EMS/Fire Annex Back on Track

The new facility for the Hardeman County Emergency Medical Services has been a long time in coming, but at least Hardeman County Mayor Jimmy Sain can see the light at the end of the tunnel.

In August of 2015, the Hardeman County Commission approved the building of a new ambulance service that will share space with the Bolivar Fire Department at the corner of Lucy Black Road and Highway 64. Later that year, the City of Bolivar agreed to pay a portion of the cost

as the facility will also house an annex for the Bolivar Fire Department.

In 2015, Sain predicted the building would be done in early 2016, but continual changes to the plans that needed to be approved each time by the state fire marshal have added to the time needed to complete the job.

"To begin with, we did not get the plans we asked for from the architect," said Sain, who had to go out of the county for plans due to the designation of the facility as a category four, or the same as a

hospital. "They (TLM Associates of Jackson) put things in there that we didn't want and added a lot of expense to the job. And when we have made changes, taking out unneeded items from the plans, it has added to the time and we have had to get the plans reapproved each time we changed anything."

Sain compared the building of the EMS Facility to the construction of the Criminal Justice Center a few years back.

"There are things in the CJC that we didn't need and we don't use. This is a hands-on project, not a turnkey job. We know what we want and what we are going to get and we don't want anything more. There's not going to be anything in there that we didn't ask for. But having them take it out has added a lot of delay to the project. There is a lot at the CJC that was un-

necessary and we aren't going to do that again."

Sain estimates the price of the facility will be somewhere between \$800,000 and a million dollars. Sain also expressed displeasure with the architectural firm, stating he would never consider using them again.

Sain stressed that services will not be decreased due to the cost of the building.

"As we have for the past 20 years or so, we keep three ambulances ready at all times. We keep a paramedic aboard each ambulance. To be considered Advanced Life Support, you have to keep a paramedic on each one. We have that in place," he said. "When I came in as mayor in 2014, we started looking for ways to cut the budget. The ambulances had to sit

Sheriff Dept. Helps Serve Justice

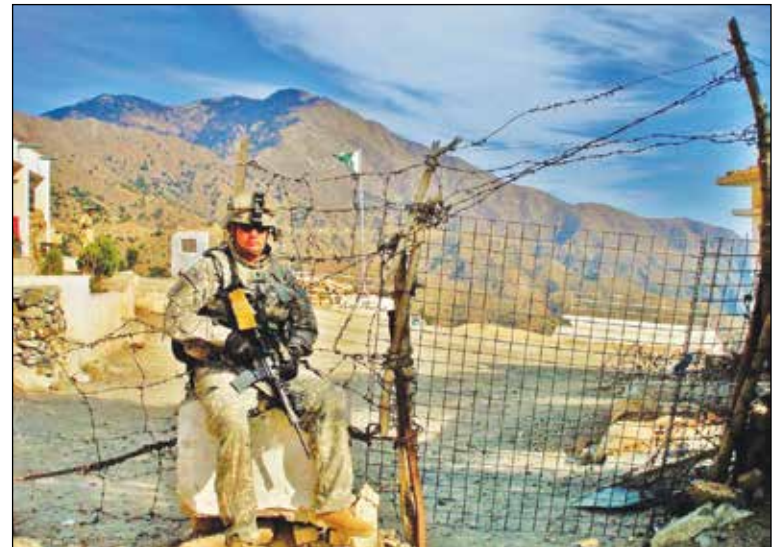
An Idaho man arrested in Hardeman County in 2016 was sentenced to a total of 240 months in federal prison for being a felon in possession of a machine gun and seven other firearms in Tennessee; and for possession of methamphetamines with intent to distribute and possessing a firearm during a drug trafficking offense in Idaho, according to a release from U.S. District Attorney D. Michael Dunavant's office.

According to information presented in court, on February 6, 2016, members of the Boise Police Department in Idaho encountered Henry McGuire after he committed a traffic violation. During the stop, a K9 officer sensed the presence of narcotics inside the vehicle and officers observed a semi-automatic pistol, tucked between the driver seat and center console. Upon searching the car, officers located a plastic bin containing marijuana, a digital scale, clear plastic bags, methamphetamines, heroin, ammunition and several large wads of cash. Upon search of McGuire's person, officers located a glass pipe containing white residue, along with methamphetamines, heroin, and over \$1,500 in cash. McGuire admitted that he sold approximately one-half pound of methamphetamines every couple of days during the preceding year. The Boise Police Department seized approximately \$16,851 in cash and a Chevrolet Impala. McGuire was arrested and released on bail in Idaho and was later indicted federally in the District of Idaho.

