From the Other Side of the Desk

This past week, a new park opened in Bolivar. It's in East Bolivar (see photo below) and the playground equipment is next to a green space in what was described as "a quiet neighborhood." It was quiet, serene, and peaceful. After the ribbon cutting the kids played until their parents were forced to drag them back home. During the ceremony, citizens thanked the people who made it possible, the City of Bolivar, the Parks and Recreation Department, and others. The man who never smiles actually had a tear in his eye as the kids played and the adults beamed.

That same day, Secretary of State Tre Hargett was in town, handing out money for needed tech in the form of desktop computers to the Whiteville and Bolivar libraries.

The previous week, the UT Hardeman County AgriBusiness Center opened, coinciding with the opening of the Tennessee Forest Festival in Hardeman County.

We saw a few elected officials at each one of these. But it wasn't enough. Now, no officials needed to go to all of them. But more people in government needed to go to them. At the opening of the County Agri-Business Center, only two county commissioners were there. At the opening of the park, only three city councilpersons attended. At the libraries, one had one, and the other had two.

Now people are busy. Commissioners have jobs and responsibilities outside of their elected position. Our commissioners and city council people are involved in all kinds of things beyond their work, they are leaders in other areas. But part of their responsibility, I think, is to support what is going on in the community. We didn't "hire" them to just show up once a month and make decisions. We want them out and about in the communities, to be seen and heard all over the county, but especially when there is an event in their district. They won't be able to go to everything, but not being there should be the exception, not the rule. Some people want to lead, but are not acting like leaders.

No, I'm not going to define leadership. Look it up.

Sheriff v Mayor Settled

The Hardeman County Commission met in special session on October 8 and settled the three-month standoff between the Hardeman County Sheriff's Department and the Hardeman County Commission.

The sheriff's department, who originally sought approximately \$1.4 million dollars, settled for \$102,000, which was close to the amount the Hardeman County Commission cut from their budget from 2018-2019 to 2019-2020 fiscal years.

The meeting, which was called by a petition signed by nine commissioners, was used only for the purpose of hearing the settlement hammered out by Hardeman County Attorney Charles M. Cary and Roy Herron of Dresden.

"I've done my best with it," explained Cary prior to the vote. "This is the best that we can do."

I think it is in the best interests of the county. Our money can be better used than using it to pay lawyers."

Cary said the legal fees, which were up to \$65,000 in mid-September, would certainly be higher, but would not hazard a guess as to

how much.

The meeting was attended by fourteen of the sixteen commissioners, with Chandra Lake and Bobby Hensley not present.

After less than thirty minutes of presentation and deliberation, Commissioner Gary Barber made the motion and Mike Madden seconded. The vote went 13-1 in favor of the settlement.

The lone dissenter, Commissioner Mac Vaughn felt the sheriff had failed to communicate during the budget process.

"The Budget Committee met for months. We had a vote. The sheriff never said a word. I assumed he agreed. Next thing you know we have a lawsuit. If he had a problem, he should have told us," said Vaughn.

The entire text of the settlement is in the inset to the left and continues to A12.

1. ADDITIONAL FUNDING. The county will appropriate for the sheriff to use for the department's purposes as the sheriff sees fit, including, but not limited to, additional compensation for deputies and others in the department, an additional One Hundred and Two Thousand Dollars (\$102,000). The full amount will be available for use in the 2019-20 fiscal year. The sheriff is authorized and the county agrees to pay for and will not interfere with the hiring, equipping, and training of three (3) new deputies, whose salaries and expenses may be paid for out of the above-stated \$102,000 and any other funds appropriated to the sheriff's department. The sheriff may, within his budget line items, pay for compensation, equipping, and training as he deems necessary.

