"I got the idea when multiple charities were asking for financial support from the city," he explained. "And my belief is that tax dollars shouldn't go to non-profits. I personally support many of them, but it's not fair to force the citizens to have their taxes go to them." McTizic invites local charities to sell tables for the event, with the

charities raising their own funds through ticket sales. Last year, says McTizic, the money the groups received was more than what they sold "Last year the money went to More than a Few Good Men, Toys

for Tots, a Healthier You, The Restoration Center, Bolivar-Hardeman County Boxing Club, and the Hardeman County Wall Builders," said McTizic, saying almost \$5,000 ended up in their accounts.

This year, More than a Few Good Men, Bolivar-Hardeman County Boxing Club, The Nehemiah Project, and Toys for Tots chose to participate in the event.

"I think it is a great thing that the charities go out and work for their donations and we are glad to provide them something to sell."

McTizic says he is a small part of all of the things that make it possible, saying it is a community-wide effort.

"The thing that makes this happen is the people in the city," he said. "Without the caterers, event sponsors, volunteers, and those who con-



tributed to the silent auction, we wouldn't have anything left for the charities if we didn't get a ton of support from businesses and individuals in the city."

The evening will include dinner and live entertainment from the Courtney Little Band. Dress is formal. There will be a silent auction. At press time, the event was sold out.

The event is not funded in any way by the City of Bolivar. Groups interested in the 2020 Mayor's Ball should contact McTizic.

The Mayor's Ball is Saturday, November 9 at 7:00 p.m. at the Hope Street Building (206 Hope Street) in Bolivar.

#### The Gas Problem, Part III

A Hardeman County Sheriff's Investigator had to reach into his own pocket to get home this week when his gasoline card issued by a company called Wex through the Hardeman County Sheriff's Department was canceled while he was on his trip.

The Wex card, good at numerous gas stations all over the country, was canceled November 1, due to a three-month lapse in payments.

The bills for July, August, September and October were turned in to the Hardeman County Mayor's office, each within four days of the close of each month, according to dated copies obtained from the Hardeman County Sheriff's Department.

A copy of the July bill has a note that says, "as of 9/3/19 this is not paid. Mayor would not approve."

But while cards held by the sheriff's department were canceled by Wex, three other accounts held by other Hardeman County departments are paid in full and current, according to Wex.

A spokesperson for the sheriff's department said they complied with a request from Hardeman County Mayor Jimmy Sain to stop using the cards in the county, but Hardeman County Sheriff John Doolen says it's not that simple when deputies or employees have to go out of the county on business.

"In the county, we don't have a problem. We are well taken care of. But we need a way to get our people home, if they are out on a job or at a conference that requires them to travel," said Doolen. "But with the card being canceled, we don't have a way right now."

Doolen added the deputies no longer have the cards in their possession at all times, but are given them on a need basis when the circumstances of their job duties requires it.

The invoice total as of October 31, shows a balance of \$1,429.96, which includes late charges of \$40.82 for October added to the \$115.75 spent during that month.

Hardeman County Mayor Jimmy Sain said that he could not comment on any issue involving the sheriff.

In October, the settlement of the lawsuit filed by the Sheriff versus the Mayor stated, in part: The county agrees that when the sheriff's department requisitions expenditures for department expenses, the mayor and his staff shall approve such expenditures and provide checks to pay for the same on the Friday following submission by the sheriff's department, provided however that the mayor's office shall have at least fortyeight (48) hours to process these. The county agrees that such decisions are within the Constitutional and Statutory powers of the sheriff.

The September invoice was sent to the mayor's office on October 2, according to the copies of emails obtained from the Hardeman County Sheriff's Department.

The Hardeman County Commission is scheduled to meet November 19 at the Hardeman County Courthouse, where the sheriff is expected to bring his first formal report, as the County Superintendent of Roads and the Hardeman County School Superintendent do as well.







### **Braised Collard Greens**

3 meaty ham bones (about 3 pounds total)

- **Ingredients** 1 1/2 pounds fresh collard greens
- 4 cups water
- 1 large onion, halved and sliced 1/4 cup sugar
- 1 teaspoon crushed red pepper

#### 1/4 teaspoon salt

**Directions** Wash collard greens thoroughly. Cut off and discard stems. Coarsely chop collard greens. Set

aside. Add ham bones to a 5- to 6-quart slow cooker. Add the water, onion, sugar, crushed red pepper, and salt. Top with collard greens.

