It was a neighborhood that was a little nicer, a little more affluent. And maybe they wanted to win, but would be okay if they didn't. Us? We HAD to win.

Here in Hardeman County, we're from the same neighborhood. And maybe it's just like my neighborhood back then. And hopefully when it comes to our turf, we'll stick together.

Doyle Takes Top School Job

Leaves County Commission Seat

The announcement that Deputy Superintendent of Schools Bobby Doyle would take over for Superintendent Warner Ross II during Ross' military deployment gave the 29-year county commissioner a tough decision regarding his "other" service to the county.

"It was a difficult decision to step down and I appreciate the citizens of District 7 for their continued faith in me in continuing to elect me to the seat," he said.

Doyle said he served with four different county mayors and "a ton" of county commissioners.

"I've seen a lot of changes, challenges, and good things," he said. "I feel like our major challenge is industry. We need to work together with everyone for both the citizens and our students."

Doyle says he will miss serving the county on the commission. "I have a great deal of respect for my fellow commissioners and wish them the best in the challenges they face. I look

forward to working with them in my new role."

His new role comes after 37 years as an employee of the Hardeman County Schools. He began teaching at Bolivar Elementary School, teaching 5th and 6th grade science before moving to assistant principal for five years. And then after a 15-year stint as principal at Bolivar Elementary, he moved the school board for the past eight years. He will serve as Superintendent for one year, until Ross returns.

"Mr. Ross has laid a great blueprint to follow. We've got a great team and I think we will go like we've been going. As long as we keep the children in our central focus we can't go wrong," he said, adding that his current position won't be filled and his other duties will be divided among other staff.

Doyle knows with the budget talks coming, he experience on both sides will be a valuable asset to the process.

"I've served on the budget committee for school board, but now I'll present the budget to



the commission," he said.

Doyle hopes the commission can continue to see the value of the Hardeman County Schools.

"We would like to maintain the programs to benefit our students. We'd like our funding to continue to offer the programs we have now. We'd like to see it remain the same."

established by the state assembly to select a county seat; and named after South American patriot and liberator Simon Bolivar; and

WHEREAS, long before settlers came to the area one mile north of here, the Chickasaw Indians utilized the river, known as "Hatchie" as a crossing point and trading post. Hatchie Town soon began a settlement and used as the primary trading post for Hatchie Town from 1818 until 18 October 1825, until moving one mile south to the current area, due to extensive flooding; and

WHEREAS, major construction began in Bolivar in and around the square, adjacent to the Courthouse and many residences were log cabins in 1826; the oldest and last remaining original log home is the "Hazelgrove House" occupied by Major John Houston Bills; and

WHEREAS, by 1828 there were ten stores, five doctors, five lawyers, one commission house, one printing office, three taverns, one grocery store and mercantile stores that sold everything for the farmer, planter, trapper and timber cutter; and

WHEREAS, residents and travelers had to attain water from the public spring located on the southwest corner of Water Street; and

WHEREAS, in the early 1900s saloons were outlawed; police and fire departments were established, to protect and serve the people of Bolivar; and

WHEREAS, the city began to flourish and grow, with a Chamber of Commerce, a phone company, a new water plant, with roads being paved and utility infrastructure installed and school were established; and

WHEREAS, our city now has over 5,000 residents, many businesses, churches, parks, and moving toward modern broadband infrastructure, to further enhance and promote our community, improve our Court Square and Main Street; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that I, Julian McTizic, Mayor of the City of Bolivar do hereby proclaim "A Huge Happy Birthday to our delightful city", with wide avenues and pleasing places to eat, relax and shop; with a multitude of parks and wild spaces that allow walks among nature and places to enjoy the trails and the scenic indescribable beauty of the Hatchie.





Taco Jack-O-Lantern Stuffed Peppers

Ingredients:

- 4 large orange bell peppers (look for peppers that sit flat when the stem ends are up)
- 1 lb. raw extra-lean ground beef (4% fat or less)
- 1 tbsp. taco seasoning mix
- 1 cup chopped onion
- 1 cup chopped mushrooms
- 1/2 cup canned black beans, drained and rinsed
- 1/3 cup reduced-fat Mexican-blend cheese
- Optional toppings: reduced-fat sour cream, salsa

Directions: Preheat oven to 350 degrees. Carefully slice off the top (stem end) of each bell pepper; do not discard. Remove and discard seeds. Using a small, sharp knife, cut jack-o'-lantern faces into the peppers, making triangles for eyes and noses, as well as pointy-toothed smiles.

Place peppers in a deep 8" X 8" baking pan, open halves up. If peppers do not sit flat, gently lean them against the pan sides for support. Place stem ends back on top of peppers. Bake until tender, about 25 minutes. Blot away excess moisture. Meanwhile, bring a large skillet sprayed with nonstick spray to medium-high heat. Add beef and sprinkle with taco seasoning. Add onion and mushrooms. Cook, stir, and crumble until beef is fully cooked and veggies have softened, 8 - 10 minutes. Add beans, and cook and stir until hot, about 2 minutes. Remove from heat, add cheese, and stir until cheese has melted and evenly distributed. Cover to keep warm.

