Royal Oak Site Approved

The Hardeman County Commission voted 10-6 to re-zone a 317-acre plot in Northwestern Hardeman County that will be the site of Royal Oak Charcoal's lump coal facility, which is an estimated \$15 million expenditure by the company founded in 1960.

The vote ended the campaign by opponents of the project to either defeat the re-zoning or delay the vote by the commission until November.

For more than an hour, those both pro and con came forward and spoke about the project. See inset above.

Paul McAllister of Royal Oak began the discussion by saying his company was excited about coming to the county, but wanted to dispel some misconceptions.

"This facility is going to make lump charcoal. The Tennessee Department of Environmental Conservation (TDEC) does not just candidly hand out permits. We have to have permits. If they don't think that we can qualify, we won't be able to operate."

Also giving a thumbs up on the project were State Representative Johnny Shaw, the Hardeman County Chamber of Commerce, Assistant District Attorney Joe Van Dyke, representatives of the logging industry in Hardeman County, and other businessmen.

Against the move were many residents of the area near the re-zoning target and residents of neighboring Haywood and Fayette Counties.

Richard Rucker of Somerville identified himself as representing many of the attendees.

"I strongly urge you tonight to table this action until you can obtain reliable information," he stated.

The most prevalent negative statements centered on asking why Royal Oak could not use existing industrial parks around the county and

maintaining that an isolated site would allow Royal Oak to flout environmental laws.

Following the public hearing, Chris Bell motioned to re-zone the property, which was seconded by Gary Barber.

"To have growth you have to have jobs," said Commissioner Johnny Lanier. "I can still find people who wish the prison wasn't here and wish Kilgore wasn't here, but look at how many jobs they provided."

Voting for the re-zoning were commissioners Barber, Bell, Bobby Doyle Mark Gilliam, Bobby Hensley, Justin Howell, Lanier, Mike Madden, Jackie Sain, and John Vickers.

Against the move were Chondra Lake, Vincen Morrow, Mac Vaughn, Johnny Weems, Elvis White, and Bobby Wright.

"I want jobs, but is it worth offending the northwest part of the county for a few jobs?" asked Commissioner Vaughn.

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Community Health Center Walks for Women's Health



The Hardeaman Community Health Center (HCCHC) is in the non-profit healthcare business of reaching out to our community's underserved and in October, the center is vamping up efforts to promote Breast Cancer Awareness Month.

Studies show that health center patients are more likely to receive mammograms, an important tool for detecting lumps, regardless of whether they have health insurance. That is why the kind of affordable and accessible healthcare that health centers provide is crucial to fighting breast cancer. When people have a healthcare home, they will use it and stay healthier.

By providing affordable and accessible screenings and launching education and outreach efforts to culturally diverse populations, health centers have been able to help boost the odds of early breast cancer detection. For instance, 724,187 women received mam-



mograms at a health center in 2017. Abnormal breast findings were diagnosed among 197,038 female health center patients. Source: NACH.org.

The HCCHC will be having breast exam competitions between providers, pink cupcakes for patients who participate, featured breast cancer education, decoration of exam room doors, walking to Bolivar Elementary each week to show support, and other ways to raise awareness.

A motion to table the motion failed along the exact same voting lines. Following the vote, dozens of attendees walked out of the meeting. Originally zoned at FAR (Forestry, Agriculture, Residential) the request re-zoned the area east of Highway 179 and north of Mt. Tabor Road to I-2 (Restricted Industrial). Mayor Jimmy Sain said the Tennessee Department of Transportation has committed in principle to a \$3.1 million price tag to build an industrial access road on Richland Road, which is currently gravel-covered.

An TDEC informational meeting will be held on November 1 at the Whiteville Community Center from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. The public is invited to attend.

 Diversification – By definition, mutual funds that concentrate on sustainable investments might exclude entire industries, which could hurt your portfolio's performance if the excluded investments perform better than the rest of the market. For example, a fund that excludes all oil-related companies might generate poor returns during a period of rising oil prices. Therefore, you may prefer to invest in a fund that integrates environmental, social and governance considerations into the investment process without excluding specific sectors or types of companies. You can further dilute this risk by owning a wide array of sustainable funds that use different approaches or processes to invest in sustainable companies. However, while diversification can reduce the effects of volatility on your portfolio, it can't guarantee profits or protect against all losses.