Cover and cook on low-heat setting for about 6 hours or on high-heat setting for about 3 hours or

until collard greens are tender. Remove ham bones; cool slightly. When ham bones are cool enough to handle, cut meat off bones.

To serve, use a slotted spoon to spoon greens mixture into a bowl, draining off any excess liquid.

Chop meat; discard bones. Stir meat into mixture in slow cooker.

Frances Ward was a champion of Veterans and Veterans Day, chairing the annual event for ten years. She passed away this year. In her honor, we will run her notice as a salute to her.

#### FRANCES WARD MAY 3, 1930 ~ JANUARY 9, 2019

Mrs. Frances Ward, age 88 of Toone, Tennessee passed away Wednesday morning, January 9, 2019 at Jackson-Madison County General Hospital.

She was born in Toone and was the daughter of the late Alva Porter Ozment and Pearl May Young Ozment Marsh. A 1948 graduate of Bolivar Central High School, she married Mr. William Thomas "Rick" Ward on December 31, 1955. They were married for 51 years at the time of his passing on November 22, 2007. Additionally, she was preceded in death by her brother Guy Thomas "Buddy" Ozment and step-father, William R. Marsh.

Mrs. Ward had lived in Memphis, Ft. Campbell, KY, Germany, Fayetteville, NC, Panama and Ft. Sam Houston as she followed her husband during his career as a First Sergeant in the US Army. She returned to live in Toone in 1970 upon his retirement.

Mrs. Frances had attended Draughon Business College and was a sales manager for Sears Roebuck Co. from 1970-1993.

After her retirement, she volunteered at Whiteville Elementary School where she worked closely with Dr. Yvonne Allen for over 20 years. Mrs. Ward was active as a teacher's assistant, substitute teacher and served as chairperson for multiple programs at the school. She had a great impact on the lives of many children. She also did volunteer work at Rose Hill Middle School, Liberty High School, AB Hill School in Memphis at JCT Middle School. She worked with James Shaw and coordinated summer youth basketball programs for those from Hardeman and surrounding counties.

Mrs. Ward was chairperson of the Hardeman County Veterans Day Program for over 10 years. A non-partisan political activist, she was a member of the local NAACP serving on their executive board and coordinating their annual banquet. She also enjoyed helping her daughter with projects with the Jackson Symphony League.

A member of Toone Baptist Church, she had been Sunday School Superintendent, a Sunday School Teacher and leader in various youth groups including Team Kids. She also enjoyed attending Union Hill Baptist Church in Whiteville, TN.

Services were 1 p.m. Tuesday, January 15, 2019 at Shackelford Funeral Directors chapel in Bolivar with Dr. Yvonne Allen, Lieutenant General (Retired) John H. Castellaw, Reverend Anthony Vaughan and State Representative Johnny Shaw officiating. Burial was in Rainey Cemetery in Toone. Casket bearers were James Shaw, Commander Sergeant Major (Retired) James E. Spencer, Todd Pulse, Josh Pulse, Bobby Boyle, Lieutenant General (Retired) John H. Castellaw and Sergeant Major Larry Prince.

She is survived by her daughter, Vicki Ward Ridenhour and her husband, Perry, of Jackson; a sister-in-law, Diane Ward of Whiteville, NC; and several nieces, nephews and cousins.








#### Take Greater Control of Your 401(k)

If your employer offers a 401(k) or similar plan, you've got a powerful retirement-savings tool at your disposal. And yet, how well you do with your 401(k) depends greatly on your choices and actions. What steps can you take to maximize the benefits of your plan?

For starters, be aware that your 401(k) may come with what might be called "standard" features, which you should review to determine their applicability to your situation. These features include the following:

Default deferral rate – When you take a job, your employer may automatically enroll you in the company's 401(k) plan and assign a "default" contribution rate – the percentage of your salary you will put in to your 401(k). Many companies choose a default rate of 3 percent, although, in recent years, there has been a move toward higher rates, even up to 6 percent. Unfortunately, too many people don't question their default rate, which could be a problem, especially if it's at the lower end. If you want your 401(k) to ultimately provide you with as many financial resources as possible, you will likely need to contribute as much as you can afford. So, be aware of your default rate, and, if you can possibly afford it, increase that level. And every time your salary goes up, consider boosting your contributions.