Remove pepper tops, and evenly distribute beef mixture into peppers. Replace tops, serve, and enjoy!

The New Creation by Jeff Capshaw

The last two columns discussed John 3:1-16: Nicodemus, the new birth, and God's love. Verse 16 says that God loved his creation so much that He gave his one-of-a-kind Son as a gift to the world, to redeem all of creation.

John 3:17 explains this. It says, "for God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him." Jesus' primary work is one of redemption and renewal: not of condemnation. Surely, a future judgment is coming, but the immediate emphasis here is upon the reversal of the curse upon the world that resulted from the Fall (Genesis 3).

The word "world" has different meanings in the New Testament. It doesn't always refer only to all humans. Of course, all humans are part of the world (of creation), but that isn't what John intends here. In the New Testament, the word "world" sometimes means "universe," "earth," "world system," or "people."

For example, in Romans 8, Paul insists that the whole creation (world) "has been groaning together in the pains of childbirth until now. And not only the creation, but we ourselves, who have the firstfruits of the Spirit, groan inwardly as we wait eagerly for adoption as sons, the redemption of our bodies" (22-23).

Jesus' mission surely includes the saving of souls, but not exclusively. God intends to redeem all of His created order. For example, the same Apostle John writes in Revelation, "and he who was seated on the throne said, 'Behold, I am making all things new'" (21:5).

Nonetheless, there is a flipside to universal redemption, and it concerns fallen humans who reject God's gracious offer to redeem them along with the rest of creation. John 3: 18 goes on to say, "whoever believes in him [Jesus] is not condemned, but whoever does not believe is condemned already, because he has not believed in the name of the only Son of God." Part of the cosmic curse on creation entails humanity's being in darkness. Therefore, choosing

to remain in the darkness leads to condemnation.

As verses 19-20 say, "and this is the judgment: the light has come into the world, and people loved the darkness rather than the light because their works were evil. For everyone who does wicked things hates the light and does not come to the light, lest his works should be exposed."

Imagine being in a pitch-dark cave. If someone shined a bright light toward the cave's exit, any rational person would run toward it. The same is true spiritually. "Again, Jesus spoke to them, saying, 'I am the light of the world.

Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness but will have the light of life" (John 8:12). The scope of God's plan of redemption is cosmic but fallen humans must choose between being a part of that redemption or risk remaining under condemnation.

Then the grandchildren may perpetuate the dysfunction and or dependency and become a shopaholic, spending to bankruptcy. It is estimated in 2017 that more than 20 million Americans were addicted and required treatment for drug use, age 12 and older. Today codependency is estimated above 100 million. Therefore there is a serious rise in the development of health issues mentally and physically over the last several decades and grief in families with these struggles. 



A Mystery...with a little History


A letter, dated December 3, 1893, was found by the Hardeman County General Sessions court, stuck in a minutes book.

Carrie wrote it to Maggie, detailing life in Bolivar such as "The Union Meeting held in the courthouse here closed tonight, it has been well attended by the people of B. and the surrounding county. There has been a good many professionals among them our town Marshall Mr. Perry. The meeting is conducted by an Evangelist Mr. Fife and the resident pastors. Old Bolivar has been wonderfully moved during the past week. I think a great deal of good has been accomplished. Christians resolved to live a more consistent life, everyone seems to feel interested."

Mentioned in another sentence is The Rectory on Baltimore Street.

In addition she mentions Mrs. McCarley, Sophie, Floyd, Nell, and Mollie. It is unclear whether the letter was mailed (it speaks of Bolivar) or just stuck in the minutes book and forgotten.

YOUR GARBAGE COLLECTION IS CHANGING

BEGINNING NOVEMBER 4

THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW ...

WHERE TO PUT THE CART

Your cart has been positioned in the best place for the automated truck to reach it. Place it by the curb approximately 3 feet from the street, with the handle facing your house.

Carts should be out by 6:00 a.m. on your collection day. To ensure your cart is picked up, it is best to place it at the curb the night before your collection day. Remove your cart after collection, and do not leave it at the curb.

WHAT GOES IN THE CART

Only typical household garbage goes in the cart. The garbage should be placed in plastic bags and sealed, to prevent litter and to help keep your cart clean.

WHAT DOESN'T GO IN THE CART

Do not put lumber, shingles, rocks, dirt, batteries, or old tires in the cart. Do not use the cart to dispose of hazardous wastes such as paint, motor oil, poisons and flammable liquids. Do not place

hot coals from your barbecue grill in the cart...it could melt or catch fire.

WHAT ABOUT BULKY ITEMS?

Items that are too big or bulky to place in the cart- such as appliances, mattresses, furniture, etc. will be picked up on a quarterly basis during the bulk item removal months of January, April, July, and October. **NO ITEMS CONTAINING FREON, TIRES, CONSTRUCTION OR DEMOLITION MATERIALS WILL BE PICKED UP!**

YARD WASTE collection will continue as normal. Please **DO NOT** place yard waste (grass trimmings, brush, or limbs) in this cart.