On April 5, 2016, the United States Marshal's Service was notified that Henry McGuire was an Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms (AFT) fugitive

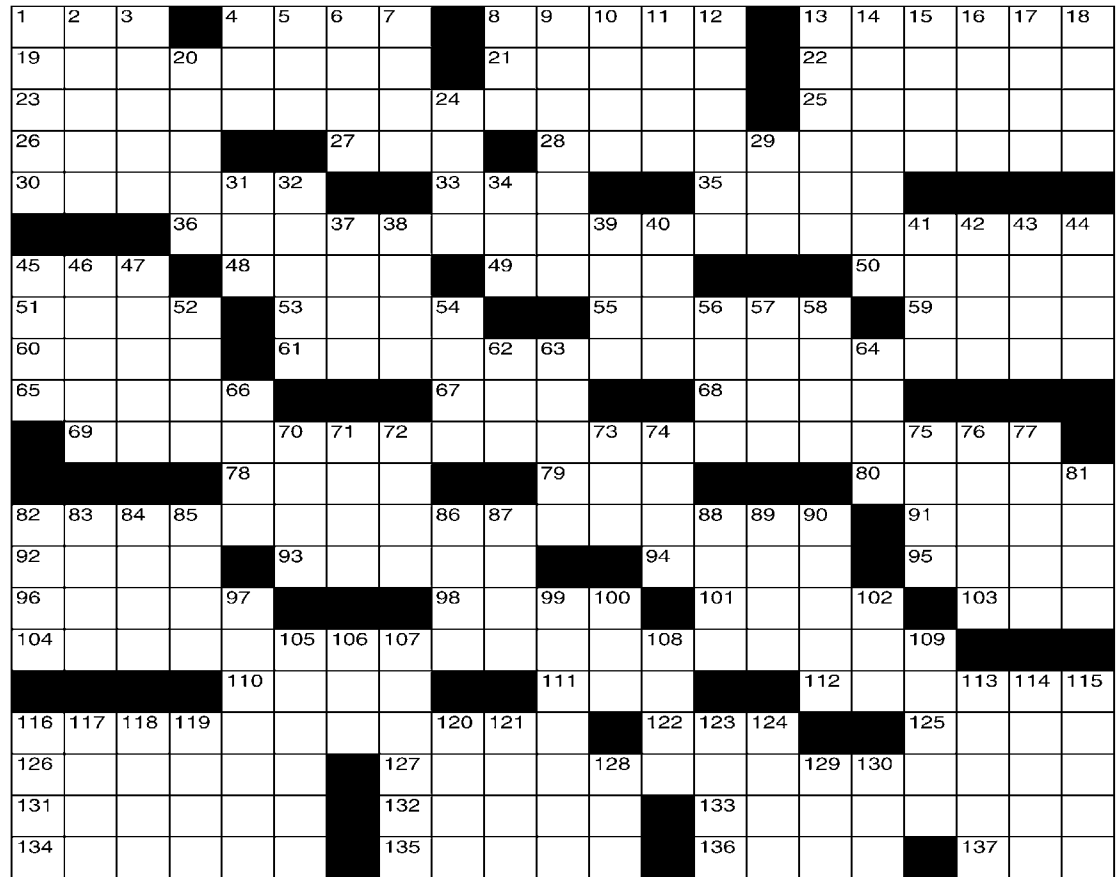

The word 'suicide' is a word from Latin, sui, "ones self", and "caedere", 'to kill'. It is defined as the killing of one's self with malice aforethought, while in the possession of a sound mind. In some cultures, it is viewed as an honorable practice of terminating one's life. The ancient Greeks considered it an act of freedom. One of Japan's foremost authority on this topic, Kenshiro Ohara, declares suicide is evidence of sincerity. When a Japanese mother prepares to commit suicide, she first usually murders her children. This act brings praise since children are considered parts of their parents, and to leave them motherless would be cruel (*The New York Times*, April 30, 1973, p. 10).

