Ballot Boxes Open in Bolivar

Voters in Bolivar began the process of selecting four councilpeople for the next four years when Early Voting began on May 1 with all four races having multiple candidates.

The most contested race in the election is for District B, Position 1, as incumbent Todd Lowe has challengers in Daisy M. Harvey and Jimmy W. Howell. Harvey is a first time candidate, while Howell most recently ran in 2017, losing to Suzanne Rhea by four votes.

Also running as an incumbent is Larry McKinnie, Sr. for District A, Position 2. McKinnie has Donell Polk, Jr. as an opponent.

Two open seats were created when Tommy Woods and Tracy Byrum elected not to run for another term. Byrum leaves after two terms, while Woods elected not to run after being appointed to the seat two years ago.

Vying for the District A, Position 1 spot held by Woods will be Lajuana Polk and Carol B. Spinks while Byrum's District B, Position 3 spot will have Larry Crawford running against Dr. Barbara Jean Fitzhugh. Early Voting continues through May 16. Election Day is May 21.

The City of Bolivar remains the only municipality in Hardeman County to not follow the Federal Election schedule of elections in even numbered years. A change could save the city as much as \$10,000 per year, according to figures obtained from the Hardeman County Election Commission.

Should You Borrow from Your 401(k)?

If you work for a business that offers a 401(k) plan, consider yourself fortunate, because a 401(k), with its tax advantages and variety of investment options, is a great way to save for retirement. But what if you need to tap in to your plan before you retire? Is it a good idea to borrow from your 401(k)?

To begin with, you need to determine if a loan is even available. You can only borrow from your 401(k) if you're still working for the company that offers the plan, but even so, you'll have to check with your human resources area to determine if loans are allowed. If they are, you'll want to weigh the pros and cons before taking action.

On the "pro" side, it's pretty easy to get a 401(k) loan – there's no formal loan application and no minimum credit score required. Plus, you're only borrowing from yourself, and you can generally repay the loan with automatic paycheck deductions, typically over a five-year period.

However, you'll also encounter some "cons" when taking out a 401(k) loan, particularly concerning taxes. If you had not borrowed from your 401(k), the money you took out could have been growing on a tax-deferred basis, assuming you used pre-tax dollars to fund your plan, and your withdrawals will only be taxed once. But when you borrow from your plan, you will have to repay it, along with interest, with money you've earned – and been taxed on – and then, when you withdraw it later, you'll pay taxes on it again.

Furthermore, if you leave your employer before fully repaying your loan, the outstanding balance likely will be taxable, although you may have a grace period in which to pay it off and avoid taxes.

And perhaps even more important, taking money from your 401(k), even if you repay it later, will almost certainly slow the growth potential of your account – which, in plain terms, means you may have less money available for retirement.

Of course, if you encounter an emergency, and you have nowhere else to turn, you may need to borrow from your 401(k). And some plans allow hardship withdrawals for medical expenses and other needs, although you'll still be taxed on the amount you withdraw.

But you'd probably be better off if you can prepare, well in advance, for situations in which you need immediate access to a sizable sum. One way of doing this is to build an emergency fund containing six months' to a year's worth of living expenses, with the money kept in a liquid, low-risk account. You also might find some resources in the part of your investment portfolio held outside your 401(k). For example, you can always withdraw contributions to a Roth IRA without incurring taxes (although the earnings on these contributions could be taxable if you take the money out before you're 591/2 and you've had your account less than five years).

In any case, you work hard to build your 401(k) – so, no matter where you are in life, think carefully about how you will use the

lot packed into a couple of verses, and its implications are severe. Like most of Jesus' teaching, there is no "third way." Truth is either this way or that way: not both/and or somewhere in between.

He said, "Enter by the narrow gate. For the gate is wide and the way is easy that leads to destruction, and those who enter by it are many. For the gate is narrow and the way is hard that leads to life, and those who find it are few" (Matthew 7:13-14). Obviously, Jesus is using the concrete image of a gateway and walkway to teach us spiritual truths.

Think about your home router. It is a technological gateway to the internet. Once you have access to the router, then there are billions of possible ways you could traverse the world of cyberspace. That's the wide and easy way. There are lots of options, and all but one of those options lead to the destruction of your computer.

Now assume that you should only access one webpage (www. thenarrowway.com). That site saves your computer and provides you with everything needed. Similarly, that is what Jesus is saying. The "wide" way leads to destruction, but the second "narrow" way leads

In this week's lesson, there is a to the opposite: to salvation and a fulfilling life.

> According to Craig Keener, "most first-century Jewish people believed that they were saved by virtue of descent from Abraham" (Matthew Commentary, 250). Likewise, some people today think that belonging to a certain Christian group is the "way" for salvation.

However, according to Jesus, both ideas are deceptive. That isn't what the narrow way means. For example, consider John 14:6; "I am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." Therefore, it is not genetic pedigree nor religious affiliation that puts someone onto the narrow path that leads to life. Jesus is THE gateway leading to

Although true, once we enter the narrow gateway of trusting Christ alone, then the straight and narrow way does entail, in some ways, a more restricted way of life. It includes godly temperament, mental chastity, integrity, not retaliating, sacrificial giving and so on (Matthew 5-7). Relative few choose the right gate and, consequently, this is the hard and narrow path.





TN Dept of Health Issues Measles Alert

The Tennessee Department of Health continues to investigate a case of measles in a resident of East Tennessee and notify people who may have been exposed to the illness through contact with the patient. This investigation has identified two locations the patient visited in Tennessee where members of the public may have been exposed to measles.

