I, Casey Swift, am announcing my candidacy for Road Superintendent of Hardeman County. Over my 13 years as a dedicated employee with the Highway Department, I have worked in various positions including General Laborer, Heavy Equipment Operator, Crew Foreman, Asphalt Plant Supervisor, Purchasing Agent and Procurement Officer. In 2008 I became a certified Asphalt Mix Designer, Lab and Plant Technician through the Tennessee Department of Transportation in Nashville. I have had local government and CTAS training to prepare me to work with payroll, purchasing, and budgeting for the past six years. I am currently serving as the Assistant Superintendent of the Hardeman County Highway Department. My daily responsibilities include inspection of the 426 county roads, 126 bridges and 75 one span bridges as well as preparing daily work plans and schedules for 33 employees.



If elected, I will continue to pave roads in Hardeman County utilizing one of the only county owned asphalt plants in Tennessee which saves the county 33%-50% of the cost of buying from a privately owned asphalt plant. This allows your tax dollars to go further by paving more roads with less money. I will work to improve the condition of our county right-of-ways by clearing any road obstructions; installing bigger culverts to decrease flooding allowing for better drainage; and implementing an aggressive ditching policy. I will work to improve the quality of our roads by limiting patchwork and developing a more permanent solution for our road structure. I will make sure we keep our bridge program current to ensure we continue to receive state and federal funding. I will have an open door policy and will do my very best to ensure the safety and quality of Hardeman County's roads. I will work closely with the highway officials to carry out the work orders implemented by the County Board of Supervisors, maintain open communication with them and follow the laws of the State of Tennessee.

For the past 13 years I have made it my goal to learn as much as possible about the Highway Department. I feel that my experience, dedication and passion for the job make me the best candidate for this position. I truly love my job and I humbly ask for your vote and support in the upcoming election.

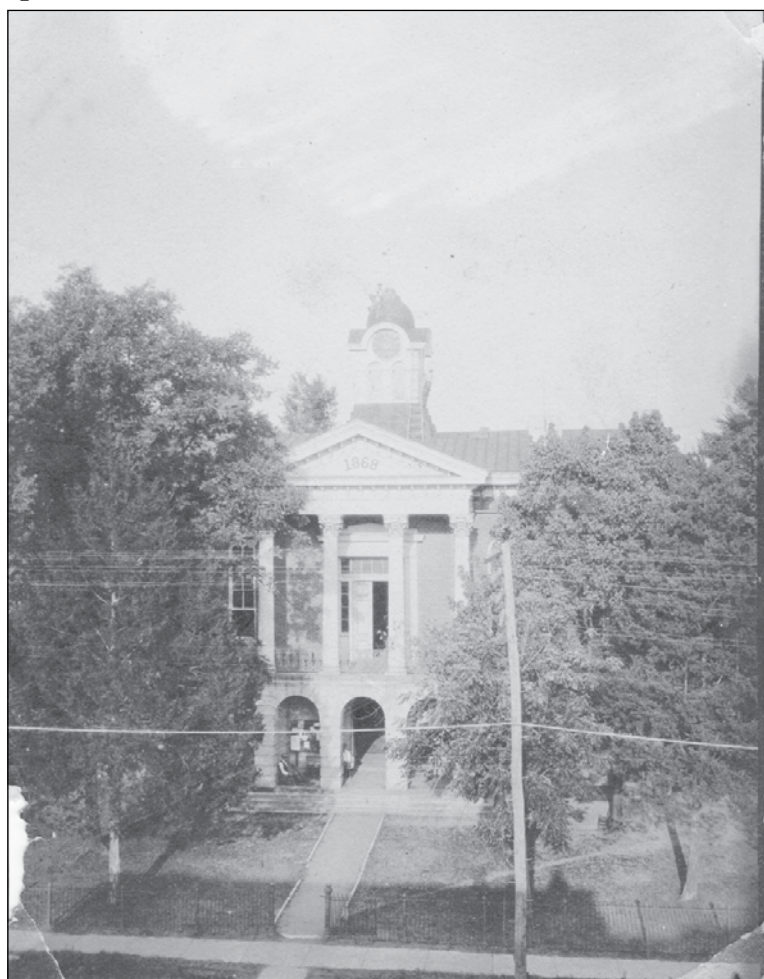
# OUR COUNTY

## Hardeman County Remembered by Lisa Coleman

If you haven't remembered yet, I'm sure there will be lots of reminders over the next few days for us to all "spring forward" and move our clocks up an hour on Saturday night. On my calendar it says "Daylight Savings Time Returns"; one of my grandmothers used to say it was back to that "fast time" (she was an advocate of leaving time alone, by the way). However you remember or look at it, there will be more hours of daylight and between that and the crocuses and buttercups in my yard it's just another reminder that spring really is just around the corner.

Benjamin Franklin is often credited as one of the first individuals to suggest Daylight Savings Time. His 1784 essay, "An Economical Project for Diminishing the Cost of Light" promoted economizing the use of candles by making better use of daylight hours. Others would later advocate the idea but it was not widely observed in the U.S. until after World War II. The 1966 Uniform Time Act decreed when clocks would fall back and spring forward; it has been amended a couple of times until we arrived at this current version, which runs roughly from March until November. Arizona, Hawaii, Puerto Rico or the U. S. Virgin Islands do not observe the time change.

Thinking about all of this time business sort of naturally got me to thinking about clocks this week. I would guess that the largest clock we have in the county is the one on the very top of the Hardeman County Courthouse in Bolivar. Today's Courthouse is the third one we've had here in the county; an early description of the building (as it was under construction) referred to the structure as a "magnificent hall of justice". I'm not sure if a



clock was original to the building or if it was added later (perhaps someone out there will know and can share that information with me).