What if in all testimony, by all who knew him he or she were not in their right mind? Would this be considered the same taboo act "to kill one's self"? It is certainly true that people can feel mental distress or injury. This distress is thought to be caused in part by childhood abuse, trauma or neglect, severe or long term stress or the death of someone close to you. The claim is made that the key is to be aware of how often one feels the distress, how bad it gets and how long it lasts (Abby Aronowitz, PhD). It is further believed that some lifestyle choices may contribute to changes in our mental biochemistry altering the balance of neurotransmitters essential to healthy function and communication. Also, that this imbalance may trigger parts of the unconscious connected to fears (often irrational) and or from childhood. Thus maybe Freud was correct in that the subconscious is real (transparencynow.com).

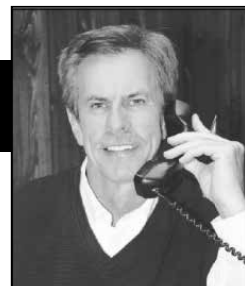

Hardeman County Remembered by Lisa Coleman

When you visit the National Mall in Washington D.C., an engraving on one of the Korean War monuments is an eloquent summation of all that all of our veterans have done. The marker simply reads, "Freedom is not free." In just a few days we observe a very important holiday in our country - Veterans' Day on November 11 - to honor the ones who have defended our freedom.

I am descended from many who served in various branches of our military; so far I have found family members who fought as far back as the War of 1812. I am proud to be the daughter of U. S. Army veteran, Specialist 5th Class, James Albert Coleman, shown here in a 1962 photo. I am proud to be an "Army baby"; Dad tells me he remembers hearing on the radio the day after I was born that it was Veterans Day and the Marine Corps birthday, so the military and I have been together all of my life. My sweet North Carolina cousin, James Kestler, was an Army veteran who landed on the beaches at Normandy in World War II. This photo is James just before he left to go to Europe. Another dear cousin, W. L. Edwards, served in the Army in World War II and later in Korea with the Tennessee National Guard 278th Infantry. That's him at the snowy Lincoln Memorial in the 1940's.

In 1921 an unknown World War I American soldier was buried at Arlington National Cemetery. Similar ceremonies were held in England and France where an unknown soldier from each country was buried in their respective country's highest place of honor; in England this was a Westminster Abbey and at the Arc de Triomphe in France. All of these memorial ceremonies were held at 11:00 a.m. on November 11 to recognize and remember the end of World War I at 11:00 a.m. on 11/11/1918. The observances continued on what would become known as "Armistice Day".


After World War II, many cities and towns began to organize "Veterans Day" events, and in 1954, President Dwight Eisenhower signed a proclamation declaring November 11 as Veterans Day. Each year on November 11 at 11:00 a.m., the national Veterans Day ceremony is held in Arlington National Cemetery and it is led by the guardians of the Tomb of the Unknowns, the Army's 3rd U.S. Infantry (also known as The Old Guard).

Thank you, Dad, thank you, James, thank you W.L., and thank you to all of our veterans for being the protectors of all of our freedoms. Y'all are always heroes to me.

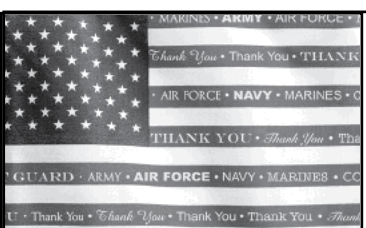

Strength – Since the start of this long rally, the stock market has produced an average annualized gain of 15.5% per year.

While these figures are impressive, they aren't necessarily predictive – so how much longer can this bull market continue to "stampede"? No one can say for sure, but there's no mandatory expiration date for bull markets – in fact, they don't generally die of old age, but typically expire either because of a recession or the bursting of a bubble, such as the "dot.com" bubble of 2000 or the housing bubble of 2007. And right now, most market experts don't see either event on the near-term horizon.

Still, this doesn't mean you should necessarily expect an uninterrupted streak of big gains. Some signs point to greater market volatility and lower returns. To navigate this changing landscape, think about these suggestions:

Consider rebalancing your portfolio. If appropriate, you may want to rebalance your investment mix to ensure you have a reasonable percentage of stocks – to help provide the growth you need to achieve your goals – and enough fixed-income vehicles, such as bonds, to help reduce your portfolio's vulnerability to market volatility and potential short-term downturns.

Look beyond U.S. borders. At any given time, U.S. stocks may be doing well, while international stocks are slumping – and vice versa. So, when volatility hits the U.S. markets – as it surely will, at some time – you can help reduce the impact on your portfolio if you also own some international equities. Keep in mind, though, that international investments bring some specific risks, such as currency fluctuations and foreign political and economic events.

