Mayors Clash in Whiteville

Former mayor and current Whiteville Alderman James Bellar has asked the Town of Whiteville Attorney John Talbot to file an ethics violation complaint with the attorney general against current Mayor Aubrey Phillips.

Bellar's request stems from the purchase of property at the corner of Highway 64 (Main Street) and Melrose Avenue in Whiteville. Bellar says the property, condemned years ago, has been vacant for years, but was part of a request to open a farmers market a few months ago.

The next thing he saw, says Bellar, was a listing in a local church saying Phillips would be opening a grocery store and repair shop. Bellar says this was the first he had heard of it.

Phillips said the former mayor is in error. "A year prior to becoming mayor, I tried to purchase it. When Bellar got on the board, he got

it condemned," explained Phillips. "Every board member knew except James, that if they took it out of condemnation, I was going to buy it. In April, they took it out of condemnation. James voted to take it out. He says he didn't but he did."

Phillips pointed to a signed document dated April 2, to lift the order for 546 E. Main Street in Whiteville from condemnation status.

While Bellar admitted to signing it, he maintains it was irregular.

"At the meeting, he advised about the property in question and asked for a lifting of the order. We all voted in favor assuming a plan would be submitted to us. The next day city hall called me and said I needed to come by and sign a letter. I did and at the time thought that is a first. In retrospect I wonder why it was not addressed to the owner or other person in charge of the potential

project. I don't recall ever doing this letter on any other cases," he said.

"In short I think we were duped. I will be sticking to my request for the ethics investigation as I feel he has used his position for personal gain," he added.

Phillips said Bellar is just trying to be difficult. "He's bitter over losing and anything he can cause problems with, he will. I thought when he got on the board he would be an asset. He's got 22 years as mayor and he could be a great help."

According to Hardeman County Register of Deeds Lily Barnes, the property was sold in 2011 for \$6,050 by Evelyn S. Bass to Robert S. Bradford and his wife L. Diane Bradford. The Bradfords then sold it to Maria Guadalupe Morales in 2013 for \$8,000. Phillips bought it on August 18 of this year for \$8,500.

County Gets Development Grants

Three communities in Hardeman County will receive a total of \$864,231 through a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), announced Senator Dolores Gresham and State Representative Johnny Shaw.

The awards include:

\$498,400 to Bolivar for sewer system improvements which include a sewer system investigation and analysis, installation of flow meters, upgrade of two pump stations, and repair and replacement of manholes and sewer lines in the Bolivar sewer system

\$238,931 to Middleton for sewer system improvements which include repair and rehabilitation of force main sewer lines in the Middleton sewer system

\$126,900 to Toone for a water meter system replacement project to install automatic meter reading (AMR) water meters in the Toone water system

Shaw's comment came as he was the guest speaker for the event, which was a special town hall-style gathering, according to the Hardeman County Chamber website. On a monthly basis, the chamber

The New Birth, Part 2 by Jeff Capshaw

Last week, I noted that John 3:16 displays God's grace and preaches the Gospel in a nutshell. I also raised the question of this familiar verse's context. Doubtless, it is the undisputed highpoint in this story. But what else does this text teach?

To review, Nicodemus, a pious and scholarly man, came to Jesus at night. He was pretty sure that Jesus came from God, because of the miracles Jesus did. But he wanted more confirmation. However, Jesus didn't entertain that curiosity. Instead, he told Nicodemus that he must be born again. Jesus proceeded with a physical birth analogy that confused Nicodemus, because Nicodemus thought a person had to go through the physical birthing process a second time.

Recall that Jesus said, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit." (3:5-6). Nicodemus was flabbergasted and ignorant of this truth.

Here is why that is so. Notice that

Jesus continued, "do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.' The wind blows where it wishes, and you hear its sound, but you do not know where it comes from or where it goes. So it is with everyone who is born of the Spirit." "Nicodemus said to him, 'How can these things be?'" Jesus answered him, "Are you the teacher of Israel and yet you do not understand these things?" (3:7-10).

That phrase, "born of the Spirit," is the key to the passage. Jesus tells Nicodemus that something more miraculous than physical birth is necessary. It is something personal and even more stupendous than Jesus' outward miracles which piqued Nicodemus' curiosity and pushed him to quiz Jesus at night. It is analogous to physical birth but also different. Nicodemus needed to be born from above, by the power of God, by the power of the Spirit. He needed a second but spiritual birth.

Some interpret the phrase "born of water" as a reference to water baptism. In other words, you must be "baptized and born of the Spirit," but that strains all the imagery, the

parallelism and the literary balance in this passage. I don't intend to minimize the importance of Christian baptism, but it simply isn't the point here. Rather, the "born of water" phrase is imagery related to a mother's water breaking at physical birth.

We all experience that birth and we had nothing to do with it. Similarly, according to Jesus, we don't have much to do with our spiritual birth either, because the Spirit gives spiritual birth like the wind blowing; He works where and how He wishes in silence.

We do, however, have a small part to play in our spiritual birth. Rest in this; "for God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life" (3:16).