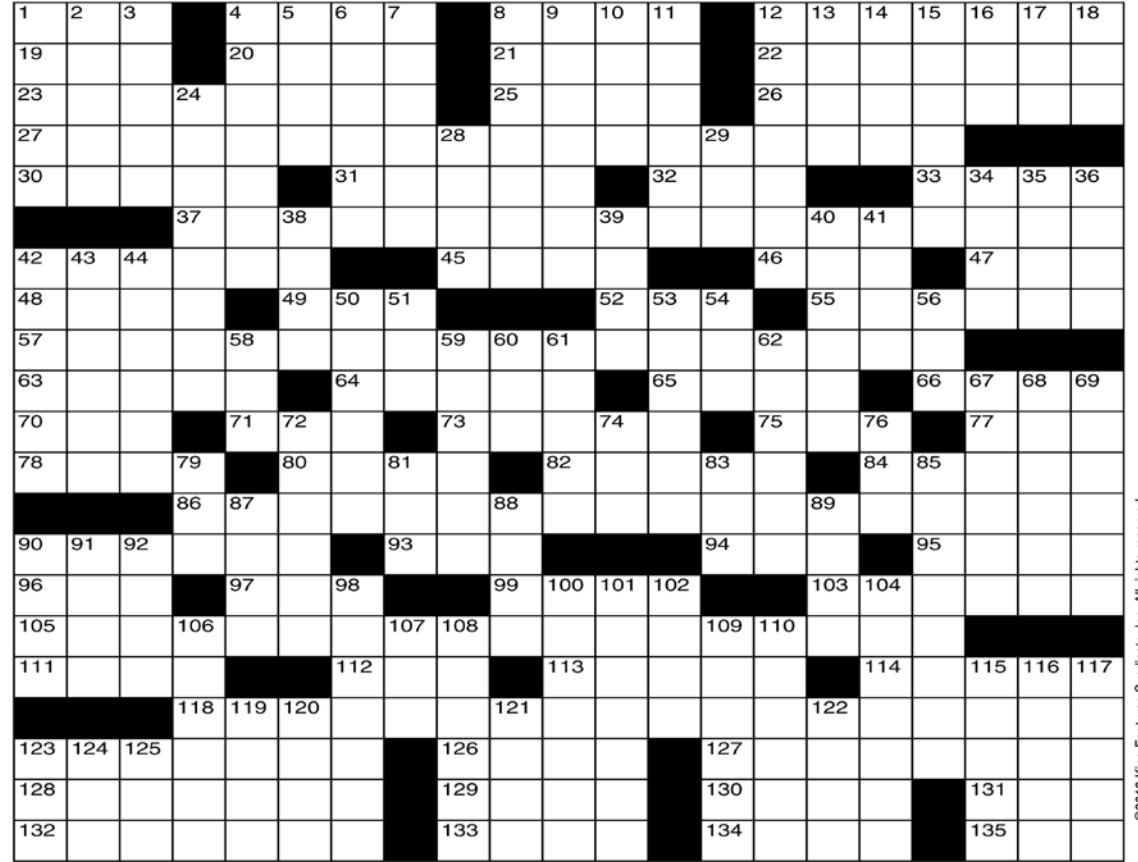

1 teaspoon dried sage leaves crushed
2 medium dark-orange sweet potatoes, peeled, cut into 1 1/2-inch pieces
1-lb. Brussels sprouts cut in half if large
2 teaspoons olive or vegetable oil
1/2 teaspoon salt
1/4 teaspoon pepper

Directions

- 1. Heat oven to 325°F. On rack in shallow roasting pan, place pork. In small bowl, mix marmalade, orange juice, fennel, thyme and sage. Brush half of the marmalade mixture over pork.
2. In large bowl, toss sweet potatoes and Brussels sprouts with oil, salt and pepper. Arrange vegetables around pork. Insert ovenproof meat thermometer so tip is in thickest part of pork.
3. Roast uncovered 1 hour. Brush pork with remaining marmalade mixture; gently stir vegetables to coat with pan juices. Roast about 15 minutes longer or until thermometer reads 155°F and vegetables are tender. Cover pork with foil and let stand 10 to 15 minutes until thermometer reads 160°F.