The salaries and rates of pay for the sheriff's department shall for the present continue as recently set at the request of the sheriff and paid by the mayor's office. The expert referred to below will recommend the number of deputies and jailers needed and their compensation, but in no event shall the number of deputies or jailers currently employed be reduced without the consent of the sheriff. The sheriff may, within his budget salary line items, pay compensation as he

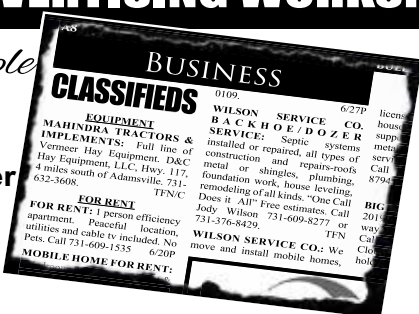

Not Too Soon for End-of-Year Financial Moves

We've still got a couple of months until 2019 draws to a close, but it's not too early to make some end-of-the-year financial moves. In fact, it may be a good idea to take some of these steps sooner rather than later.

Here are a few suggestions:
 Boost your 401(k) contributions. Like many people, you might not usually contribute the maximum amount to your 401(k), which, in 2019 is \$19,000, or \$25,000 if you're 50 or older. Ask your employer if you can increase your 401(k) contributions in 2019, and if you receive a bonus before the year ends, you may be able to use that toward your 401(k), too.

Add to your IRA. You have until April 15, 2020, to contribute to your IRA for the 2019 tax year, but the more you can put in now and over the next few months, the less you'll have to come up with in a hurry at the filing deadline. For 2019, you can put up to \$6,000 in your IRA, or \$7,000 if you're 50 or older.

Review your portfolio. It's always a good idea to review your investment portfolio at least once a year, and now is as good a time as any. But don't make any judgments based solely on your results over the past 10 months. Instead, look carefully at how your portfolio is constructed. Is it still properly diversified, or has it become over-weighted in some areas? Does it still fit your risk tolerance, or do you find yourself worrying excessively about short-term price swings? These are the types of factors that might lead you to make some changes, possibly with the help of a financial professional.

Don't forget about your RMDs. Once you turn 70½, you generally need to start taking withdrawals – the technical term is "required minimum distributions," or RMDs – from your traditional IRA and your 401(k) or similar plan. After the first year in which you take these RMDs, you must take them by the end of each year thereafter. If you don't withdraw at least the minimum amount (calculated based on your age, account balance and other factors) you face a penalty of 50% of what you should have taken out – a potential loss of thousands of dollars. So, take your RMDs before Dec. 31. The financial services provider that administers your IRA or 401(k) can help you determine the amount you must withdraw.

Think about next year's opportunities. It happens to almost all of us: A year has passed, and we haven't taken the actions we had planned. So, start thinking now about what you want to do in 2020 from a financial standpoint. Can you afford to ratchet up your investments in your retirement plans? If you have children or grandchildren, have you started saving for college? Have you considered ways to protect your financial independence if you ever need some type of long-term care, such as an extended nursing home stay? If these or other items are on your financial to-do list, start planning now to get them done next year.

Time goes quickly – so don't get left behind without having taken the steps to keep moving toward your financial goals.

Pasta E Fagioli Copycat

Ingredients

- 1-pound ground beef
- 1 small onion, finely diced
- 2 carrots, finely diced
- 2 stalks celery, finely diced
- 1 (15 oz) can diced tomatoes, undrained
- 1 (15 oz) can dark red kidney beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 (15 oz) can cannellini beans, drained and rinsed
- 1 (26 oz) container beef stock (or 3 cups)
- 1 (25 oz) jar spaghetti sauce
- 2 tsp dried oregano
- 2 tsp dried parsley
- 1 tsp ground black pepper
- 1/2 tbsp salt
- 1 cup ditalini pasta (or your favorite pasta shape)

Instructions

Brown and crumble ground beef. Drain excess grease. Add all the other ingredients to the slow cooker (except for pasta) and stir. Set slow cooker on low for 6-8 hours or on high for 4-5 hours. During the last 30 minutes or so of cooking, add in the pasta and stir.

