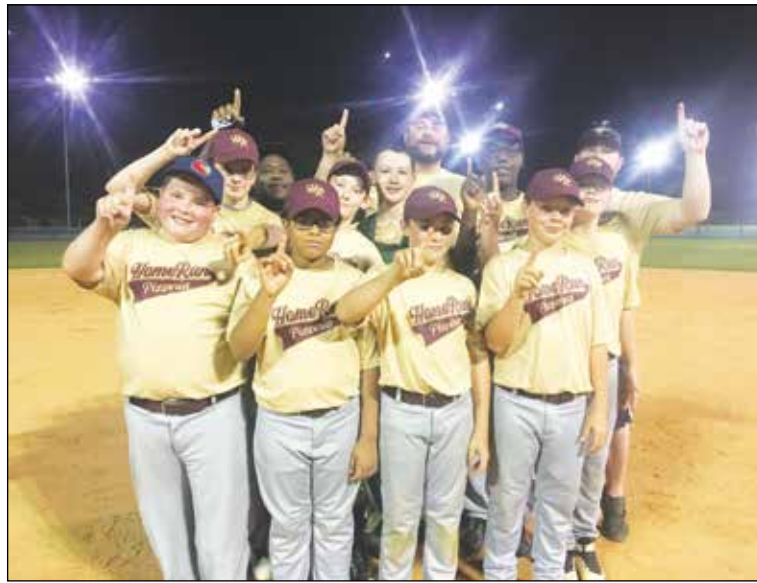
