# Who You Gonna Call?

Eight municipal mayors will decide the fate and shape of the attempt to move Hardeman County 911 and the Hardeman County Dispatch from county administration to its own entity and to a new location.

"The county wants to be a partner like everyone else," explained Hardeman County Mayor Jimmy Sain to the mayors in attendance at the Hardeman County Joint Economic and Community Development (JECD) Board meeting on November 25.

Since the creation of central dispatch by the county in 2011, payment for the services have fallen on Bolivar and Hardeman County government, while the rest of the county was not charged.

"They signed it," said Sain, noting that mayors Curtis Lane (Grand Junction), Ricky Ayers (Hickory Valley), and Joe Jones (Toone), were signees on the document that put the 2011 plan into place, but at the same time noting that no city but Bolivar has paid into the system since.

Sain asked the mayors (with the exception of Mayor Julian McTizic of Bolivar) to decide how to divide the \$37,950 that would satisfy the estimated bill above what three other entities have agreed to pay.

Sain said that the county would be responsible for an estimated \$211,000 (39%) each year, while the City of Bolivar would pay about \$180,000 (32%) of the total. The District would pay 22%.

Sain said the cities who wish to opt out would be forced to provide their own dispatch, and attempted to persuade the cities to see the fiscal hardship of going on their own.

"You couldn't hire one-fourth of an employee for what you could pay for this."

The Hardeman County 911 District, would construct a building adjacent to the current 911 office to house dispatch.

According to Sain, the 911 board has \$1.4 million in the bank.

"They are sitting on that money. But they can't pay for ongoing costs, just buildings and equipment," he explained.

Sain distributed a document that said of the

 25,039 calls handled by dispatch as either received from the public or as requests from law enforcement, Bolivar had 12,990, Hardeman County had 7,062, Whiteville 2,364, Grand Junction 1,446, Middleton 679, Toone 325, Hickory Valley 171, and Hornsby only had two calls reported.  
 Currently, the responsibility for dispatch lies with Hardeman County Sheriff John Doolen. If an agreement is reached among the mayors, the 911 board, appointed by Sain and approved by the county commission, would be the responsible agency.  
 Sain said he hoped a separate building would help dispatchers avoid distractions that currently occur at the Hardeman County Criminal Justice Center, with visitors and deputies. Also, Sain said the small room used for dispatch is not heated or cooled properly.  
 Mayors attending the meeting were Sain, McTizic, Lane, Jones, and Aubrey Phillips of Whiteville. Not in attendance were Jackie Cox of Middleton, Jim Daniel of Saulsberry, Ricky Ayers of Hickory Valley, and Mac Carter of Hornsby. All but Jim Daniel are being asked to sign the agreement.

# Food Giant Big Star Stay-at-Home Gourmet

## Thanksgiving Leftovers? Try...Stuffed Acorn Squash with Sausage, Apples and Cranberries

### Ingredients

- 2 small/med acorn squash
- 1 tsp organic coconut oil or ghee, plus sea salt, for roasting
- 1 Tbsp organic coconut oil or ghee, plus more, if needed
- 1 lb pork sausage bulk, sugar-free for Whole30
- 1 small onion diced
- 2 celery stalks diced
- 2 cloves garlic minced
- 1 small apple diced (pink lady is my favorite for cooking)
- 1 Tbsp fresh sage leaves minced\*\*
- 1 Tbsp fresh rosemary leaves minced1\*\*
- 1 Tbsp fresh thyme leaves minced\*\*
- 1/3 cup dried cranberries
- 1/3 cup raw pecans chopped, toasted prior to adding, if desired
- sea salt and pepper to taste
- fresh parsley for garnish if desired

**Instructions:** First, roast the squash. Preheat your oven to 425 degrees F and line a large baking sheet with foil or parchment paper. Cut each squash open, lengthwise, the scoop out the seeds/strings with a spoon, leaving a "bowl" in the center. Brush the top of each squash half with melted coconut oil (or ghee) and sprinkle lightly with sea salt, then place face down on prepared baking sheet, and roast for 25-30 minutes, or until top of the squash feels soft when you press on it. Roasting time will vary depending on the size of your squash. You can remove, check for doneness (it should be soft enough to eat) and return the the oven for a few more minutes if necessary.

While the squash roasts, prepare the stuffing. Heat a med/large skillet over med-hi heat and add a Tbsp coconut oil or ghee to melt. Add your sausage, breaking up lumps with a wooden spoon to evenly brown. Once browned, remove from heat and transfer to a plate, leaving fat in the skillet.

Return skillet to medium heat and add the onions and celery, stirring while cooking to soften, about 3 minutes. Add the garlic and cook another minute, stirring to avoid browning. Add the diced apples, fresh herbs and salt and pepper to taste, stir to combine. Cook for another 1-2 minutes to allow apples to soften. Then add the cranberries, pecans, plus browned sausage back to the skillet, lower heat to med/low and continue to cook another 2 minutes to blend flavors.

Once ready to stuff the squash, preheat your broiler and arrange the 4 squash halves face-up on the baking sheet. Scoop the stuffing mixture into each one, adding as much as you want to each. You might have leftover stuffing depending on how large your squash are and how much you fill them.

Once filled, place the baking sheet under the broiler and broil until tops of stuffing and squash are nicely browned, 5 minutes or so. Garnish with fresh minced parsley, serve and enjoy!

# FAITH

## Prayers of Paul Part 3 by Jeff Capshaw

This is the third column in a series of brief reflections on Paul's prayers, most of which contain some offerings of thankfulness to God. As noted in prior installments, the contents of his prayers focus on either the spiritual characteristics of his readers and/or their spiritual needs and well-being. Accordingly, hardly any topic could be more relevant for the Thanksgiving season.

This week's reflection is selected from the prayer of Paul in First Thessalonians 1:2-3. He writes, "we give thanks to God always for all of you, constantly mentioning you in our prayers, remembering before our God and Father your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ." The very brevity of this prayer lends itself to slighting its importance and instructions. Like the last two prayers discussed, this week's lessons also centers on three key ideas.

But first, notice the scope of the prayer. As is common, he pastorally reminds the Thessalonian Christians of the constancy of his prayers for all of them. Paul had

no favorites, rather he was constantly concerned for every member of the body of Christ and all of its local manifestations. The three foci in this prayer of thanks are (1) their "work of faith," (2) their "labor of love," and (3) their "steadfastness of hope" in the Lord Jesus Christ.

Here is found these "x of y" phrases common in Paul's letters, and it isn't always clear how to interpret them. Take, for example, the "x of y" phrase: "the love of God." Possible interpretations include God's love for someone, someone's love for God, love coming from God, love caused by God and so on. The three phrases here also are somewhat ambiguous, but many New Testament authorities interpret these "x of y" phrases with a sort of causal import.

In other words, it is the Thessalonians' faith that impels them to work for the Gospel and the Kingdom of God, not the converse. Similarly, it is their love for Christ and his people that motivates them to labor in the Kingdom. Thirdly, it is their hope in Jesus that gives

them the ability to hold steadfast in their faith, even in the midst of hardships and trials.

According to St. Chrysostom, "for to give thanks to God for them is the act of one testifying to how they have advanced in the faith. Not only are the Thessalonians praised by Paul, but Paul thanks God for them, as though God himself had accomplished everything."

Although we should not take material blessings for granted this Thanksgiving season, perhaps we could set aside some of those concerns and thank God for the spiritual blessings in our own lives and also for spiritual blessings in the lives of our brothers and sisters in Christ. After all, as Chrysostom says above, it is God who has accomplished all of it.