Notes: Pasta likes to absorb a lot of the liquid so if you like your soup a bit more soupy, be prepared to have an extra can of beef broth handy. You can add it in towards the end

Early Notice and Public Review of a Proposed Activity in a 100-Year Floodplain

To: All interested Agencies - Federal, State, and Local - Groups and Individuals

This is to give notice that the City of Bolivar under CFR 24 Part 58 has conducted an evaluation as required by Executive Order 11988 and/or 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management, to determine the potential affect that its activity in the floodplain and/or wetland will have on the human environment for a Community Development Block Grant under HUD Grant Number B-19-DC-47-0001. The City of Bolivar will implement a sewer system improvement project that will consist of TV inspection, root cutting and cured-in-place lining of gravity sewer. In addition, a section of collection pipe will be replaced as it is in too bad of a condition for cured-in-place rehabilitation. The pumps, valves and controls on the Hospital and Highway 64 lift stations are to be replaced. The capacity and head of the pumps would be increased slightly to accommodate modest growth. Finally, key manholes in the system will be equipped with flow monitoring/data collection. A small portion of the project may take place within a floodplain. The proposed project(s) is located in the City of Bolivar, Hardeman County.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. Second, an adequate public notice program can be an important public educational tool. The dissemination of information about floodplains can facilitate and enhance Federal efforts to reduce the risks associated with the occupancy and modification of these special areas. Third, as a matter of fairness, when the Federal government determines it will participate in actions taking place in floodplains, it must inform those who may be put at greater or continued risk.

deems appropriate so long as the salary line items are not exceeded. Nothing in this prevents the sheriff from promoting and by promotion increasing the compensation for personnel or using funds available from vacancies to better compensate employees.

Deputies who provide court security, as currently is the practice, shall work at the direction of the judges and the sheriff. When those deputies are not needed for court security, they shall work for the taxpayers at the direction of the sheriff.

2. TIMEKEEPING AND OVERTIME. The county will acquire and install electronic equipment using a scanner, similar to that used by the Hardeman County Highway Department, to allow all sheriff's department employees to clock in and out through that equipment. Such equipment and system shall be paid for from additional funds beyond those currently in the sheriff's budget or otherwise provided for in this Decree. This system will be used by all general fund employees and will be paid for by the county, not from the sheriff's budget. The county will compensate employees using this equipment. In addition, deputies and law enforcement personnel called out from their homes in emergency situations for which time does not allow for them to report to the Criminal Justice Complex and therefore begin work before scanning shall also be fully compensated for time they work when not scanned into that equipment, if the sheriff personally certifies the need and hours worked. Upon completion of the emergency overtime work, the law enforcement personnel shall report to the Criminal Justice Complex for fingerprint scanning.

All deputies, jailers and other sheriff's department personnel shall be paid regular pay for the first forty-three (43) hours of work and then immediately be paid overtime (one-and-one-half times regular pay) for all hours worked more than forty-three (43) hours in a week and shall be promptly paid each pay period. Such overtime pay shall be paid by the county promptly upon submission of those hours and the county agrees to pay all such overtime. If the total of overtime exceeds any amounts set forth in the budget and a budget line item is exceeded, the sheriff shall request a budget amendment which the county then shall approve. This provision does not prohibit the sheriff from establishing other overtime provisions more favorable to employees that do not contradict or violate state law or the Fair Labor Standards Act or the directives of the auditors of the State Comptroller.

3. OUTSIDE CONSULTANT AND ADMINISTRATION. The parties agree that an outside consultant, selected by mutual agreement by the parties within the next ten (10) days from the entry of this Order, or if failing to reach an agreement, by the Commissioner of the Tennessee Department of Safety & Homeland Security from experts recommended by one or both of the parties, shall be employed, at the County's expense, to advise and recommend (a) compensation levels for all employees of the sheriff's department; (b) staffing levels and numbers of employees for all aspects of the sheriff's department; and (c) scheduling and staffing assignments and times for the sheriff's department. If the sheriff or the county does not agree to the expert's recommendations, either party has the right to notify the other party of their disagreement and to resume this litigation for a determination by this court.

The county agrees that the sheriff may select and employ a non-law enforcement person to administer budget and purchasing matters. The mayor agrees to cooperate with and work with this administrator. It is agreed by the parties that this administrator is not a secretarial or clerical position, but instead a professional administrator position and is to be compensated appropriately with a competitive salary. Unless the parties agree otherwise, the maximum compensation for this person shall be \$45,000 and provided by the county from other funds and shall not be subtracted from the previously passed budget for the sheriff's department and shall be in addition to any other funds provided in this consent order.