Develop a strategy. You may want to work with a financial professional to identify a strategy to cope with a more turbulent investment atmosphere. Such a strategy can keep you from overreacting to market downturns and possibly even help you capitalize on short-term pullbacks. You could invest systematically by putting the same amount of money in the same investments each month. When prices go up, your investment dollars will buy fewer shares, and when prices drop, you'll buy more shares. And the more shares you own, the greater your potential for accumulation. However, this strategy, sometimes known as dollar cost averaging, won't guarantee a profit or protect against all losses, and you need to be willing to keep investing when share prices are declining.

During a raging bull market, it's not all that hard for anyone to invest successfully. But it becomes more challenging when the inevitable volatility and market downturns appear. Making the moves described above can help you keep moving toward your goals – even when the "bull" has taken a breather.

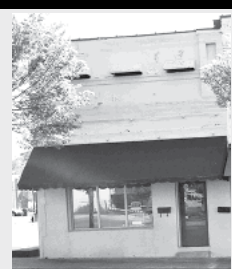

USDA Issues Safety-Net Payments to Tennessee Farmers

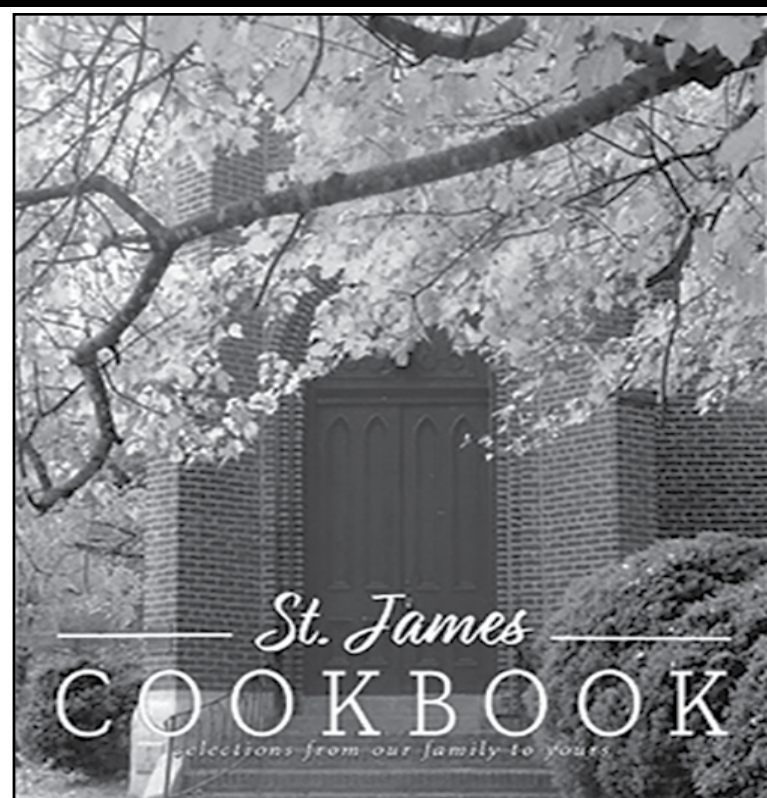
Tennessee's USDA Farm Service Agency (FSA) Acting State Executive Director (SED) Tyeisha Samples announced that approximately 29,500 Tennessee farms that enrolled in safety-net programs established by the 2014 Farm Bill will receive financial assistance for the 2016 crop year. The programs, known as Agriculture Risk Coverage (ARC) and Price Loss Coverage (PLC), are designed to protect against unexpected drops in crop prices or revenues due to market downturns.

"These safety-net programs provide help when prices and revenue fall below normal," said Acting SED Samples "Payments to corn, soybean, wheat and other crop producers are helping provide reassurance to our Tennessee farm families who are standing strong against low commodity prices compounded by unfavorable growing conditions."

Producers in most Tennessee counties have experienced a significant drop in prices or revenues below the benchmark established by the ARC or PLC program and thus, will receive payments totaling more than \$67 million. Payments related to corn, soybean, wheat, barley, canola, grain sorghum, and oats made up much of those payments. There were also payments for other crops.

"Payments by county for an eligible commodity can vary because average county yields will differ," said Acting SED Samples.