Investment mix - When you're automatically enrolled in your 401(k), the amount you might initially contribute isn't the only "off the shelf" feature – you also might be assigned a default investment option. One common default investment is known as a target-date fund, which generally includes a mix of stocks, bonds and cash instruments. Your 401(k) plan provider, or your human resources area, will typically base this mix on your age and projected retirement date. Usually, this fund will grow more conservative over time, reflecting the need to reduce the portfolio's risk as you get nearer to retirement. However, you may not be obligated to stick with the default option. Most 401(k) plans usually offer several options from which to choose. Ideally, you'd want to spread your investment dollars among a mix of these investments to give yourself the greatest growth potential, given your risk tolerance and time horizon. And always keep in mind that your 401(k) is a long-term vehicle, designed to help you prepare for a retirement that may be decades away. Consequently, try to discipline yourself to look past the inevitable short-term drops in your portfolio.

Matching contributions – If your employer offers a 401(k) matching contribution, you should certainly take advantage of it. Consider this: If you employer matches 50 cents for every dollar you contribute, up to 6 percent of your pay, and you contribute the full 6 percent, you would, in effect, be receiving a 3 percent pay raise (50 percent of 6 percent). That's like a 50 percent rate of return even before you invest this added money.

Taking control of your 401(k) in the ways described above can help go a long way toward getting the most from your plan - and, as a result, may help get you closer to supporting the retirement lifestyle you've envisioned.







### FAITH

#### The New Heaven and Earth

by Jeff Capshaw

Most recently, the topic here has centered upon newness, particularly as it relates to Christians. Believers start with the new birth. They are also part of the new creation God intends for his world. Believers should also put on the "new man," die to the "old man," and mature in their faith.

The phrase, new heaven and earth, comes from the last chapter of the last book in the Bible. In Revelation 21:1, the Apostle John says, "then I saw a new heaven and a new earth, for the first heaven and the first earth had passed away, and the sea was no more." Just like all the "newness" themes recently discussed here, the idea of a new heaven and earth represents the reversal of the curse which resulted from the Fall and is recounted in Genesis 3.

When that curse pronounced, however, the Lord also promised a "curse reverser." In Genesis 3:15, there is what some scholars call the *Protevangelium*: the first mention of the Gospel. "The Lord God said to the serpent (v. 14) . . . I will put enmity

inside and wreak havoc.





# **State Releases ACT Sta**

The Tennessee Department of Education announced a total of 63,829 students from Tennessee's 2019 graduating class took the ACT, earning an average composite score of 20. This represents a 98 percent participation rate, which is an all-time high in the state. Of those students, 41.7 percent earned a score of 21 or higher, making them eligible for the HOPE scholarship.

The class of 2019 was the third cohort to have access to a free opportunity to retake the ACT. The state's investment in the ACT retake has yielded promising results. Fifty percent of students who participated in the ACT Senior Retake Day increased their composite score from their junior year in 2018. Additionally, 3,825 seniors raised their composite score to a 21 or higher, allowing them to access more than \$61 million in HOPE Scholarship funds. Tennessee is the first and only state to offer this opportunity on a statewide

"More Tennessee students than ever before are taking advantage of the ACT and ACT retake," said Commissioner Schwinn. "It is critical that we continue to increase access to these high-quality opportunities for all students, no matter where they live. This is one way that we will build a foundation to set all students on a path to success."

The average ACT score for the public school graduating class of 2019 in each subject area was: 19.6 in English, 0.1 point decrease from 2018, 19.4 in math, 0.1 point decrease, 20.5 in reading, 0.2 point decrease; and 20.0 in science, 0.3

The department uses students' best ACT score, meaning that if a student took the ACT multiple times, the score included in today's results reflect his or her highest score. This is different than ACT's calculation, which reports results based on the last score a student received, and also includes results from private school students.

"Tennessee continues to show a strong commitment to advancing student achievement," Commissioner Schwinn continued. "As more students take this assessment, we are more aware than ever before of the diverse needs of our state. Our new strategic plan, Best for All, will strengthen supports around high-quality materials, the whole child, and our educators and leaders."

ACT results serve as a national-normed measure to indicate college and career readiness. Under Tennessee's accountability model, earning a 21 on the ACT is one of the four ways that students can indicate that they are prepared for life after high school and a seamless entry into postsecondary education, the workplace, or the military. While ACT measures the culmination of what students have learned throughout their K-12 education, the state's TCAP assessment complements ACT as a deeper, standards-based assessment that looks at what students learn annually and provides teachers and families with feedback each year. Together, ACT and TCAP help to identify if students are ready for their chosen path after high school.