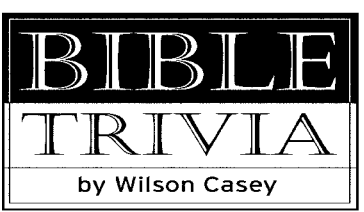

Caramel Apples

- Ingredients**
- 2 cups sugar
 - 1/4 cup light corn syrup
 - 1/2 cup heavy cream
 - 2 tablespoons unsalted butter
 - 1/2 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
 - Kosher salt
 - 6 medium very crisp apples (such as Honeycrisp, Red Delicious, Pink Lady or Granny Smith), well washed and dried
 - Nonstick cooking spray, for the parchment
 - 6 popsicle sticks or lollipop sticks

Directions

Add the sugar, corn syrup and 1/2 cup water to a small saucepan over medium-high heat. Stir a few times before the sugar begins to boil to combine the ingredients. Attach a candy thermometer to the inside of the pan and bring the syrup to a boil. Cook until the syrup begins to turn an amber color, then swirl the syrup to even out the color. Continue to cook until the syrup is a deep amber and the thermometer reads between 375- and 380-degrees F, then remove from the heat. Carefully pour in the cream and gently whisk to combine. Stir in the butter, vanilla and a pinch of salt until smooth. Keep off the heat but keep the thermometer attached to the pan.

Pierce the apples through the stem ends about halfway through with candy apple sticks. Line a baking sheet with parchment and lightly spray with nonstick cooking spray.

When the temperature of the caramel reads around 190 degrees F, dip an apple, using the stick as a handle and swirling to coat completely. Allow excess caramel to drip off the bottom and use a spatula to help remove any large amount of caramel, as it will pool around the apple when you set it down to cool on the lined baking sheet. Repeat with the remaining apples, gently heating the caramel on the stovetop over low heat, stirring, if it gets too thick for dipping. Allow the caramel to set and cool completely before serving or wrapping apples, about 1 hour. (See Cook's Note.)

To add toppings, dip apples in mini chocolate candies, shredded coconut, crushed cookies or chopped nuts immediately after coating with caramel.

Be Creative When Withdrawing from Retirement Accounts

Like many people, you may spend decades putting money into your IRA and your 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored retirement plan. But eventually you will want to take this money out – if you must start withdrawing some of it. How can you make the best use of these funds?
 To begin with, here's some background: When you turn 70 ½, you need to start withdrawals – called required minimum distributions, or RMDs – from your traditional IRA and your 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored retirement plan, such as a 457(b) or 403(b). (A Roth IRA is not subject to these rules; you can essentially keep your account intact for as long as you like.) You can take more than the RMD, but if you don't take at least the minimum (which is based on your account balance and your life expectancy), you'll generally be taxed at 50% of the amount you should have taken – so don't forget these withdrawals.

Here, then, is the question: What should you do with the RMDs? If you need the entire amount to help support your lifestyle, there's no issue – you take the money and use it. But what if you don't need it all? Keeping in mind that the withdrawals are generally fully taxable at your personal income tax rate, are there some particularly smart ways in which you can use the money to help your family or, possibly, a charitable organization?

Here are a few suggestions:
 Help your grown children with their retirement accounts. Your grown children may not always be able to afford to "max out" on their IRAs. You might want to help them with any excess funds from your own retirement accounts. You can give \$15,000 per year, per recipient, without incurring any gift taxes – an amount far higher than the current annual IRA contribution limit of \$6,000 (or \$7,000 for individuals 50 or older).

Help your grandchildren pay for college. You might want to contribute to an investment specifically designed to build assets for college. A financial professional can help you choose which investments might be most appropriate. Of course, if your grandchildren are already in college, you are free to simply write a check to the school to help cover tuition and other expenses.

Help support a charitable organization. Due to recent changes in tax laws, many individuals now claim a standard deduction, rather than itemizing. As a result, there's less of an incentive, from a tax standpoint, for people to contribute to charitable organizations.

But if you'd still like to support a charitable group and gain potential tax benefits, you might want to consider moving some, or all, of your required distributions from your IRA to a charity. You can transfer up to \$100,000 from your IRA in this type of qualified charitable distribution, thus meeting your RMD requirements without adding to your taxable income. Furthermore, this move might keep you in a lower tax bracket. (Before making this transfer, though, you will need to consult with your tax advisor.)

Your RMDs can contribute greatly to your retirement income, but, as we've seen, they can do even more than that – so use them wisely.

hosts the meeting, inviting members to gather.

When asked to clarify at a later time, Shaw said, "I don't understand all the ins and outs, but it takes so many acres of property to satisfy the environmental people and I think it would take all of Hardeman County."

Shaw also spoke on local developments such as the continuation of the development of Highway 18, how he thinks focusing on Downtown Bolivar development will benefit the whole county, and his bill that will seek to make pre-k education available to all Tennessee children.

Shaw did mention the legislative session will begin in November (instead of next January) this year as hearings begin on the budget, an idea Shaw advocated for it and is pleased to see it come true.

"They (the Republicans) said they would give me credit for it, but I don't expect it to be in the news," he laughed. "We can't pass the budget early, but we can have the hearings at least."



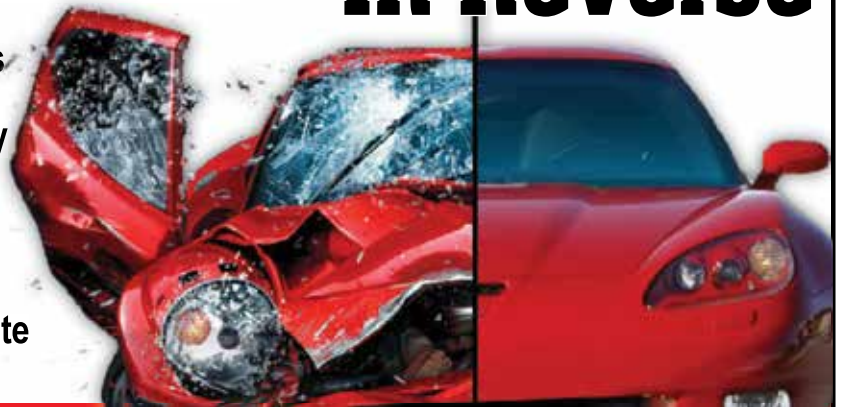