Sunrise: Sorrow Unceasing

To experience the shock of discovering a loved one, whether a child or an adult who died sometime during the evening in their bed is quite probably an indescribable experience of great sorrow and continual distress. A good illustration of this is found in Romans 9:2. Here the writer describes their sorrow as great and their anguish of heart as unceasing. It is difficult to imagine what it must be like for an individual to experience an event of loss in their life which could be described as unceasing anguish. Parents who have discovered their children have died or siblings who have been the one who discovered their brother or sister, or perhaps a son or daughter who discovered a parent who has died might top the list.

Shock! This word comes from the middle French and means, a violent encounter or a sudden

blow (etymonline.com). When a person discovers a loved one deceased completely by surprise without any prior justification, no distress, no previous illness, then one would have shock and great sorrow with unceasing anguish of heart. I often said that shock is Jehovah's way of cushioning us from the full blunt force of the trauma we are experiencing. Yet that does not make it easy to endure, just easier. The mourner will need time, prayer, and much support in their journey with grief. With these on their side in their walk they will succeed toward full acceptance and healing. surrounding them who possess a great deal of patience who are willing to walk with them in their journey as long as it takes. They will need this type of support as it may be a roller coaster ride of emotions that will try the spirit and resolve to endure. Having endured one will potentially emerge a stronger wiser person. 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The Bible and Race (Part Three) by John Jicka

In Luke 4, Jesus spoke in the synagogue in Nazareth and read the Messianic prophecy found in Isaiah 61:1, 2. In spite of Jesus' claim to have "fulfilled" this Messianic Scripture, the people who heard Him that day "spoke well of him and were amazed at the gracious words that came from his lips" (Luke 4:21-22). They enjoyed Jesus' teaching and weren't offended that He claimed to be the Messiah. BUT THEN, He said something that made them "furious" (Luke 4:24-29). He reminded the people that God sent Elijah to minister to a Gentile widow in Zarephath and Elisha to heal Naaman the Syrian of his leprosy. This caused the Jews of Nazareth to fly into a racist rage and attempt to throw Jesus off a cliff!

As Christians, we must understand and emulate the heart of the Savior we follow. His message and sacrifice were for the purpose of uniting people with God and one another. Racial unity has always been an inseparable part of God's purposes in the gospel. The amount of biblical content to support this truth is abundant. Read the Scriptures with sensitivity to what the Holy Spirit is saying about race. You'll see it. The Greek word for "Gentiles" is "ethnos." When the Bible is referring to the Gentiles it is referring to the ethnicities!

The Apostle Paul proclaimed the message of the cross in Palestine, Syria, Crete, Cyprus, Asia Minor, Greece, and Rome. He experienced what the Lord Jesus had experienced. The gospel message may have been offensive but it was the racial inclusion inherent in the gospel message that struck the vile nerve. Consider Acts 22. Paul is speaking in Jerusalem to a mob gathered in the Temple. He shared his testimony of the risen Christ speaking to him on the Damascus Road. He called Jesus "Lord." The crowd kept listening. Then Paul said, "the Lord said to me, 'Go; I will send you far away to the [ethnos]'" (Acts 22:21). And, if like striking a match, the crowd went riotous. "Rid the earth of him! He's not fit to live!" (Acts 22:22). It was the same in every city with only a couple of exceptions. Paul could speak the salvation message and get a hearing until the Jews heard him open it up to the "ethnos."

Christ confronted racial hatred and prejudice in the Gospels. The Holy Spirit confronted it in the Epistles. Acts shows how God tore down the racial barriers. And, the Revelation revealed once and for all that God will gather all His beautiful, diverse races back to Himself to join the angels in worship for all eternity.

Think about Peter, Philip, and Paul. Peter was entrenched in the racial attitudes of his upbringing. God had to give him a blatant vision three times and force him to go to Cornelius' house in Caesarea. Even after seeing a great number of Gentiles/ethnos believe in Christ and be filled with the Holy Spirit, he still fell back into his old prejudiced patterns. Paul confronted him for this in Galatians 2:11-13.