People who were at any of these locations during the dates and times specified below may have been exposed to measles:

• Mapco, 200 Browns Ferry Road, Chattanooga

April 11, 2019 from 7:30 p.m. − 10 p.m.

• Speedway, 2148 North Charles G. Seivers Blvd., Clinton

April 12, 2019 from 5:30 p.m. – 8 p.m.

Anyone who visited any of these locations during the specified times and dates should do the following:

· Check your vaccination status. Locate your immunization records. People who have had two doses of the measles-mumps-rubella or MMR vaccine are protected against measles and need to take no further action in regard to an exposure to measles. Contact your health care provider if you cannot locate your immunization records and/or are not certain if you are immune to measles.

• If you are not immune to measles, watch for symptoms of the illness. Measles symptoms may include fever, runny nose, body aches, watery eyes and white spots in the mouth. Several days after these symptoms start, a red, spotty rash typically begins on the face and spreads over the body. Symptoms may develop any time in the 21 days following exposure to the illness. Nearly one in three measles patients will develop ear infections, diarrhea or

• If you develop measles symptoms, stay home and contact your health care provider. Those with symptoms of measles should first call a health care provider to make arrangements to visit a health care facility before going to a health care center in order to prevent further exposure of others to the illness.

"Most people in Tennessee are vaccinated against measles and are protected against this illness," said TDH State Epidemiologist Tim Jones, MD. "This appearance of measles is a reminder about the importance of vaccines in protecting our population, and we urge everyone who has not been vaccinated to do so now to protect themselves, their families, their coworkers and their communities.'

At this time TDH has confirmed one case of measles in Tennessee this year.

TN Dept of Health Used for Scam Attempts

The Hardeman County Health Department has been notified of a potential scam in which people are contacted by telephone by a caller claiming to have medical test information. The calls appear on caller ID to come from the Hardeman County Health Department.

The scam involves calls to potential victims from a number that displays as the Hardeman County Health Department. The calls are automated messages stating to have disease testing results for a person in the household. The calls ask potential victims to call back to confirm information, which may include requesting personal information from those

The health department does not contact people by automated phone messages to provide medical test results or request personal information such as health insurance information, and warns everyone not to share any personal information in this manner. Patients who have made appointments for services at a local health department may receive an automated call to remind them of their appointment, but these calls will not ask for insurance information or other personal details. Health department representatives do not contact people who are not patients to request such information.

The Hardeman County Health Department has notified law enforcement about this matter. Anyone with questions or concerns about an unauthorized release of or request for health insurance or other personal information should contact his or her local law enforcement agency.

If consumers believe they have been the victim of a scam, the division urges them to report what happened to federal or state agencies. Contact the Tennessee Division of Consumer Affairs at 1-800-342-8385 or 615-741-4737.

been fortunate enough to have some great senior softball players. This year has been special, though. These seniors embraced the leadership role. I never once had to ask them to step up and lead.


"Bailee Barnes has been our back bone. She's confronted the team when things weren't great and been our biggest fan when we were on a roll.





Container Gardening Makes for Easy Gardening

Gardening in small places, or containers, has been around for thousands of years. Seniors may have down-sized to smaller yards or apartments and no longer need large expanses of space for gardening. A balcony, a deck, or even an area that is paved near your door makes a welcoming spot for a container. In recent years, both men and women have added gardening to their list of hobbies during retirement.

Thomas Jefferson, our third United States President was known as an avid gardener. Jefferson said, "When I'm in my garden, I'm a young man again." It's true! Those who garden spend time in the fresh air and sunshine. You're exercising the entire body as you pull, stoop, bend, lift and drag.

Gather these materials: Large container, with drainage holes, Pebbles or small stones, Drip tray, Potting soil, and Annuals.

Follow these easy steps:

- 1. Containers can be plastic, wood, clay, metal or other materials. Drainage holes are essential.
- 2. Set a drip tray under the pot if used indoors or where the pot can do damage
- 3. Before filling with soil, position a heavy container in its permanent location.
- 4. Cover holes with small stones or broken pottery.
- 5. Fill with a good quality potting soil.
- 6. Loosen roots of transplants and insert in the container.
- 7. Choose annuals in three categories...one for height, one to cluster in the middle, and one to over-hang the rim and cascade downward.
- 8. Water thoroughly and place in a shady location for a few days until plant is established. This transition period from being in a small container helps the plant adjust to a larger one. Tips for Success:
- 1. Plants do better in large containers with plenty of soil for roots to expand.
- 2. Cover the bottom with a paper coffee filter to keep soil from filling up the holes.
- 3. Know the sun/shade, moisture requirements, height/width when mature, and bloom time of the annuals you select.
- 4. Give young transplants room to grow. They will soon fill and overflow the container.
- 5. Over-watering will kill the plants. However, don't allow the soil to become too dry. Test for moisture levels by rubbing a bit of soil between your thumb and finger.

6. Container plants can be moved from one location to another.

Sidebar: Annuals for Container Gardening; Begonia, Coleus, Geranium, Impatiens, Lobelia, Marigold, Nasturtium, Pansy (spring or fall), Ornamental, Pepper, Petunia, Verbena, and Vinca vine.

Container gardening is rewarding, inexpensive, and requires a small amount of time. Place a pot of annuals near your front door was a way to welcome family and friends.