To minimize the chances of further litigation and to increase the efficiencies and effectiveness of law enforcement, the county commission shall put a report from the sheriff on its monthly agenda so that current issues can be resolved and the sheriff can answer the commissioners' questions.

4. COSTS AND EXPENSES. The county agrees that when the sheriff's department requisitions expenditures for department expenses, the mayor and his staff shall approve such expenditures and provide checks to pay for the same on the Friday following submission by the sheriff's department, provided however that the mayor's office shall have at least forty-eight (48) hours to process these. The county agrees that such decisions are within the Constitutional and Statutory powers of the sheriff. Such requisitions or purchase orders include but are not limited to the drug fund. All purchases will be governed by the Private Purchasing Act and documentation required by auditors under that Act must be submitted.

The county is responsible for and shall pay all court costs and litigation costs in this matter within thirty (30) days of entry of this order. The county and the sheriff agree to have their counsel promptly submit their expenses and time records to the Circuit Court Judge for any examination the court may require to verify the number of hours worked and the expenses incurred. The county agrees to pay the county's counsel and the sheriff's counsel for expenses and services in accordance with the terms of their respective agreements with the county and with the sheriff and to pay counsel within thirty (30) days of the entry of the court's Order. Furthermore, the parties agree that for additional work required before the final conclusion of this matter, submissions and payments will be made by the same methods at later dates.

This is to give notice that the City of Middleton under CFR 24 Part 58 has conducted an evaluation as required by Executive Order 11988 and/or 11990, in accordance with HUD regulations at 24 CFR 55.20 Subpart C Procedures for Making Determinations on Floodplain Management, to determine the potential affect that its activity in the floodplain and/or wetland will have on the human environment for a Community Development Block Grant under HUD Grant Number B-19-DC-47-0001. The City of Middleton will implement a sewer system improvement project that will address the problem of deteriorated force main, which transports raw sewage from the five lift stations to the treatment plant, by replacing several linear feet of existing deteriorated cast iron force main with PVC, throughout the collection system. A small portion of the project may take place within a floodplain. The proposed project(s) is located in the City of Middleton, Hardeman County.

There are three primary purposes for this notice. First, people who may be affected by activities in floodplains and those who have an interest in the protection of the natural environment should be given an opportunity to express their concerns and provide information about these areas. 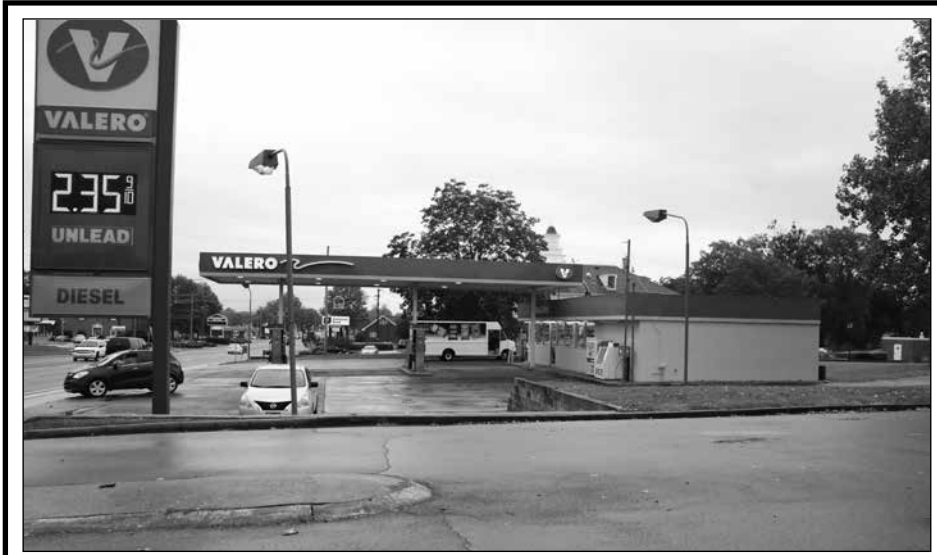