Statewide, over 25,400 farms participated in ARC-County and nearly 4,000 farms participated in PLC. More details on the price and yield information used to calculate the financing assistance from the safety-net programs is available on the FSA website at www.fsa.usda.gov/arc-plc and www.fsa.usda.gov/state.

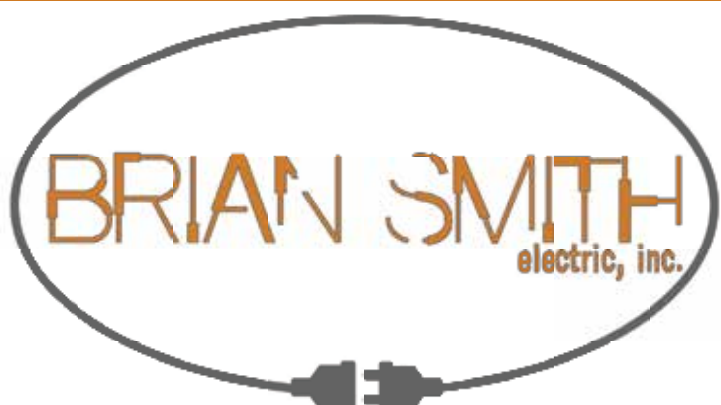

outside running all the time. But our scheduling was even worse a problem. We managed to cut about \$140,000 a year in rescheduling and reducing overtime.

Some new hires and scheduling has added to the available ambulances during peak times. "We have considered adding a fourth ambulance to be available at all times, but the number of calls don't warrant the increase."

And it's when it's most needed, according to Sain. "The most used time, believe it or not, is from 7:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. So with a supervisor and assistant director available and certified, we have four ambulances available during the day."

Surrounding counties also pitch in as well. "It's a quarter million dollars per year to add an extra available ambulance. And most of the time, 60-70% of the time, two is all you need. But there are times you need five. You have to do the best you can and we have good mutual aid agreements with McNairy and Fayette Counties. We run calls for them and they run calls for us."

Sain added the door is always open for volunteers. "In the past we have had 15 certified first responders, which are trained medical personnel that are trained and signed off on by the ambulance service. That number has dropped way down, down to six. We are in need of first responders, and we need them in every area of the county. But, it's a volunteer basis. You can't make people do it. We make it as easy as possible to get certified, we provide training for them. We want as many as we can get."

Sain said two of the front-line ambulances are new and frequent inspections of the department's operations have given them grades that place them among the top ambulance departments in West Tennessee.

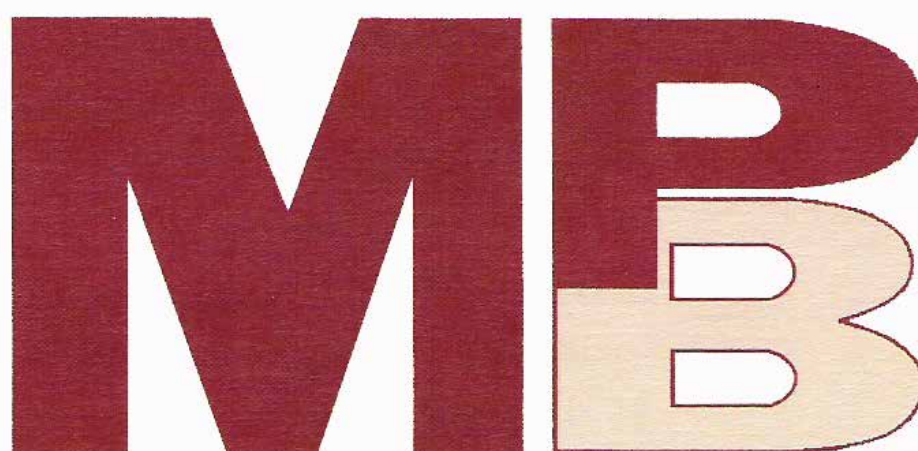

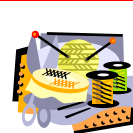

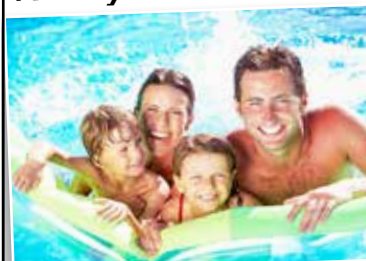