This photo shows the front (Main Street side) of the Courthouse and the west facing clock. If you look closely you can see that the clock face is dark; if you look even closer, you can see some men working on the sides of the clock and even at the very top of the cupola. This photo is from the 1910's and shows early electric lines and you can see the old wrought iron gate and fencing that went all around the court square at one time. There are no safety nets or cables in sight - just an old wooden ladder

propped up beneath the clock. The modern day Courthouse clock was meticulously repaired in the 1990s by Mr. Raymond Russell in Bolivar. Mr. Raymond took the entire thing apart, carefully numbered and tagged everything, and then cleaned and repaired it and put the clock back together again.

The man that seems to have started this time saving discussion so long ago, Mr. Franklin reminds us that "You may delay, but time will not." So there's just a bit of time and clock history for you to think about this weekend when you spring forward - you've been reminded and there's still time to get your clocks and watches re-set. Happy (almost) Spring Y'all.

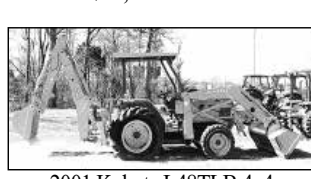

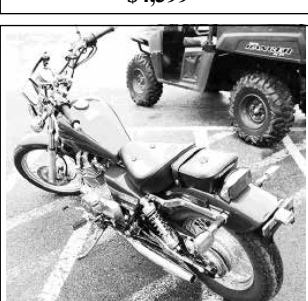

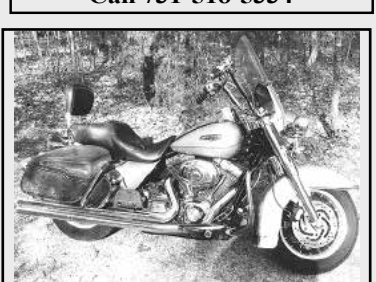

## Sunrise: Grief & Homicide

Allegedly science tells us that men registered no difference from women in feelings of grief. Studies have shown that closeness of relationships was of significant value. In relation to survivors of victims of homicide, there exists variables that make this journey with grief especially difficult. There are expressed concerns of the police and judicial system, as well as has been relayed, the import of family, friends, as well as others in what we have described as one's support group.

As to the sameness of both male and female and their reactions to loss, we who have experienced the journey with grief, and others who have supported those on the journey, whether family, friends, or

"Nobody can walk into death and walk back out the same person" (Rosenthal, 1973, p. 134). I have come to understand, however in limited degree that loss by homicide is more complex and to the survivors more agonizing because of the complexity. Shakespeare said, "Give sorrow words; the grief that does not speak knits up the o'er wrought heart and bids

There are many beliefs and opinions in the world today about the church that are simply inaccurate. However, the Bible gives us the facts that can be proven in the scriptures. It is not for us to speculate or form opinions separate and apart from these facts. Therefore, there is nothing that an open Bible can't fix.



### 1. The Church is the People, Not the Building.

Quite often we hear someone drive by a beautiful building and hear them say, "That's a beautiful church there!" But in reality, that building is just a building, and the church actually is the saints who assemble at the building.

The Bible teaches us specifically who and what the church is in: (1) **1 Corinthians 3:9**, "For we are God's fellow workers; you are God's field, God's building." (2) **1 Peter 2:5**, "you also, as living stones, are being built up as a spiritual house for a holy priesthood, to offer up spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ." When Luke records the account that, "The news about them reached the ears of the church at Jerusalem, and they sent Barnabas off to Antioch," he definitely was not talking about the ears on a building in reference to the church at Jerusalem (**Acts 11:22**). It is called a misnomer to use a term in the wrong way, and that is precisely what happens here, usually in ignorance. We usually know what people are referring to when they use the term incorrectly. But sadly, if that were the only misconception about the church, we would be glad. Certainly there are more dangerous beliefs about the organization and work of Christ's body. This one is easily corrected, as long as people are willing.

## Bolivar Alumnus Wins State Championship

Former Bolivar Central High School basketball player Stacy Mitchell (pictured right) coached his Warren Central team from Indianapolis, Indiana to the 4A Girls Basketball title this season, beating Zionsville 50-46. It is the first state girls basketball championship in Warren Central's history.

With a record of 3-20 in 2012, Head Coach Mitchell had taken over a struggling basketball program that saw five coaches in as many years.

"I'm just happy for the girls. High school should be the best part of your life and my job is to use basketball to create memories that will last for the rest of their lives," said Coach Mitchell.

Mitchell also became the first African-American coach to win an Indiana State Girls' Basketball Championship.

After high school, he spent the next two seasons at Freed-Hardeman University and later transferred to the University of Tennessee at Martin where he helped the Skyhawks win the Gulf South Conference championship in 1988.

"Many coaches have influenced me including Benny Perry, Joe North, Tom Hancock, Don Meyer and Leo Klemm," said Mitchell.

## TN Reconnect Making a Difference

Randy Smith will be in his mid-40s when he finishes his Physical Therapist Assistant Degree at Jackson State Community College in May 2019.

Inspired by the physical therapists who worked with his young daughter, Smith decided to go to college and get a degree. He had not been in a classroom since he graduated from high school.

Smith is one of many Tennessee adult learners who are benefitting from Tennessee Reconnect, a statewide program that encourages adults to get a post-secondary college degree or certification.

The program pays the tuition for qualifying adults who attend a state community college or state college of applied technology and a portion of the expenses at four-year universities.

Depending on their majors, most Tennessee Reconnect students at Jackson State have only the cost of books and fees. "I love it," Smith said about Tennessee Reconnect. "I've got friends I'm pushing to look into it."

"You can find a lot of because and reasons why you can't go back to college," Smith said. "Tennessee Reconnect takes away 95 percent of them."