Philip was a young, new generation church leader with fewer racial and cultural hang-ups. God used him as a catalyst to bring great change in the church and the world. He broke both the Samaritan and Gentile barriers in Acts 8. The first Gentile convert, recorded in Scripture, was a black African who was traveling back to Ethiopia-the uttermost parts of the world.

Paul was a man so abandoned to the will of God and so filled with the Spirit that his life didn't matter to him anymore. He was ready and willing to die for the gospel message. He did not fear the ferocious, racist hatred of his kinsmen. He wanted to please his God.

God needs "Peters" today. He needs people who were raised with racist attitudes to hear His Word and make the change. He needs "Philips" today. He needs young people with fewer racial hang-ups to become change catalysts. And God needs "Pauls" today. He needs people who are ready to suffer persecution and alienation from their own race for the sake of God's purposes and His pleasure.

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Amos: A Prophet for Us - Part 5

Last week I indicated that today's "justice" was watered down by thinkers like Karl Marx and John Rawls. Moreover, if no standard for justice exists, then it is impossible to tell what is unjust, let alone what is just.

An absolute standard for justice is needed. Such, in principle, would more likely ensure justice for all. Many standards of American justice are rooted--in principle at least--in a Judeo-Christian ethic. Even so, social justice warriors today neither recognize nor invoke that standard. True justice and injustice were redefined as fairness and unfairness as determined by nobody or nothing particularly.

A more adequate notion of justice is found in the Old Testament book of Amos. Amos' understanding of justice has withstood the test of time, and his book provides an objective basis for it. For him it isn't a matter of values or opinions; it is rather about absolute truth anchored in the LORD's moral law.

For example, Amos says to the wealthy women of Israel ("cows of Bashan"), *Hear this word, you cows of Bashan, who are on the mountain of Samaria, who oppress the poor, who crush the needy, who say to your husbands, 'Bring, that we may drink'* (Amos 4:1)! That word from the LORD was of a coming judgment of conquest by the Assyrians (vv. 2-3) brought on by social injustices. The "cow" image pertains to women living and drinking in luxury, not a disparaging comment about their size.

These wealthy women not only neglected the poor and needy, they also oppressed and crushed them. That clearly is a covenantal violation and, therefore, unjust! The implied solution and way to right this social injustice is so obvious that Amos leaves it unsaid. Stop selfishly living in posh luxury. Stop oppressing and crushing the poor! Instead, use your accumulated wealth to help the poor and downtrodden.

Contrast these women in Amos' day with a poor widow in Jesus' day. Luke writes, *as Jesus looked up, he saw the rich putting their gifts into the temple treasury. He also saw a poor widow put in two very small copper coins. "Truly I tell you," he said, "this poor widow has put in more than all the others. All these people gave their gifts out of their wealth; but she out of her poverty put in all she had to live on"* (Luke 21:1-3). How are we and our churches doing with the poor and oppressed? Are we more like the women of Amos' time or the poor widow of Jesus' time?

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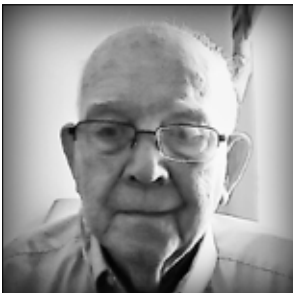
ROBERT L. RAYL MARCH 13, 1935-OCTOBER 7, 2018



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

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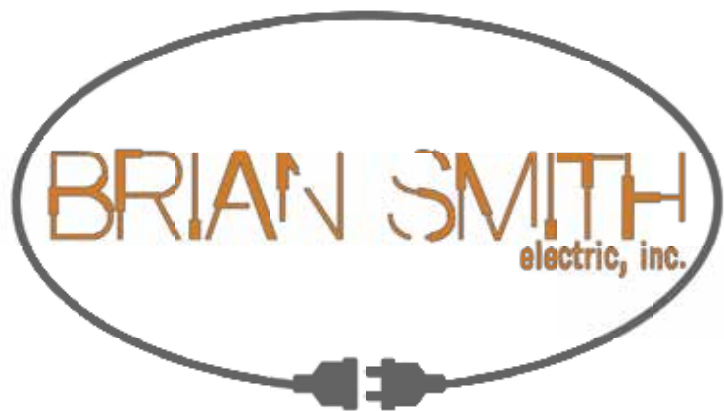
